

Honey Pineapple Coffee Cake

Pan Coat:

2 tablespoons butter or margarine 1/4 cup chopped nuts
1/4 cup honey 2 tablespoons currants
1 cup drained crushed pineapple

Melt butter or margarine in bottom of 9-inch round baking pan. Pour honey over butter or margarine and spread pineapple over honey-butter mixture. Sprinkle with chopped nuts and currants. Let stand while preparing Scone Dough.

Scone Dough:

2 cups sifted enriched King Flake Flour 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
3 teaspoons baking powder 1/3 cup shortening
1 teaspoon salt 1 egg, beaten
1/4 cup of sugar 1/2 to 3/4 cup milk
1/2 teaspoon lemon extract

Sift flour, baking powder, salt, sugar and nutmeg. Cut or rub in shortening until mixture is crumbly. Combine egg, milk and lemon extract. Add liquid to flour mixture, stirring only until flour is moistened. Spread dough evenly in prepared pan. Bake in moderately hot oven (400° F.) about 25 minutes. Makes 1 9-inch round coffee cake.
