Canning Most Popular For Preserving Food
If families in the Lowell area are like families in Lansing, home canning—not freezing—is the way they are preserving food this season.
And most of the "canning families"—six out of ten—have no home gardens and presumably are buying the foods they can, according to a survey of the Lansing area just completed by Michigan State College's department of agricultural economics and the bureau of business research.
In the survey of 1,110 Lansing area homes it was found that 60 per cent of them are canning foods this summer. Only ten per cent of the families reported they own a home freezer and only one in 30 said they stored frozen food in a commercial locker.
