As of Wednesday morning Mr. Linkfield was not allowed any visitors; he was kept in an oxygen tent for several days. His condition necessitated an immediate spleenectomy, and as soon as possible surgery will be performed on his right leg which was shattered in 5 places. He also suffered a broken hip, broken jaw, and severely lacerated upper lip.

- l egg 1 teaspoon rum extract Pecan halves

11/4 cups sifted confectioners' sugar

Sift together flour, baking soda and cream of tartar. Cream together shortening and sugar until light and fluffy. Add egg and rum extract. Beat very well. Add flour mixture to creamed mixture, mixing thoroughly. Chill. Shape into small balls and flatten with finger tips. Press pecan half into each cookie. Bake on ungreased baking sheet in moderate oven (375° F.) 8 to 10 minutes.

Makes about 5 dozen 11/2 -inch cookies.

Note: If preferred, bake cookies without pecan halves and frost with a smooth, delicately tinted frosting.
