Jim is now 72, and still interested in the welface of Alton cemetery. The grave pictured is that of William Keech, and the inscription reads: "Born March 4, 1840, Madison County, N. Y., enlisted in Co. K, 1st N. Y. Artillery, April 1861-63; Re-enlisted 1863, discharged 1865. Died June 17, 1921," This means he enlisted the same month Ft. Sumter was fired upon, and served through the entire war. It is reported he fought through the entire battle of Gettysburg July 1-3 in 1853 without a scratch. Some 20 other men who have served their country are at rest here: brothers Isaac and Warren Godfrey who died in 1865 and '66; James H. Andrews, 1841-1919, one of the veterans who served as honorary guard on Lincoln's Funeral train; others from World Wars I and II, up to the present time with Johnnie Reed, 1931-
