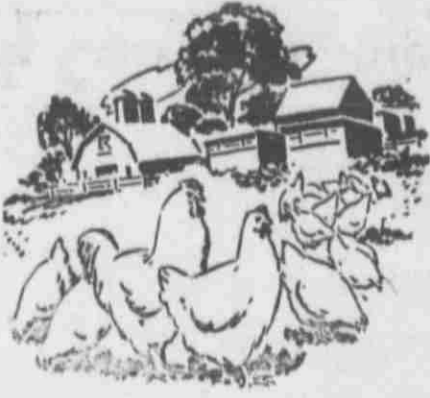

Standard for Egg Flock



What Should A Market Egg Flock Do?

The following are standards of production, feed consumption, culling and mortality based on what some of the better market egg flocks are doing, according to Richard Warren, extension poultryman, University of New Hampshire:

- Egg production per year (per pullet housed), 266.
- Egg production per year (hen day basis), 225.
- Egg production per cent (yearly average), 82%.
- Feed consumption per bird per year (high energy ration—Heavies), 105 lb.
- Feed consumption per bird per year (high energy ration—Leg-horns), 95 lb.
- Pounds feed per dozen eggs (Heavies), 5.5 lb.
- Pounds feed per dozen eggs (Leghorns), 5 lb.
- Culling first eight months' after housing, none—than 5% per mo.
- Mortality 1% per month, 12% per year.
