

# Structural Beams Going in Place for New Ada Bridge

LOWELL, MICH., THURSDAY, APRIL 11, 1957



Workmen were busy last week as the structural beams for the new Ada bridge over Grand River were being set in place. The beams, each weighing 5 tons, are made for a particular spot on the bridge so that they will fit the bolts already placed in the cement structure. On the right you can see a workman cleaning off the spot for the beam to rest. But, will all this work -after years of hounding the Highway Department to put in a new bridge across the Grand to replace the old narrow relic-really solve the problem at Ada? Three separate groups there are asking that the bridge-the old one that is-be saved and not abandoned after the completion of the new four-lane structure. The Greater Ada Safety Committee recently organized to seek retention of the old bridge as they feel it could

accomodate north-south traffic within Ada: its destruction would "cut Ada in half" they say. Also, the Lions club of Ada have resolved to strive to save the old bridge; and recently the Kent County Conservation League pass a resolu-tion asking the Kent County Road Commission to take over the bridge. They hold many skeet meets north of Ada at their club grounds, Some Ada residents have felt the bridge is so important from a safety angle and for the sake of convenience that it might be well for the Township to consider sharing the cost of repair and upkeep along with the County. 

# White Rock Yearling Lays 7-Oz. Egg




