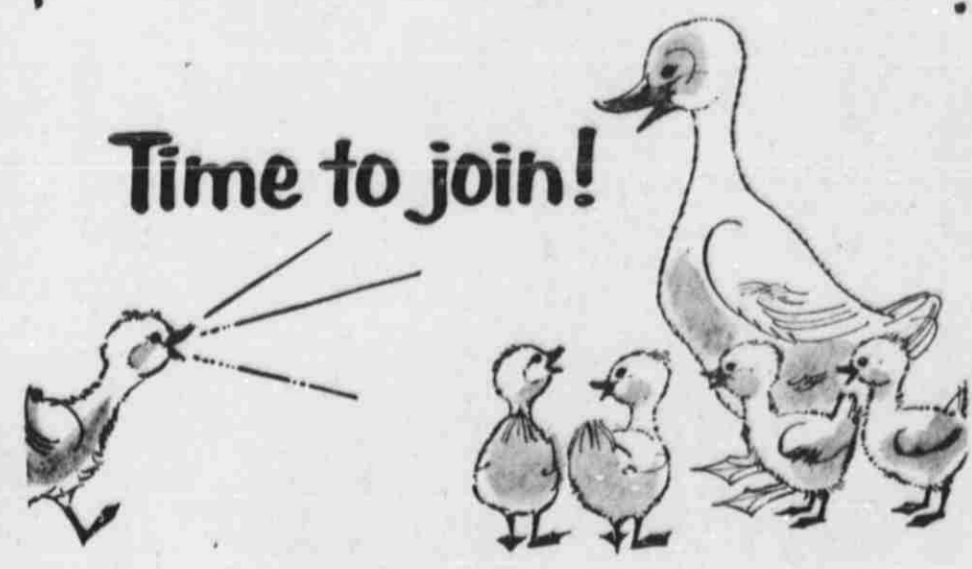

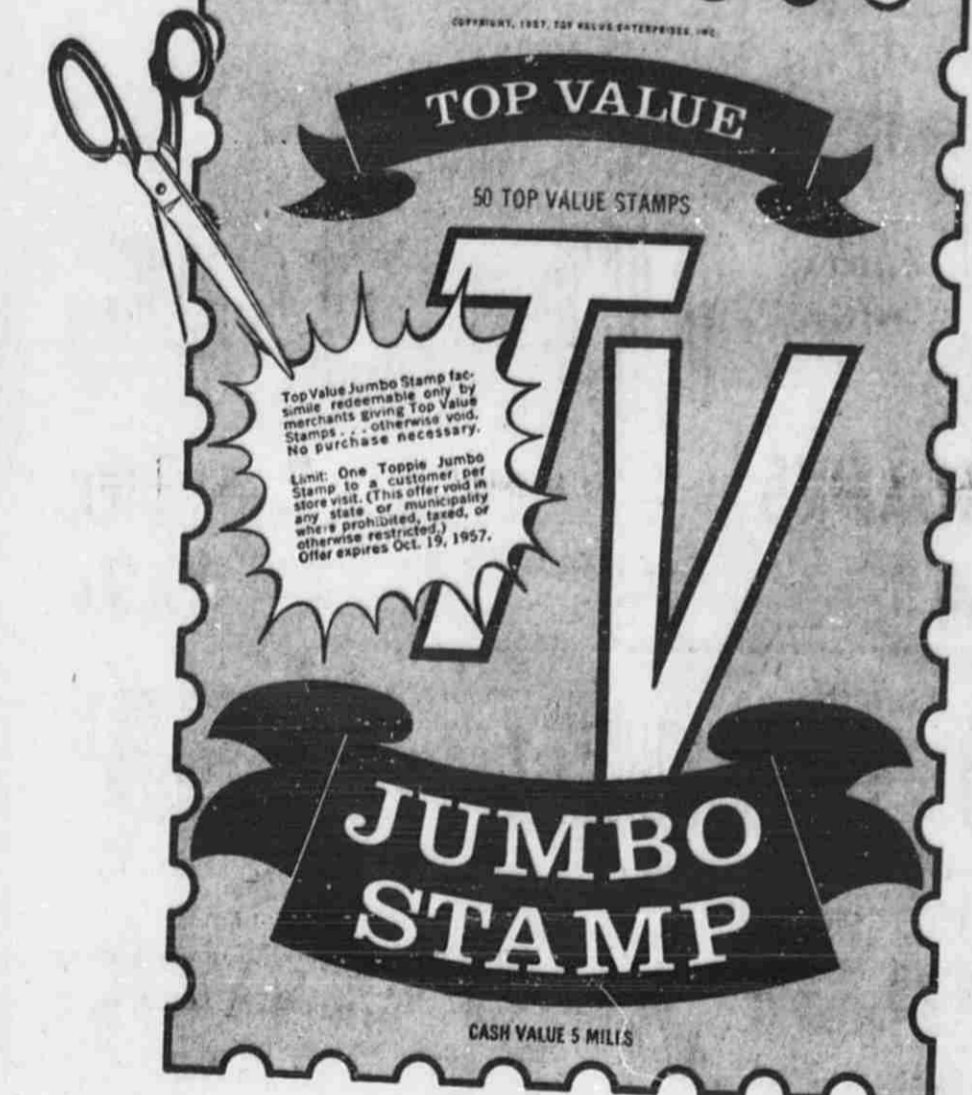

**Dist. Gov. Speaks For International Understanding**

Rotary Clubs in 102 countries throughout the free world are united in an endeavor to promote international understanding, good will, and peace. That was the message of Fred B. Wilson of Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, Governor of District 629 of Rotary International in addressing the Rotary Club of Lowell last week, following a conference with local Rotary officers and committee chairmen.  
In addition to the activities of Rotary's 9,500 Clubs within their own communities to promote this objective, Mr. Wilson explained, Rotary International has spent more than \$2,250,000 in recent years through its program of student fellowship, which enables outstanding college graduates to study for one year in countries other than their own, as Rotary ambassadors of good will. Since 1947, when this program was established 957 Rotary Fellowships have been awarded to students in 61 countries for study in 42 countries, with grants averaging \$2,500. This year William Booth of Muskegon, Michigan in district 629 is studying at Oxford University in England.  
**Four New Members**  
An international flavor was given the meeting when "God Save the Queen" was sung and the Canadian flag displayed in honor of Governor Wilson's visit.  
Four Lowell businessmen were inducted into the club with Supt. Walter Gumsier conducting a very impressive ceremony of induction. The new Rotary members are George Dey, William Doyle, Orval Jackson and Gordon Johnson.
