## In the Mails This Week

**New Tax Bills for Lowell Township Totalling \$151,523.74 Tops Record**

Tax bills for Lowell township placed in the mails this week by the treasurer, Lyla Johnson, total \$151,523.74, which tops all previous records in the amount of taxes assessed in this township. Last year's high figure was \$138,837.27 which was more than \$16,000 over the 1955 figure.

The mailing was delayed slightly this year because of the special district school tax for the handicapped which was granted following a supreme court decision handed down to validate the election held earlier in the year.

The county operating tax increased from \$8.28 last year to this year's \$9.047, and the Lowell School District combined tax rose from \$24.29 to \$26.622 per thousand dollars valuation.

The millage will be spread as follows in Lowell School District No. 1, on each thousand dollars of assessed valuation.

## meat to Grand Rapids through the old toll gate.

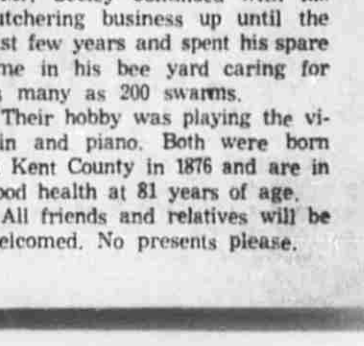
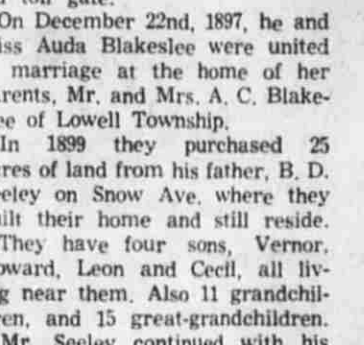
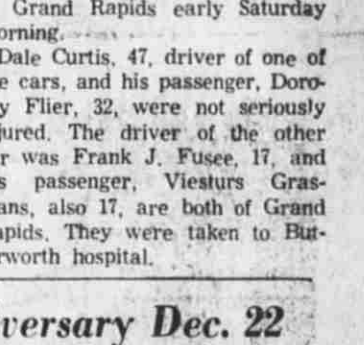
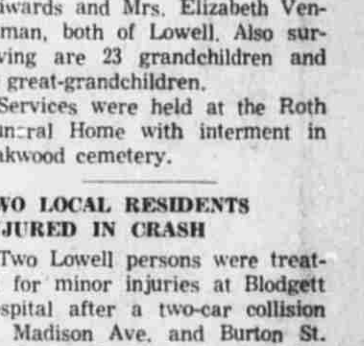
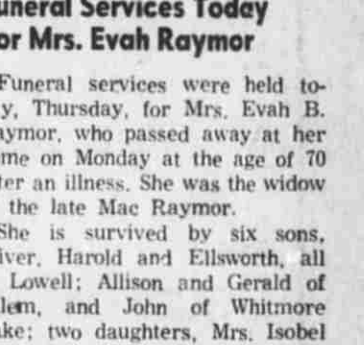
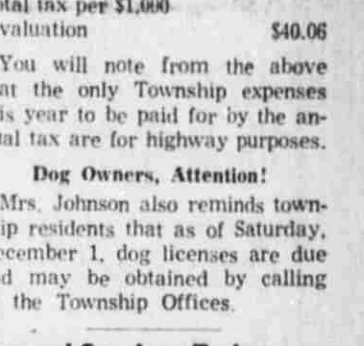
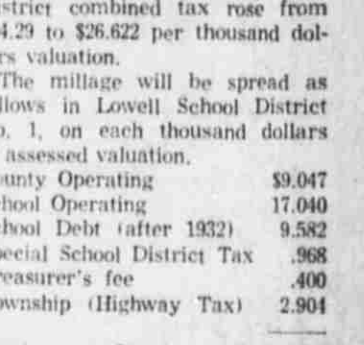
