March Traffic Deaths Lowest

Michigan experienced its lowest highway death toll for March in the last 26 years, including the worst years of greatly curtailed travel and reduced speed limits, with only 18 fatalities being recorded, according to the State Police provisional report.

This was 19 fewer than the 36 killed in March a year ago, a reduction of 20 percent. It was the third consecutive month of sharply reduced fatalities this year.

So far this year, the death toll stands at 223, a saving of 56 lives, or 20 percent, compared to the same period last year when 279 died in highway mishaps.

"The greatly reduced death toll during the first three months seems almost miraculous, and is certainly gratifying," said Commissioner Joseph A. Childs. "We are sure a good deal of the credit must go to motorists for continuing to drive cautiously even after the snow and ice were gone from most of the highways the latter part of March and left them in much better condition for travel."

Michigan is aiming for its fourth consecutive year of reducing highway fatalities by 10 percent. To accomplish this, 130 lives must be saved, or a death toll of only 1,237 compared with 1,375 in 1958.

Final figures for February show that injuries also declined, reversing a four-month trend. Accidents, however, increased for the fourth consecutive month.

There were 3,555 injuries, down eight percent from 3,885, and 15,989 accidents, an increase of 10 percent from 15,540.

Estimated travel for January, the latest figure available, was 2.3 billion miles, which was two percent under the same month last year. The death rate of 3.8 per 100 million miles of travel was down 20 percent.
