Robert Thaler Named Semi-Finalist in Nat'l Merit Scholarship Competition

Robert Thaler, Lowell High School senior and son of Mr. and Mrs. Otto Thaler of 36th Street, was named this week as Lowell's only finalist in the 1959 National Merit Scholarship competition.

The local finalist is among 30,000 of the highest scorers on the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test, the nationwide test of scholastic achievement given in over 10,000 high schools last spring.

Each year we are delighted with the caliber of youngsters who become semi-finalists in the scholastic competition conducted by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation.

John M. Stalnaker, President of National Merit Scholarship Corporation, which conducts the annual program, predicts that over 85 percent of the semi-finalists will get past the second hurdle—the December 5th examination—and become Finalists.

At the final phase of the competition, high school grades, extra-curricular activities, school citizenship, and leadership qualities of the students will be evaluated along with the scores on the tests.

At Finalists, the students will be eligible for scholarship awards sponsored by an estimated 100 business and industrial organizations, professional societies, foundations, individuals, and the National Merit Scholarship Corporation.

As Finalists, the students will receive Certificates of Merit attesting to their high ability; and all colleges and universities will be notified, thus enabling these students to be considered for a wide range of other awards.

Finalists designate the college they wish to attend, and the course of study they plan to pursue, leading to one of the usual baccalaureate degrees.
