Pay More Gas Tax In Two Weeks of 1960 Than Whole of 1959
Michigan motorists will have paid out \$10,082,000 in gasoline taxes in the first two weeks of 1960—the same amount they paid in the entire first year of the tax in 1959, William Palmer, executive secretary of the Associated Petroleum Industries of Michigan, said this means that Michigan motorists "now are rolling one million dollars in gasoline taxes into the state and federal treasuries every 34 hours."
In 1959 the tax was two cents a gallon. Now it includes 8 cents state gasoline tax, four cents federal gasoline tax and the three percent state sales tax—averaging 0.5 to 0.7 cents per gallon on regular gasoline, depending on the local price.

State car owners, Palmer estimated, will pay about \$27,000,000 this year in direct taxes on gasoline.
"This estimate," he said, "assumes that gasoline sales will continue at about the same rate as the past, despite signs of growth."
"It is a surprise to most motorists," Palmer said, "that today's regular gasoline prices, excluding taxes, is substantially below the 29.8 cent average price of gasoline 40 years ago."

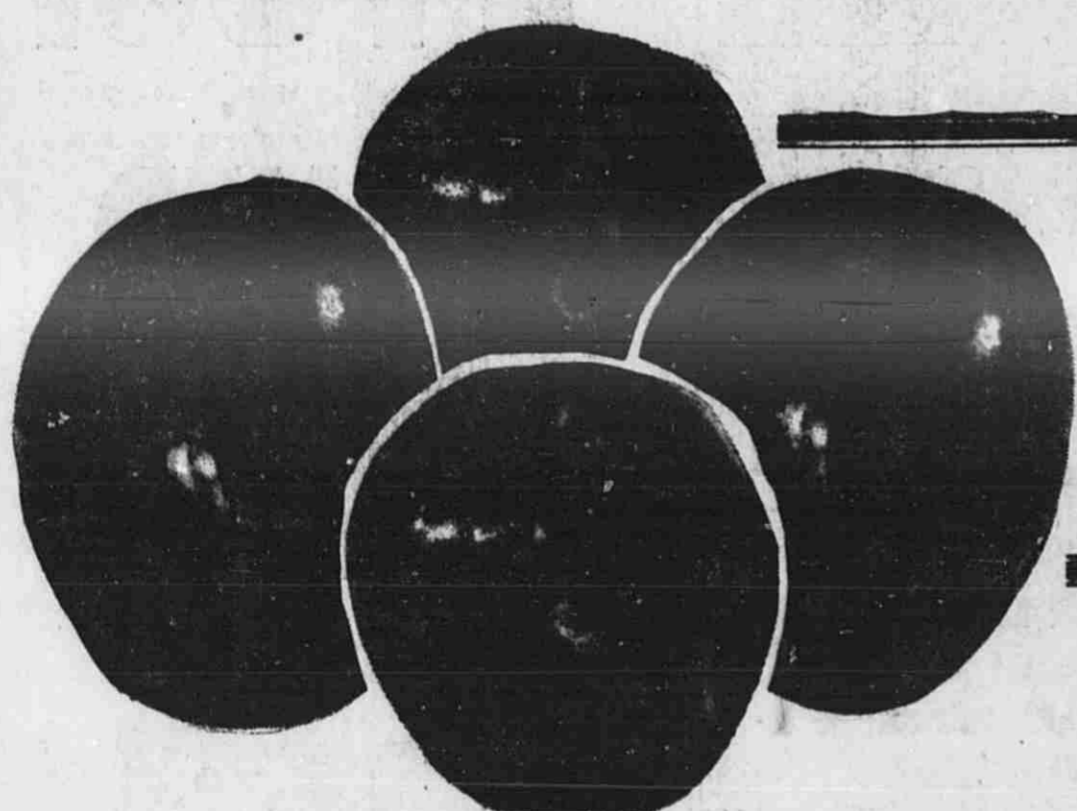
