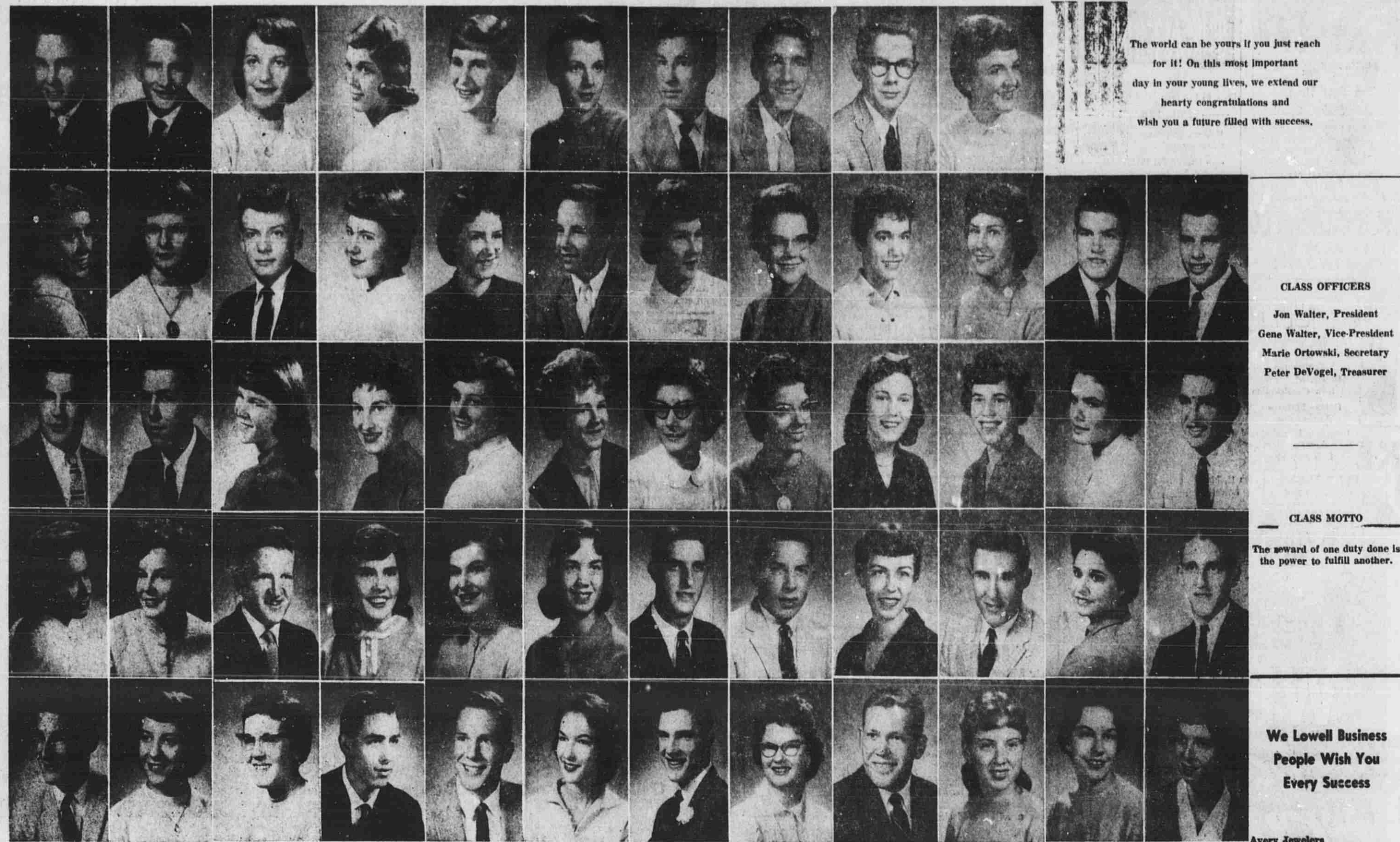

KENT COUNTY, MICHIGAN Special Election Tuesday, June 7

To the Qualified Electors of the Undersigned Townships of the County of Kent, State of Michigan:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a Special Election will be held in the Townships listed below. The following propositions will be submitted to the electors of said County:

- I. Airport Bonding Proposition**
 Shall the County of Kent, State of Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) Dollars and issue and sell its bonds therefore for the purpose of paying part of the cost of constructing and equipping a new airport consisting of a terminal building, runways and all attendant and necessary additional buildings and facilities to provide a completely modern airport, and acquiring a site therefor in said County?
- II. Tax-Rate Limitation Increase Proposition for Airport Bonds**
 Shall the limitation on the total amount of taxes which may be levied against all property in Kent County, Michigan, for all purposes except payment of obligations incurred prior to December 31, 1953, be increased as provided by Section 21, Article X, of the Constitution of Michigan, by two-fifths of one mill on each dollar (40 cents of each \$100.00) of the assessed valuation, as equalized, of all property in the County for a period of seven (7) years, from 1960 to 1976, both inclusive, the proceeds of the levy thereof to be used for the sole purpose of paying the principal and interest on bonds of said County in the aggregate principal sum of Three Million Nine Hundred Seventy-five Thousand (\$3,975,000) Dollars, to be issued if authorized by the qualified electors of said County, for the purpose of paying part of the cost of constructing and equipping a new airport consisting of a terminal building, runways, and all attendant and necessary additional buildings and facilities to provide a completely modern airport and acquiring a site therefor in said County?
- Only properly registered electors who have property assessed for taxes within Kent County, or the lawful husband or wife of such owners, are entitled to vote on the Airport Bonding Proposition.
- All properly registered electors may vote on the Tax-Rate Limitation Increase Proposition for Airport Bonds.
- These Propositions are being submitted in accordance with a resolution adopted by the Board of Supervisors of said County on the 14th day of April, 1960.

Notice Relative to Opening and Closing of the Polls

Section 1. On the day of an election the polls shall be opened at 7 o'clock in the forenoon, and shall be continued open until 8 o'clock in the afternoon and no longer. Every qualified elector present and in line at the polls at the hour prescribed for closing thereof shall be allowed to vote.

THE POLLS of said election will be open at 7 o'clock A.M. and will remain open until 8 o'clock P. M. of said day of election
