Airport Passes

The vote to approve a bond issue of \$3,975,000 to build an airport in Cascade was passed by the taxpayers of Kent County by a total vote of 28,121 Yes to 21,820 No. The proposition for airport bonds, which all voters could vote on, was passed by a vote of 29,132 Yes to 23,931 No.

With the voters approval it will take about 6 months to sell the bonds and another two years to build the airport. It is expected to be ready for use in early 1963.

K. SHOEMAKER INITIATED INTO HONOR FRATERNITY

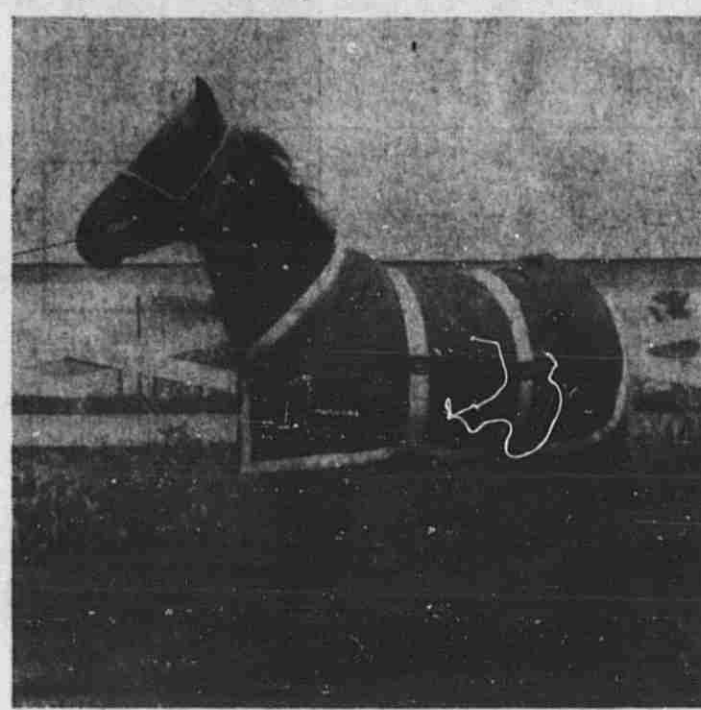

First Camp Period Opens June 27

The Lowell YMCA will operate a Summer Day Camp program for five weeks during the summer using the Lowell Boy Scout Cabin and Recreation Park. The dates are as follows:

June 27 to July 1; July 11 to July 15; July 25 to July 29; August 8 to August 12; August 22 to August 26.

School Board Meets To Discuss Budget, Buses, Gas and French

A full agenda of business faced the Lowell School Board at their monthly meeting last Monday evening.

Concerning the school budget, the retiring superintendent, Walter Gumsier, announced that an increase of 13.6 per cent in the state equalized valuation of Kent County will benefit school districts, including the Lowell board of education, in the 1960-61 school year.

The revised version of the budget was accepted by the Allocation Board, Mr. Gumsier said, and a total of nine mills will be allowed, enabling the Lowell District to finish the ensuing year with a slight balance.

Two Buses Purchased

Five bids concerning school buses were opened by the board in the presence of local automotive dealers. Because of growing transportation needs, the board must purchase two new buses for September operation.

President Gerald Rollins appointed a special bus committee which announced Tuesday morning that both new buses will be obtained through the Bolens Ford Agency for \$6,740 apiece.

The buses, which will seat 60 passengers, have Ford chassis and are equipped with Superior bodies. Power steering will be added as a safety feature.

Following this action, the board voted to convert the heating plant of the Runciman Elementary Building over to gas. Only the Runciman building will be converted at this time.

The heating plant will be equipped to burn both oil and gas, enabling the school board to obtain special gas rates. It is expected that reduced fuel bills for one year will cover the costs of conversion.

French Issue Comes To Head

Mr. and Mrs. Bruce Walter were present at the meeting to request that 9th grade students be allowed to take French. Until last year, French was offered only to Junior and seniors.

As Mrs. Walter pointed out with the aid of a specially-prepared chart, students in the academic program find it difficult to fill French into their schedules during the last two years of high school because of the number of required courses at that level.

Mr. Gumsier remarked that French was offered to sophomore students during the past year, and new superintendent Stephen Nisbet noted that 9th and 10th grade students find their schedule equally as crowded as those of Junior and seniors because of the physical education requirement which must be met during the first two high school years.

The matter was referred to a special committee consisting of Principal Carl Hagen, Supt., Nisbet, and board members, David Coons, Dr. Thomas Hill and Edward Rankin.

This committee will meet with high school language teachers and others to review the French situation.

Riverview School Sold

The Riverview school property was sold to Allen Lasby of Lowell. The board received ten bids, ranging from \$325 to Lasby's high bid of \$2,005.

The board also authorized the purchase of a burglary-preventive device to protect the school safe. Other business concerned the driver education program and the re-grading of the playground south of the Intermediate building.

Board member Rankin inquired into the possibility of installing floodlights on the playground, to be used whenever the area serves as a parking lot for school functions.

Nominating Petition Received

Secretary Hill received a petition nominating Kenneth Anderson of the Chase school district as a member of the Lowell Board of Education. The petition was duly filed.

The vacancies on the board will be filled at the annual election which will be held on Monday, July 11, 1960. In accordance with provisions of a law becoming effective this year, two additional members must be elected to all fourth class school districts, making a total of seven board members in districts like the Lowell Area Schools.

At the close of the meeting, Mr. Gumsier, attending for the last time in an official capacity, briefly mentioned his appreciation for the recent testimonial dinner given in his honor, and thanked all members of the board for their constant cooperation during his long tenure as superintendent.

Lowell Annexes River School

After a hotly-contested campaign, the River school district in Ada voted overwhelmingly to annex to Lowell Area Schools.

Despite the light turnout at the polls, 78 per cent of the voters assembled forces and voted in favor of annexation. With a final tally of 32-9, only 22 per cent of the ballots were cast against the proposal.

The second proposal, concerning the levying of millage, passed 31-8; 78 per cent voted in favor of this proposal, and 21 per cent voted against.

The third proposal on the ballot asked whether or not the voters wished to accept Lowell's bonded indebtedness. The voters passed in favor of this question, with a tally of 26-7.

Some of the ballots for the third proposal were disqualified for being improperly marked.

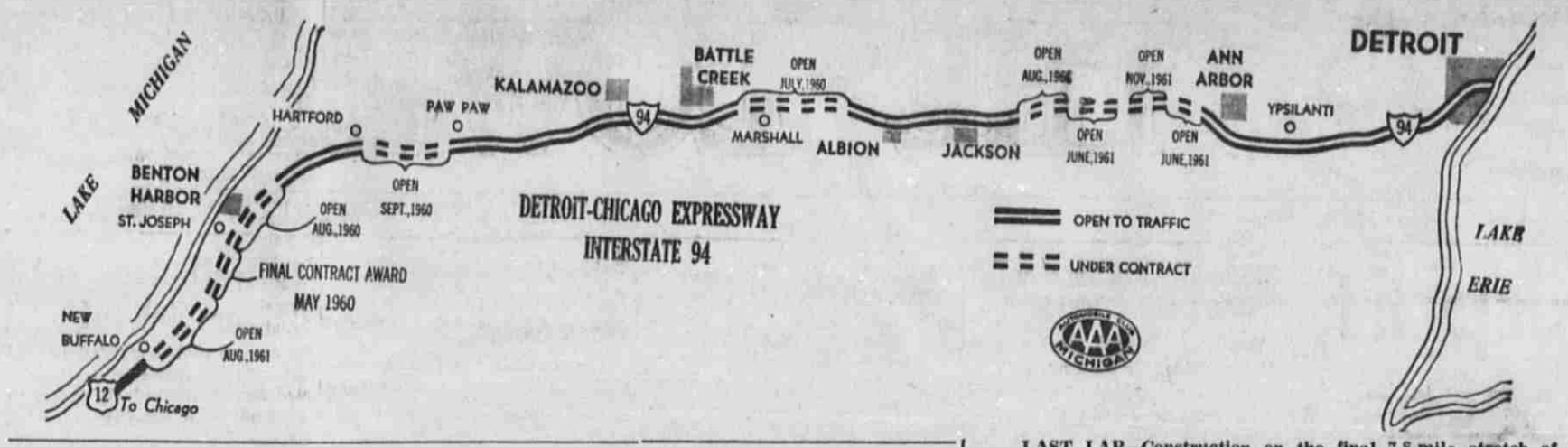

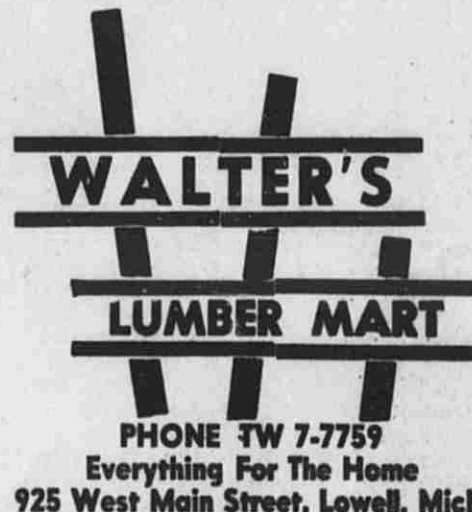

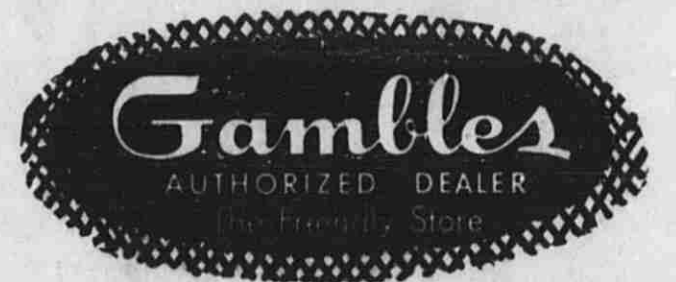
