Hoag Co-Captain of Albion Grid Team



Ray Hoag, Jr., a 6-foot, 180-pound Albion College senior who hails from the Lowell area, will act as co-captain of the Broncos' gridiron team as it plunges into its 8-game football season this fall.

The season opener will be staged Saturday, September 16, at which time the Albion eleven will clash on the home field with a formidable Eastern Michigan University powerhouse.

Eastern University boasts an enrollment five times greater than Albion's student roster of 1,375, and the Broncos' team, weakened through graduation, transfer, injury and illness, will have a battle on its hands.

Dale Springer, a senior guard from Lansing, will share the leadership responsibilities with Hoag and, like his counterpart, will start for the Albion club on both the offensive and defensive line-ups.

Albion Football Coach Morley Fraser says that Hoag is a solid two-way player in the halfback position. Offensively he runs hard and is equally good inside or outside. Defensively he's a vicious tackler and is an outstanding player on pass defense.

Last fall Hoag made the all-MIAA defensive team from the halfback slot and led the MIAA-championship Albion team, which boasted a win-loss record of 7-1, in scoring from the offensive left half position with 48 points.

Ray was named to the Grand Valley All-Conference Team during his high school gridiron career before graduating from Lowell with the class of 1954. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Hoag of 10630 52nd St., Route 2, Lowell.

While in high school he was credited with four years each of football, basketball, and baseball, and one year in the athletic association. He also served on the student council and as president of his class.

At Albion Ray is an excellent student and a leader both on and off the field. Majoring in mathematics, he plans to head for a teaching and coaching career following graduation from the Methodist-operated college.

Great Hope for 1961 Lowell High Eleven

Lowell High football team opened practice Monday morning and scheduled practices twice a day this week. Twenty-five have signed up for the varsity squad, but turn-out to practice has been poor.

Coach Charles Pierce revealed Tuesday that his first eleven look good, but depth is lacking and injuries will hold the key to success of the 1961 season.

The season opens here September 15 against Ionia, a team which has defeated Lowell three seasons in a row, and Pierce hopes to reverse this season-opening trend this year.

Strong Boys on Team
Backbone of the center of the line will be Tom Bigelow, 6' 4", 200 pound center who appears to be strong and in great condition; close behind him is Howard Acheson who played on the 1960 squad. Also strong points on the line are the two ends, Rick Beimers, 6' 4", 190 lbs. and his opposite, Dan Huver.

At tackle, Pierce said he looks to Roger Depeu, who played some last year, and to Bob Myers, who played halfback on the junior varsity last year but has been moved to tackle. Tom Serne, a member of the 1961 squad, is in there battling for a regular tackle spot.

Candidates for the guard position include Duane Mayou, last year letter winner, Lloyd Wepman and Jerry Hale, who played with the varsity last year, and Karon Ford and Jerry Nash, who looked good last season on the junior-varsity.

Dilly Key to Success
Don Dilly, now weighing in at 182 lbs. and in good condition, is expected to be the scoring punch of the 1961 team. A fast and excellent pass receiver, his success will pace the team.

Running with him as a back will be Larry Miller at 160 lbs.; the other running back spot is being contested for by John Sawka of last year's team and by two newcomers from the 1960 junior-varsity, Lloyd Slack and Tom Davis.

At quarterback, last year's regular John Kroff, heavier at 170 lbs. and sharper on his passing, should prove to be an outstanding leader of this year's eleven. Tex Ford is close behind Kroff and will no doubt get an opportunity to fill in the pivot spot.

Coach Pierce says he expects to have a strong defense unit with Huver, Miller and Kroff as line backers and a set of fast halfbacks. A new candidate for the Lowell team, a transfer student, Wally Bennett, who is a senior and a member of last year's Creston varsity reserve, may fit into a guard position. He is expected to report Wednesday for practice.

Playing in New Conference
Pierce feels that right now the Rockford and Belding teams appear to be the strongest in the new Tri-River Conference, with Sparta the dark-horse.

Besides the conference teams and the traditional opener against Ionia, Lowell will play Grandville and East Grand Rapids. Here is the schedule:

Heart Attack, Car Crash Take Life of H. L. Shaler

Harry L. Shaler, 47, of 503 N. Washington, Lowell, was killed Monday afternoon, August 28, when his car went off the road and struck a tree in the 6900 block of E. Fulton Street near Ada.

Deputy Richard Williams of the Kent County Sheriff's Department said witnesses reported that Mr. Shaler's eastbound car veered back and forth before leaving the road. Police believe he may have suffered a heart attack or was overcome by other illness.

He was dead on arrival at Blodgett Memorial Hospital in Grand Rapids, where he had been taken by a local ambulance. Dr. James C. Humphrey, Kent medical examiner, officially listed death as being caused by a broken neck sustained in the accident.

Shaler's death was the 37th traffic fatality in Kent County in 1961. On the same date in 1960 only 29 had been killed.

Shaler was born on February 13, 1914. At the time of his death he worked as an electrician for Delta Electric Corp. in Grand Rapids. He was a member of the Lowell Methodist Church.

Surviving are his wife, Marguerite May; three daughters, Lola Lee and Karen Mae at home and Mrs. James Winslow of Grand Ledge; two sons, Kenneth A. of Saranac and Robert E. of Lowell; and six grandchildren.

Services will be held at 2 p. m. Thursday at the Roth Funeral home in Lowell, with the Rev. J. Marion DeVinney officiating. Burial will be made in Oakwood Cemetery in Lowell.

Ware and Sweet School Districts Vote to Join Lowell Area Schools

Voters in two rural school districts went to the polls Monday and overwhelmingly approved proposals to annex to the Lowell Area Schools and to assume Lowell's bonded indebtedness.

The districts involved are the Ware School District, which is located about three miles southeast of the City of Lowell in Kent and Ionia Counties, and the Sweet School District, located approximately three miles south of Lowell.

Twenty-six school-age children were involved in the annexation proposals, eight of which come from the Ware District, and eighteen of which live in the Sweet District.

The Ware District youngsters and the 1st and 2nd graders from Sweet District will be brought in to Lowell for their schooling, and the remaining Sweet students will attend the Alto schools.

Ware District, a border district between Lowell and Saranac, has been split between the two schools. The area going to Saranac had been previously transferred, and only the remains of the district voted in the August 28 election.

Ware Voters Unanimous
Ware District voters were unanimous in their approval of the four proposals listed on the ballot. Of the 38 registered voters in the district, 21 turned out at the polls to mark their ballots.

The Ware voters ratified the annexation proposal with a vote of 21-0. They also unanimously approved the assumption of the 1959 Lowell School bond issue debt with an 18-0 vote, the assumption of the 1961 Lowell School bond issue debt 20-0, and the assumption of the 1955 Lowell School bond issue debt with a less enthusiastic vote of 10-0.

Some dissent was expressed in the Sweet District vote, but the annexation proposal passed with a tally of 39-4.

The Sweet vote was 31-3 in favor of each of the three assumption-of-debt proposals.

Council OK's Zoning Change

At a public hearing on Monday night, the Council asked the 14 present if they had any objections to changing the zoning ordinance to permit the Lowell Development Corp. to reduce the lot size to 9,000 square feet and 70 foot frontage.

There were no serious objections offered and the Council requested the recommendation of the zoning board to allow the change in this plat only.

As a further change the zoning group also asked that the zoning ordinance be changed to permit the building of a garage or auxiliary building within 3 feet of a lot line, but no closer than 13 feet to any neighbor's buildings. This recommendation was also passed by the Council.

Sell Township Office
Councilman Walter Gumsier announced that Ray Rittenger, Lowell Township Supervisor, has agreed to accept the offer of Jack Fonger to purchase the former township office on West Main Street for \$3,500.

The next regular meeting of the Council will be on Tuesday, September 5.

Bernard Baer, Ada Township resident and former owner of the Stevensons Department Store in Ionia, announced this week that he will open a new dress shop in the Christiansen Building Friday, September 1.

The new shop with its trade mark of girl and umbrella with a lamp will be known as the "Debonaire Shop" and will feature ladies' dresses, coats, sportswear and accessories.

Baer also announced that Margi Sveadas will manage the new store. She is now living in Grand Rapids, but hopes to move to the community in the near future. Margi was manager of the Ionia Store and has many friends in the area.

Air Show Earnings Estimated at \$800

Hollis J. Marsh, newly elected president of the Lowell Airport Association, Inc., said Monday that earnings on last Sunday's air show have been estimated by the airport promotion group at \$800. Approximately 1,500 people were present at the aviation display.

Marsh said the profits would be used by the airport group to improve the facilities at the field and enable the port to be licensed by the State Civil Aeronautics Board.

Marsh added that uncertain weather hampered the event and that the failure of parachute jumpers and skydivers to appear further marred the success of the show.

Speaking for the Airport Assn., Marsh said, "We therefore feel that we still owe the public a little more for the money, and plans are already underway to have the parachutists and the skydivers here along with a Dawn Patrol or maybe the Waco Club of America sometime within the next month if it can be arranged that soon. There will be no admission charged for this event."

Marsh went on to thank the people of Lowell, the Junior Chamber of Commerce, local businessmen, and others for contributing to the success of the event.

Teachers' Breakfast Kicks Off School Lunch Program

The Lowell Area School Lunch Program gets underway on the opening day of school with the annual Teachers' and Board Members' breakfast, Tuesday morning, September 5, at 8 a. m. in the Runciman cafeteria.

Melon wedges or orange juice, ham and eggs, buttered toast, blueberry pancakes and syrup, sweet rolls, and coffee compose the menu for the event.

The regular school lunch series begins Wednesday noon. Lunches will cost 30 cents per day, and extra milk for those who carry their lunch will also be sold.

On Wednesday's menu for the students will be Bar-B-Que, potato chips, relishes, fresh fruit, and cookies.

Thursday mashed potatoes, beef and gravy, sliced tomatoes, homemade bread and butter, and applesauce will be served.

Rounding out the week on Friday, fish hot buttered vegetables, crisp salad, rolls and butter will be featured, with peach upside down cake capping the meal for dessert.

Supervisors Set Planning Bureau

The Kent County Board of Supervisors, in regular session last Wednesday, overwhelmingly approved a County Planning Commission for Kent County and allotted \$7,500 to provide necessary monies required to establish and operate such planning functions for the balance of this year.

County Comptroller Lynn Anderson said the total expenditure for the program during the year 1962 would probably come to about \$23,000 or \$24,000.

The Commission is to consist of 11 members, representing important segments of the economic, governmental and social life of the County. The resolution calls for three of the Commission members to be selected from industry and commerce, one each from public utilities, transportation, legal profession, medical profession, education, Chamber of Commerce, agriculture and one from Government.

It is further stipulated that the members shall be appointed by election by the Board of Supervisors and that the majority of the Commission shall hold no other office or position in the County government. Members will serve without compensation, except for actual expenses.

Along with establishing the Planning Commission, the Board also authorized a seven member Standing Committee on Planning to act as a liaison group between the Planning Commission and the Board.

The matter of establishing a County Planning Commission has been under study by a committee of Board members for several months.

In other matters of general interest, the Board directed the Drain Commissioner to establish the normal height and level of the water of Big Crooked Lake in Grattan Township and Lincoln Lake in Spencer Township and to establish special assessment districts as required. Civil Council was also directed to institute the proper petition in Kent County Circuit Court. Following this, the Drain Commissioner will then take steps to see the proper level of the lakes is maintained.

The Board also tabled a proposal to establish a standing committee for liaison with the state legislature and will take the matter under further study.

The next regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors will be held October 9.

City Wins in Junk Yard Case Against DeMull

City Attorney Richard VanderVeen, revealed Wednesday, that the case of the City of Lowell versus Harry DeMull who has operated a junk yard in a A-1 zoned area of the city was decided in favor of the City by Judge Stuart Hoffius.

Judge Hoffius upheld the irregular issuance of a permit by the township, but also ruled that the City zoning ordinance, which requires non-conforming use of an area to be discontinued after 3 years of non-compliance, was valid.

This ordinance is based on a California approved ordinance, but never tested in Michigan until this time.

The ordinance has been in effect for one year and DeMull has two more years of non-compliance before the junk yard must be removed.

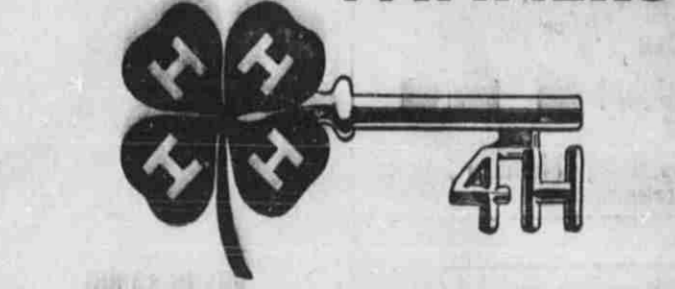
