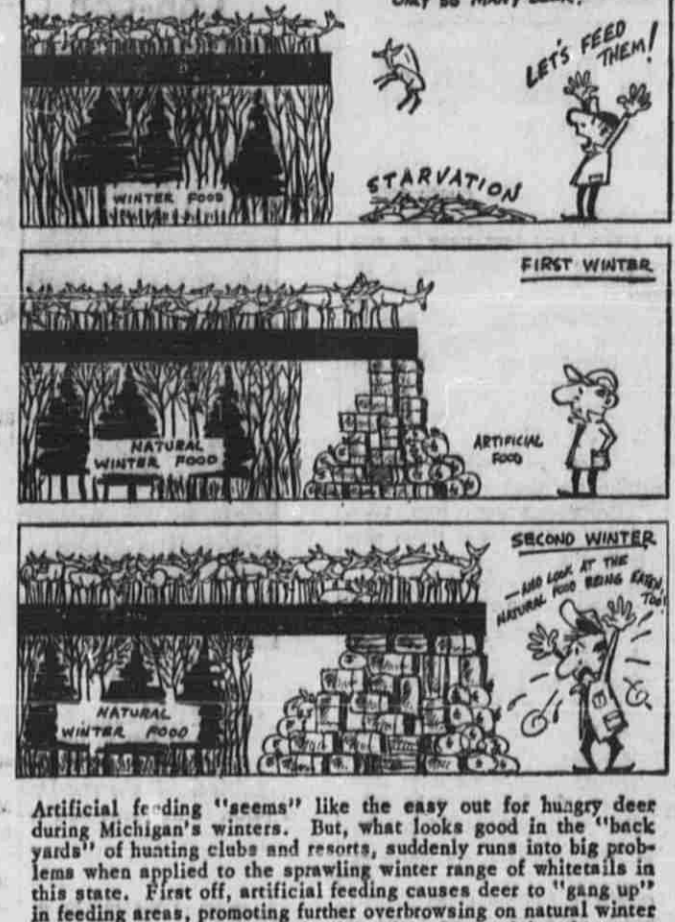

All That Glitters...

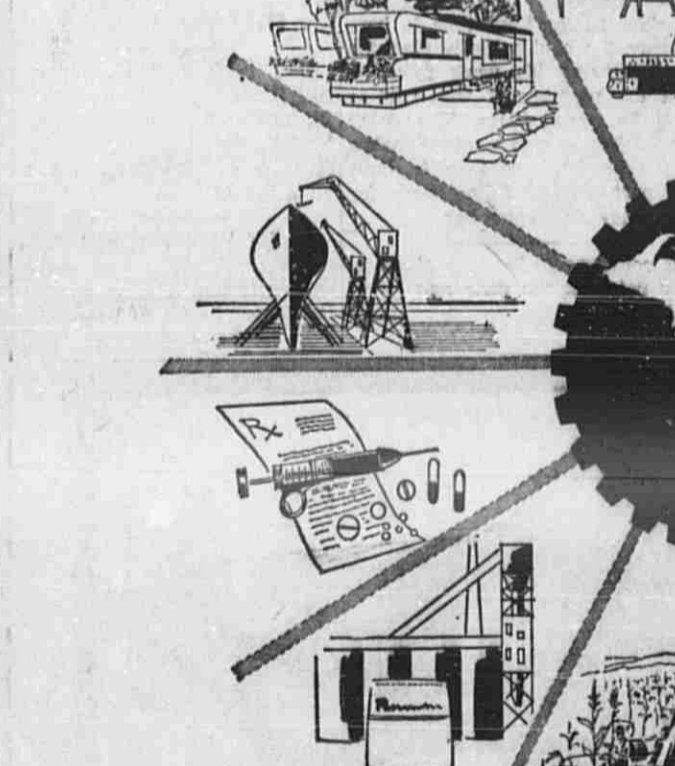


Artificial feeding "seems" like the easy way out for hungry deer during Michigan's winters. But, what looks good in the "back yard" of heating clubs and resorts, suddenly runs into big problems when applied to the sprawling winter range of whitetails in this state. First off, artificial feeding causes deer to "gag up" in feeding areas, promoting further overwintering on natural winter foods. Limited artificial feeding might be useful under some short-term emergencies, but on a large scale it could pyramid deer numbers and cause more damage to the woods than it would help. The deer winter range is a delicate balance of food and shelter. Deer are not a pest; they are a natural part of the woods. Deer and other wildlife during emergencies—Mich. Dept. of Conservation.

The issues in this Constitutional Convention are getting more difficult, the consequences more involved and far-reaching. Several times during the past few days we have begun discussions about what everybody here now familiarly calls "Ten," that is Section 10 of Article I, titled "Searches and Seizures."

There is no quarrel about the first part which declares the people and their houses shall be secure from unreasonable searches and seizures, and "no warrant shall issue, without probable cause."

The majority of the Rights, Suffrage and Elections Committee recommended that the last part of Section 10 be stricken. The majority said Michigan is the only state in the Union with a provision like this. Bad policemen abuse it while the good ones do not use it. It is damaging to civil liberties and unnecessary for law enforcement. This was the argument that led to the passage of the Convention after listening to scores of professional people, churchmen and other witnesses.

Chairman James K. Pollock, U. S. political scientist, declared the strongest argument for tossing out the provision "that it violates the Constitution of the United States. This affected many delegates most strongly," he said.

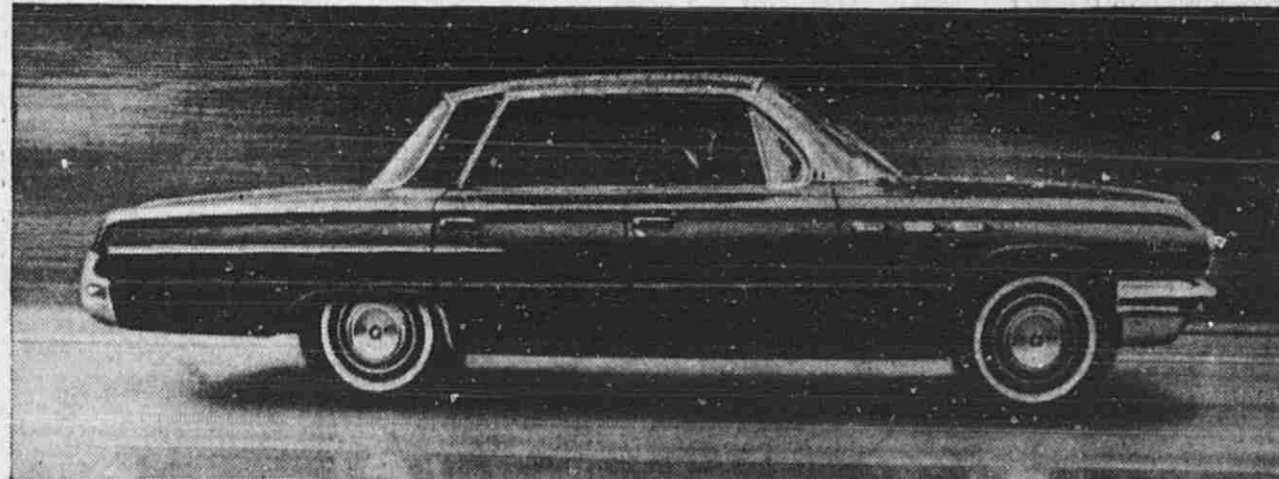
