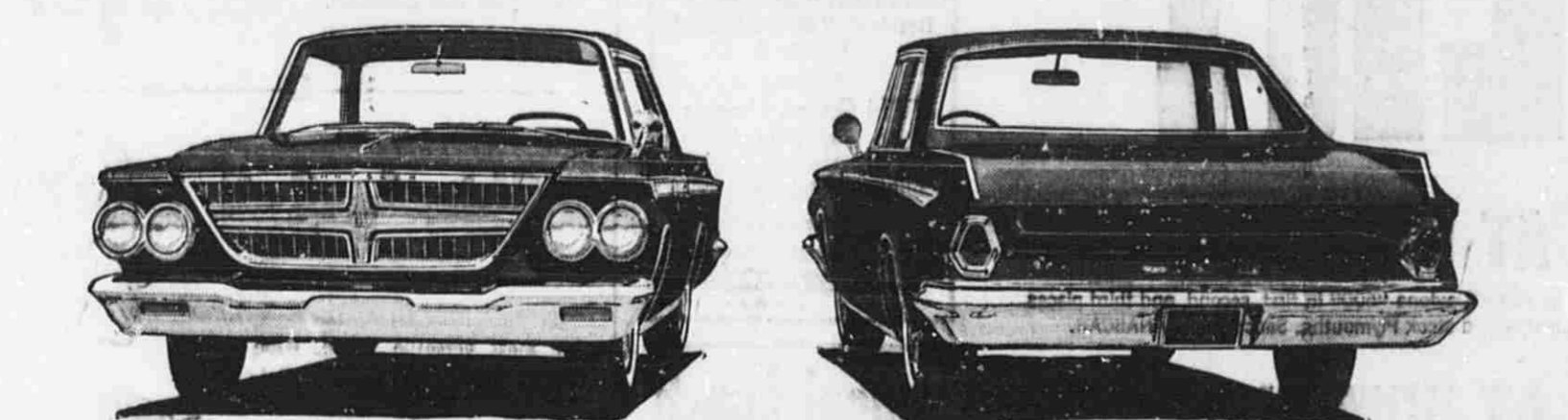
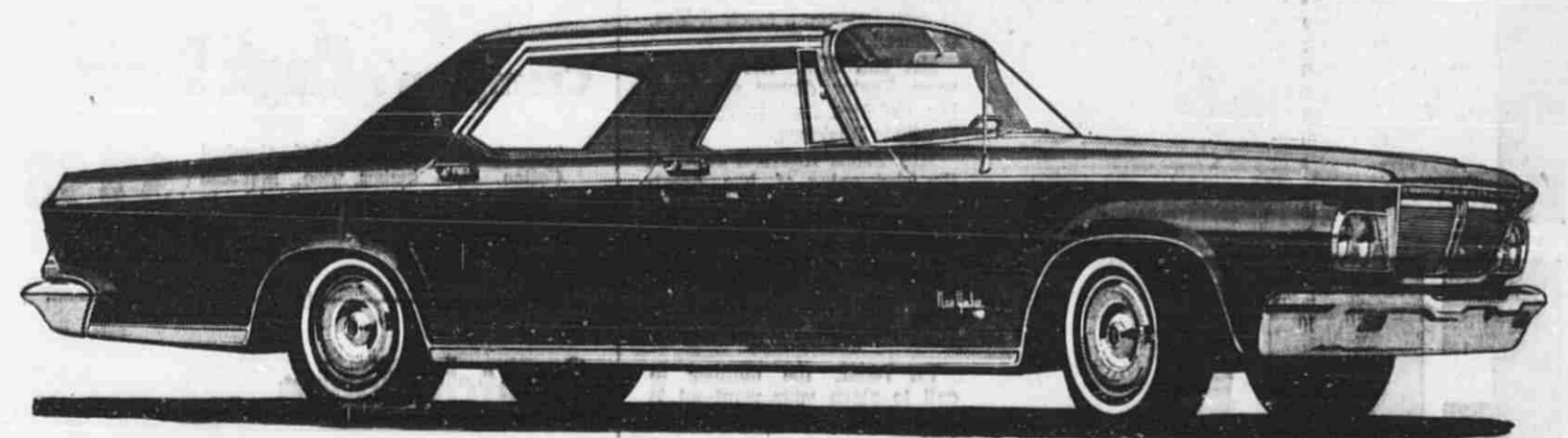

At instructor's conference County Fire Chief learns new methods

C. Jeff Geldersma, chief of the Kent County Volunteer Fire Department, attended the 36th annual Fire Department Instructor's Conference in Ellis Auditorium at Memphis, Tennessee, March 24 to 27, for four days of study and discussion of latest fire prevention and fire control methods.

One of the principal subjects of this year's program was discussion of fire control problems posed by three recent fire disasters occurring in an Indiana colosseum, an Ohio nursing home, and a Florida hotel in each of which there was a high loss in lives.

Maryland's Governor Millard Tawes was the keynote speaker at this four day program which, among its 40-odd program items, included subjects on industrial plant protection, personal safety of firemen in attacking fires, new firemen's training procedures, and new fire fighting methods, the latter shown in a number of outdoor demonstrations.

Over 3500 persons from more than 40 states, Canada, and several foreign countries registered at this international fire service gathering. The conference was attended by key fire department officers, educators from colleges and universities, fire and industrial plant protection engineers, representatives of the armed services and public officials, all who participate only on invitation of the two

Conference sponsors, the Fire Prevention Department of Western Actuarial Bureau and the Memphis Fire Department.

The conference, now in its 36th year, is a clearing house for the exchange of ideas for improvement in fire fighting methods, in firemen's training, and in fire prevention. Presiding officer of the conference was Emmett T. Cox, director of Western Actuarial Bureau's fire prevention department.
