

Signs bill on social security disability claims

Late last year, President Johnson signed a bill which eliminated the 18 month restriction on filing disability claims for social security benefits. This restriction stated that a person filing for disability had to meet the insured requirements within 18 months before filing, regardless of when he became disabled. Thus, a person who waited too long to file a claim might have lost monthly benefits, or in some cases, would no longer be eligible for payment. The bill opened the way to helping more than 50,000 people who waited too long to file a claim, and also gave those persons who never filed an opportunity to do so.
