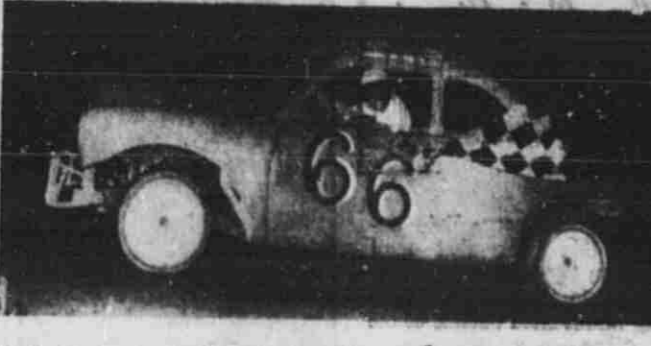

PRELIMINARY winners were Charlie Evans, Norm Aspinall, and Van Dyke.

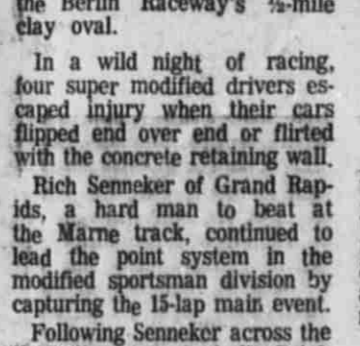
THIS FRIDAY night the Hastings Speedway will present its first powder puff derby of the season. Last year the women put on some of the most crash-studded programs.
