Sells book to movies



"Arizona author scores again; movies buy Swarthout's new book" heads the column by Edwin McDowell, clipped and mailed to the Ledger office by Mrs. Helen Look Dailey, now a year-around resident of Tucson, Arizona.

Lowell's best known writer, Glendon Swarthout, LHS graduate of 1936, and one of the nation's foremost writers is back in the news in a big way.

His latest novel will be published in October and already it has been bought for the movies by Sam Spiegel, one of Hollywood's top producers.

In fact, the book, "The Eagle and the Iron Cross," was sold to the movies before it was offered to book publishers. About a month after it was purchased by Spiegel, New American Library acquired both handover and paperback rights.

The novel, like Swarthout's most recent success, "The Cadillac Cowboys," is set in Arizona, but there the similarity ends.

"Cadillac Cowboys" was a satire which poked fun at our nouveau riche and our archaic institutions.

"The Eagle and the Iron Cross" tells of two young Germans who escape from the Papago Peaks POW camp and set out to be cowboys. They became disillusioned with the real West, which differs from their preconceptions, and the story ends, according to its author, on a note of ironic tragedy.

Glendon Swarthout, Scottsdale, Arizona, spent untold hours researching the history of POW camps in America and interviewing former inmates during the three years that went into the book. Swarthout was surprised to learn that there were more than 100 POW camps in the United States, three in Arizona alone.

Most POWs in Arizona were veterans of the African Corps who were captured in one desert and imprisoned in another.

Swarthout noted that an entire generation of German youngsters in the 1920's & 30's was brought up on Karl May & Zane Grey. No wonder their favorite films in pre-Nazi Germany were those featuring Hoot Gibson, Tim McCoy, Buck Jones and Tom Mix.

The latest word is that filming of "The Eagle and the Iron Cross," will begin in Arizona next March. "Although," quipped the author, "it won't surprise me if it is filmed in North Africa with Arabs playing the parts of Indians."
