How to Identify Coho, Kokanee Salmon





Under its program to boost Michigan's sportfishing, the Conservation Department has introduced more than three million kokanee salmon in Torch and Higgins lakes within the last two springs. As part of this plan, first-year plantings of about 800,000 coho salmon were made in three northern Michigan streams this spring. Now, Department fisheries men are eager to learn how these new fish are doing. This illustration should help fishermen tell kokanee and cohos from trout so they can report their catches of four to six inches and some of them should be hooked this summer in Torch and Higgins lakes. Some of the early-maturing cohos may migrate up a few of Michigan's Great Lakes streams this fall. The best bets for their runs include the Big Huron River, the Platte River and Bear Creek, where they were originally released, and the Big Manistee River below Bear Creek. Regulations are being drawn up to provide for the legal taking of kokanee and cohos. They are scheduled to take effect in August and will be liberal. -- Mich. Dept. of Conservation





Hiking boosts good health

Your doctor says, "Take a walk."

Take a long walk, every day, if you can find the time. Any sort of walking is good, but a brisk walk is better.

Walking or hiking is an excellent exercise that involves many of the muscles of the body. The feet take quite a beating in walking. Be sure that shoes fit properly, are well broken in and have no rough spots inside. Wearing two pair of socks helps. The feet function best when the toes point straight a-head in walking. Walking with toes in our out distributes the body's weight unequally on the

The American Medical Association cautions the untrained person against an exercise orgy in hiking or in any other vigorous physical activity. The enthusiast who tries to do it all at once often ends up with stiff muscles and a stiffer resolve to avoid exercise in the

A medical check up before beginning an exercise program is a wise precaution to be sure no health problems exist that might be aggravated by exercise. The level of activity should be built up slowly with consideration for age, condition and general response to exercise.




