Hi! Folks,

It has started to get a little warmer here. The rain has slowed down a little bit. It only rains about three or four times a day.

The enemy harassed us last night for the first time since we got here. The bunkers around the base camp received some fire. No was hurt. I don't think they have enough troops to attack us. We are pretty well set up now.

In the day time we improve our bunkers, set up tents, dig holes, etc. You wouldn't even know we were at war, the way everyone relaxes in the day time.

They have already set-up a shower and they have started tarring roads.

In about two or three months this place is supposed to be just like Fort Lewis. It doesn't hardly seem possible that just two weeks ago it was just an open field.

I made Specialist Fourth Class yesterday. It is the same rank as corporal except you are not in charge of any men. I'm just in charge of my gun and its crew.

We went out to a rifle range today, that the 25th had at their home camp. Everyone shot a few rounds just to see if they could still hit the old target.

By the way, would you send me my insulated underwear. It gets to be over a 100 degrees in the day time and down to about 70 degrees at night. The drop in temperature makes it very cold at night.

Well better go for now.

School starts next Tuesday

The Lowell Area Schools will open their doors next Tuesday, September 6, 1966, at 1 p. m. for a short session lasting from 1 p. m. to 3 p. m. Full day classes will start on Wednesday, September 7.

About 2,400 students are expected to be attending the Lowell Schools this year and because of the shortage in classrooms the system has rented temporary classroom space in the Lowell Methodist Church building, the Lowell Congregational Church basement, the St. Mary's School and the Alto Baptist Church basement.

Kindergarten classes will be held at the Congregational and Baptist Church; a second grade section at the Methodist Church; and a first grade section at St. Mary's School.

The bus routes will be the same as last year with necessary changes to be made during the first week. Twenty-one bus routes will be ran, one more than last year, with the new route to help transport the students entering Lowell from the Talbot, Moseley and Alton Districts.

Bus Routes

The buses will leave the school at noon on Tuesday, and parents are requested to have their children ready at that time and at the bus stop used last year, and as the first week problems are settled the routes will be firmly established.

The cafeterias will start serving lunches on Wednesday with the prices to remain the same as last year; 30 cents a day for elementary students, 35 cents for high school students, and 40 cents for adults. The menu for next week is located elsewhere in the paper.

Students in the elementary grades, first through sixth grades, will pay a book rental fee of \$9. Students in grades seven and eight will pay a book rental fee of \$10, and high school students will purchase their books.

It is planned to make the high school books available next year on a rental basis instead of a purchase plan.

Kindergarten starts

Kindergarten classes will not start until Monday, September 12, but parents of kindergarten students are reminded to bring their child to either the Runciman School or Alto School on Thursday, September 8.

Parents living in town should bring their child in the morning and those living in the country should bring them in the afternoon.

Please do not put them on buses but bring them yourself in order that placement and time of attendance and all requirements be met.

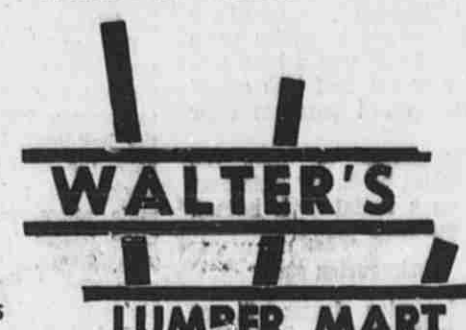

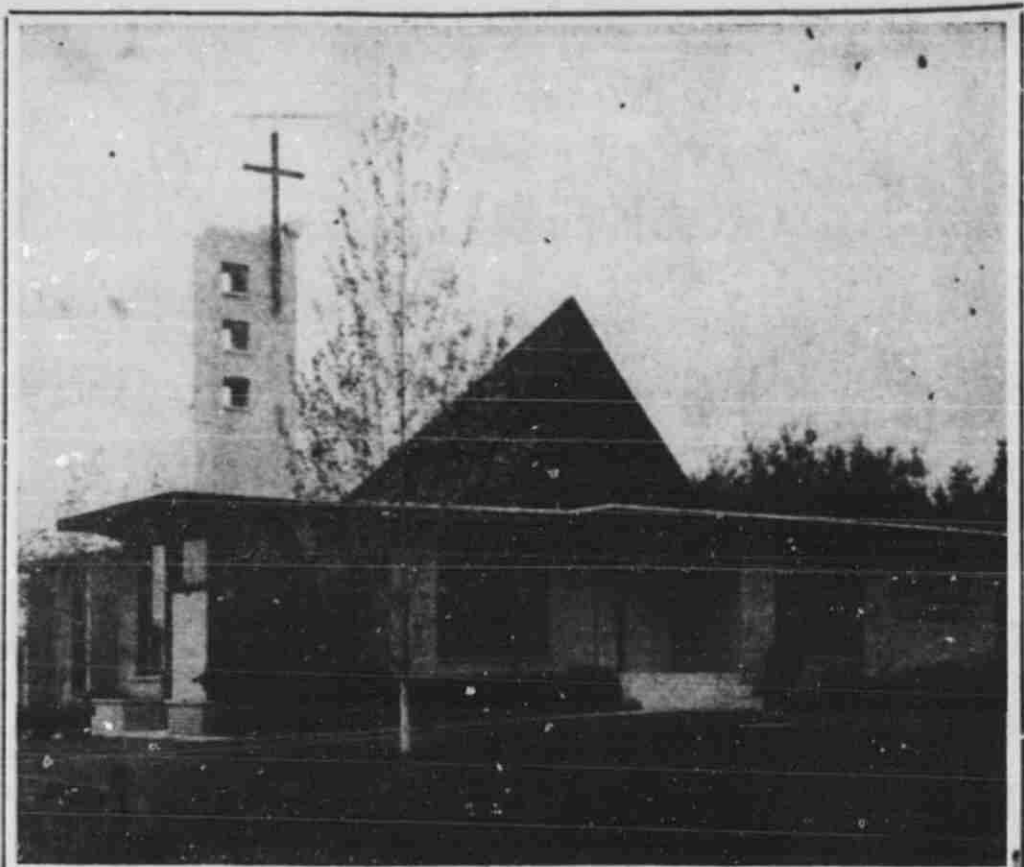
