YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED, that a Special County Election will be held in Kent County on Tuesday the 8th day of November, 1966 at which election there will be submitted to the qualified electors of the County of Kent a proposition to increase the tax limitation by one mill per year for not to exceed four years from 1967 to 1970, both years inclusive, for the purpose of acquiring a site and erecting and equipping a new building Kent County Medical Care Facility; and a proposition to authorize the Board of Supervisors to levy a tax, if the tax limitation is increased, of not to exceed one mill for a period of not to exceed four years from 1967 to 1970, both years inclusive, to create a sinking fund to be used for the purchase of real estate for a site and for the construction and equipping of a building and facility for the Kent County Medical Care Facility.

Richard Lynch, Ada Township Supervisor was introduced and commented on the various firsts of the bridge. It is the largest single span bridge built in the State of Michigan in the last 50 years, it is 500 feet long.

There will be a boat launching site built and a small park with picnic tables where the supports of the old bridge are now being demolished.

Richard H. Jewell, chairman of the Kent County Road Commission accepted the bridge for the county and stated that many more bridges are going to be built throughout Michigan in the next few years to keep up with the growing highway system, that at the present time is only one percent complete.

In Kent County alone, there is a need for 30 new bridges and in order that the bridges and highways can be constructed, there will have to be an increase in gasoline taxes and license plate fees.

Mr. Jewell and Mr. Lynch used "man-sized" scissors for the red-ribbon cutting.

New planned parenthood clinic to open Nov. 9

The Kent County Health Department and the Planned Parenthood Association have announced the opening of Kent County's fourth family-planning clinic to be located in the Cedar Springs Community Building in Cedar Springs. Scheduled to open Wednesday, November 9, the clinic will operate every second and fourth Wednesday from 7-9 p. m.

The clinic will provide free services which will include a complete medical examination, a cancer detection test, information on all methods of birth control and child-spacing, as well as pre-marital and infertility counseling. Transportation & child care will be provided for the clinic sessions, for which no appointment is necessary. Further information can be obtained by calling the Planned Parenthood office in Grand Rapids at 453-3101.

There will be an Open House at the Cedar Springs Clinic on November 9 from 7-9 p. m., at which everyone will be welcome. The entire staff of doctors, nurses, and volunteers will be available at that time to explain the family-planning program and familiarize visitors with the facilities at the clinic.

In Grand Rapids the Planned Parenthood Association maintains a clinic at its headquarters at 45 Barclay, NE, as well as in the Sheldon Complex, 917 Jefferson, SE. Another clinic is operated by the Kent County Health Department at its facilities on Walker Road, NW. The Cedar Springs clinic is the first of several clinics planned for the greater Kent County area.
