- 1. Farmers who employ three or more employees for 13 or more consecutive weeks will be required to provide full Workmen's Compensation benefits. 2. Most farmers who employ any PART-TIME labor will be required to provide partial Workmen's Compensation benefits. 3. The State Insurance Bureau has ruled that the necessary insurance can be provided ONLY with a separate Workmen's Compensation policy.
