## Ledger's name is changed; will launch new free circulation "East Kent Shopper's Guide" May 11

Lowell! The Grand Valley Ledger is changing its name back to "The Lowell Ledger" and is unveiling a new free circulation shopper on Monday, May 11. Ledger Publisher Roger Brown explains his reasons for the changes. "As a paid circulation paper, the Ledger has never been able to offer advertisers in the area the circulation that they need, especially the large advertisers. Our new East Kent Shop-

The new East Kent Shopper's Guide is styled after the Ionia County Shopper's Guide, a 17,000 circulation shopper published by Brown's father and brothers since 1968. Merchants with a need to reach both market areas can place their ad in the two publications at low combination rates. "The 13,000 circulation East Kent Shopper coupled

Guide offers advertisers 40,000 total circulation for just \$4.00 per column inch. Of that 40,000, only about 1,500 residences in western Ionia County will receive both publications," Brown

The East Kent Shopper will break on Mondays, a plus for nearly all advertisers. Readers will have more of the week in which to respond to the advertisements. "Most large advertisers, such as grocery stores, prefer Monday delivery" Brown said. Monday delivery will also benefit the Lowell car dealers because they are all open late on Mondays. "Everybody knows, the early bird catches the worm." Brown added.

The East Kent Shopper's Guide will be delivered as third class mail through the U.S. Post Office. The paper will be printed Friday evenings, entered at the Lowell Post Office Saturday mornings and delivered Mondays. The area covered includes all city routes, rural routes and post office boxes in Lowell, Ada and Alto. Also included are rural route two out of Belmont and rural route eight out of Rockford. About 1,500 homes in Ionia County, including all of Saranac, will be delivered through the Ionia County Shopper's Guide delivery system known as Econo-Mail, Inc. Geographic boundaries of the new East Kent Shopper's Guide are roughly defined as: M-44 to the north, Johnson Rd. to the east, 76th St. to the south and Crahen Ave and the Thornapple River to the west.

An added plus to advertisers in the East Kent Shopper's Guide is the opportunity to repeat their ad later in the week by inserting it in the Lowell Ledger at drastically reduced rates. "The Ledger's open rate is \$2.15, and we're offering a full \$1.00 off that rate for ads picked up from either the East Kent or Ionia County Shopper's Guides" Brown said.

At \$2.25 cents per column inch, the East Kent Shopper's Guide rate is by far the most economical advertising medium in the area. Discounts are also offered for large display ads. The first discount is for a 24 column inch, one quarter page ad. Classified ads are also reasonably priced at \$2.00 for the first 20 words and five cents each for additional words. Inserts are also welcome at a \$38.00 per thousand rate for inserts weighing up to one ounce. Heavier inserts will billed at slightly higher

The Alto Lions Club will be selling White Cane pins at various locations around Lowell on Friday and Saturday, May 1 and 2. The Lowell Lions Club will take their turn on Friday and Saturday, May 8 and 9. Proceeds from White Cane sales are divided between the Welcome Home for the Blind in Grand Rapids, and the Lions Leaders Dog School in Rochester, MI. Larry Yachcik is the chairman of the Lowell Lions Club White Cane Week activities.

"With more than 33,000 blind persons in the state, it is imperative that all drivers know the White Cane law," said Young.

"Many people think the Lions hit the street corners once a year to raise funds for our projects. Actually, that's only a part of it. We're out there where people can see us to educate the people in the White Cane law as well," he explained.

A year ago, Governor James Blanchard signed into law an amendment to the original White Cane legislation of 1936. In addition to requiring motorists to stop for a person carrying a White Cane or being led by a guide dog in harness, the law also defines blindness, provides for mandatory punishment of offenders and requires knowledge of the law through driver education courses and driver licensing examinations.

"Countless lives have been saved in the years since the original law was passed. Michigan, by the way, was the first state to enact such legislation," said



Twenty-one year old Shelley Smith of Richmond, MI, has been named the 1987 Michigan Lions White Cane Queen. She will represent more than 25,000 Lions in the state during the annual White Cane Week drive, April 24 to May 3. Shelley and her Leader Dog Lady will make personal appearances throughout the state to help raise funds for the many Lions projects and institutions that help the blind.

"Our goal of \$1.5 million will enable us to purchase White Canes, Braille watches, eyeglasses, examinations and various other aids for the unsighted. We strive to help the blind help themselves. We can't continue our

work without the generous people of Michigan. It's as simple as that," Young explained. In addition to the White Cane

been thought that temperature elevations were bad or something to be feared. However, it is currently felt that a fever is a natural defense against infection or disease. In most situations, a fever can be allowed to run its course. That doesn't mean that you should never treat a fever or that you are doing something wrong by treating it. Most fevers are due to viral infections which will resolve has destroyed the infection organism.

A normal temperature in the adult is 98.6 degrees orally. This may fluctuate during the day and is usually lowest in the morning averaging 97 degrees. Younger children can fluctuate from 97 to 100 degrees. Children also seem to have a wider fluctuation in temperature during illness with elevation to 104-105 degrees or higher. Fever assists in the body's natural defense mechanism and makes the body in-hospitable to many infectious agents. As stated earlier, fever may be a help in fighting disease but you shouldn't

A fever is a sympton of an illness, not a disease itself. Usually, the fever is harmless but you will want to consult your doctor to determine the cause of the fever. In young children, high fevers (usually over 104 degrees) can occasionally cause convulsions. This can be quite frightening but usually causes no lasting harm. After age six the risk of convulsions usually decreases.

accurately. The most common fever relieving medications are aspirin and acetaminophen (Tylenol®, Tempra®, Panadol®, etc.). The medication used is often underdosed; not enough medication is given for the child's weight. This is why we always recommend that a dosage chart be kept in the medicine cabinet so the amount given can be increased as your child grows. In children we would recommend acetaminophen rather than aspirin because of a possible association with Reye's Syndrome and aspirin. If medication fails to bring the temperature down to an acceptable level (103 degrees or so), a tepid sponge bath may be tried. Place the child in luke warm water, gently sponge the child and allow the water to evaporate from the body. This is generally effective within 20-30 minutes. Remember, that a high fever is treating a symptom. You

We frequently receive calls from worried parents wondering what should be done about a child's fever. Traditionally, it has over a couple of days after the body's natural defense mechanism

be afraid to treat one if it makes you uncomfortable.

You should definitely notify your doctor if a convulsion occurs with any fever. Prolonged fever in very young children can also lead to dehydration. Prevention of dehydration is accomplished by having the child take clear liquids every few hours. You should observe the child to make sure that he is urinating and that his mucous membranes (inner mouth) are moist.

When treating a fever be sure and follow package directions and your doctor should still pursue the underlying cause.


