Alcohol suspected in two car crash Tuesday

A two car crash on M-21 at One witness told the driver of the other vehicle that there was an open whiskey bottle on the seat of Mercer's pickup truck.



on M-66. Mercer was given a breath alcohol analysis and taken to the Kent County Jail.

The driver of the other vehicle, Rick Fisher, 33, of 9672 Bailey Dr., Lowell, was eastbound, heading for Saranac. Fisher said Mercer crossed the centerline and was headed right at him. Fisher said he swerved to avoid the oncoming truck, but Mercer collided with the rear side of Fisher's pickup. Fisher and his nine-year-old daughter were treated at the scene for minor cuts and bruises. Mercer was not injured.

Lowell Police, Fire and Rescue units responded to the busy accident site snarled by heavy after work traffic. The accident took place at about 4:00 p.m. on

CHILD CARE PROPOSED BY YMCA

The Lowell YMCA is in the process of obtaining a license for child care services for a before and after school center.

Y-Director Jim Hodges reports that this pilot program would be to initially serve children at Bushnell Elementary School in grades I thru 5. Alto and Runciman schools could be added in the future when suitable locations and qualified supervisors can be hired. The Y's program committee has adopted the name "Y-Care Club" as the name for this program that is sometimes referred to as

"latch-key". The National YMCA has produced a program guide for such centers which will be an important resource for our centers, says Hodges. While it is a bit early to announce all of the details about the YMCA's Care Club Program, interested parents of Bushnell School children can call the YMCA to be placed on the contact list. The Y hopes to start the Y-Care Club in early fall.



ALLERGY III - ALLERGIES AFFECTING THE SKIN

Today we are going to discuss allergies that affect the skin in our continuing series on allergy.

Allergies are thought to play a role in four major skin disorders; contact dermatitis, eczema, hives and drug reactions. All of these skin conditions can be difficult to diagnose and treat until the offending agent is discovered and avoided.

Contact dermatitis is due to direct contact with an allergen and the skin. A prime example of this reaction is the typical rash of poison ivy. Contact with the allergen causes a reaction in the skin which leads to swelling, redness, blister formation and itching. Besides poison ivy, contact dermatitis can be caused by metals in jewelry, cosmetics, chemicals, rubber in shoes and antibiotic ointments. Treatment is directed at avoiding the offending agent. Topical steroids and oral antihistamines are used once the rash has developed.

Eczema is a very common skin rash seen in allergic individuals. Controversy exists as to whether eczema is truly due to allergy. In some cases exposure to certain foods can lead to a flare of the eczema, however the rash of eczema may wax and wane without any close exposure to allergens. Children and infants who have had eczema will often develop allergic rhinitis or asthma in later years. Children are usually affected on the creases of the arms and legs. There is usually marked itching associated with the rash. The skin becomes reddened and bumpy. Scratching leads to chronic thickening and scabbing. Furthur scratching leads to bleeding and secondary infection. Treatment of this skin condition can be difficult. Scratching must be stopped to allow healing. Potent topical steroids are often prescribed.

Almost everyone is familiar with hives, another allergic skin condition. In over 50% of cases no specific cause for hives is found. These appear as red bumps that vary in size anywhere on the body. Common affecting agents leading to hives are foods fish, chocolate, strawberries, antibiotics and aspirin. The rash can last for less than an hour to several days. Treatment consists of oral antihistamines like Benadryl® and in more severe cases systemic steroids are prescribed.

Drugs can affect the skin in many ways. The most common reaction is hives, as discussed above. However, the rash of drug allergy may appear as fine red dots over the entire skin surface, generalized swelling or even purple splotches due to bleeding within the skin. Actually, rashes due to drugs can appear in several different ways and the diagnosis is only made after careful review of recently ingested medication. The obvious treatment of this allergy is avoidance.
