Heckar updates Board on district's enrollment report

Stanley Heckar, a retired employee at Stanfred Associates, provided the Lowell Board of Education with a preliminary report of the district's enrollment projections.

Statistical data, which is based on what history has shown, foretells of growth over the next 3-5 years in grades Kindergarten through fifth and grades six through eight.

The same statistics show the high school grades leveling off with growth starting back up in 1992-93.

"It's important to realize that because a school system's middle school can hold an increase, that doesn't mean there will be enough room at the high school level," Heckar said. "This is due in part because of the room needed for special education, specialty computers courses."

Of all the births in Kent County, 3.23 percent attend Lowell schools. Heckar adds that in the last three years there have been more children migrating in than going out of Lowell schools. "There are 108 more students this year than last year,"

Heckar adds, "The question is, will the growth of the future be average, steady, or high?"

The birth residence of mothers was at a high in 1960 and bottomed out in 1974, but since that time it has been going up, according to Heckler.

Heckar said the first step in projecting, is looking at what the statistical data shows, the next step is talking to bankers, developers and realtors and getting an insight as to what will be happening with them.

Stanfred Associates will be spending the next couple months weeks gathering that information for the Lowell School Board.

A group of concerned Lowell parents attended the April board meeting to express their concern over the resolution (one which the board passed after the discussion) to include all kindergartners from Eastgate subdivision into the Alto Elementary boundary lines beginning with the 1988-89 school year.

"This is being done to help create space for a special education classroom, which the school must provide," Lowell Superintendent Fritz Esch said. "Also to help relieve the overcrowding that has surfaced again at Runciman. With the difficult financial decisions ahead, we're trying to





RAYNAUD'S PHENOMENON - COLD FINGERS

Raynaud's phenomenon is a condition due to excessive spasm of arteries in the digits. Upon exposure to cold temperatures or emotional stress, one or more fingers will turn pale or blue and become quite painful or numb. Normal color and sensation returns after the hands are warmed. This condition is usually seen in women and usually effects the hands. Occasionally the toes, nose or ears may be involved.

When you are exposed to cold temperatures, your body has to conserve heat by slowing blood flow to exposed areas through constriction of the blood vessels. In Raynaud's phenomenon, the normal response of the fingers to cold is greatly exaggerated, leading to the aforementioned symptoms.

Other conditions are associated with Raynaud's phenomenon in some cases. Smoking can worsen symptoms because it causes narrowing of the small arteries. Narrowing of the arteries caused by atherosclerosis (generalized narrowing due to build up of placques along the lumen) can contribute to this condition. Connective tissue disorders such as arthritis and lupus have also been associated with Raynauds. Certain medications such as those used in migraines or heart conditions may precipitate attacks. Finally, frostbite or repetitive use of vibrating tools can damage small blood vessels and nerves, predisposing one to Raynaud's symptoms.

Diagnosis is usually made by history alone. Your doctor may perform some lab tests to rule out associated conditions which may be contributing to the problem.

Treatment is usually aimed toward prevention of attacks. Quit smoking! Avoid drugs that can cause narrowing of blood vessels such as birth control pills, migraine headache medications and certain heart medications. Avoid exposure to cold - some simple techniques are listed below:

- Wash vegetables in tepid water

- Use mittens or potholders when removing food from the freezer - Keep an extra pair of mittens at the door for use when going to the mailbox, etc.

- Let the car warm up prior to driving in cold weather

- Wear layered, lightweight clothing during winter months In severe cases medication can be prescribed that will prevent severe vasospasms. This is usually only taken in the winter months unless symptoms last longer.

"Each year accidents occur the string and cause injury. when youngsters forget about from overhead electric lines and to retrieve a tangled kite," says



"You must find public reasons for private convictions." -- so says Sheridan Baker in his book, The Complete Stylist And Handbook. It almost sounds like it might come from a manual on religious insights. It doesn't. It is a manual on writing. I use it to help me write those special kind of papers that professors are always asking for. The kind I don't know how to write. The simple ones, that often turn out to be so hard and demanding.

The above quote ended up in one of my journals today. I thought of the classes that I just finished teaching at Sparta High School during Campus Day, April 5. Campus Day is sponsored every year during spring break by the Kent County Extension Office. It is an 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. celebration of talents and encouragements and inspiration. There were over 100 sessions to choose from.

When I got the invitation to speak again this year, on journal writing, I felt I was just too busy. I threw it in the wastebasket. Two days later, I picked it out, signed for two classes to teach, and mailed it. A couple of months later, I knew I was too busy and called to cancel out. It couldn't be done. The brochures were printed and sent out. So be it.

I am so happy that I didn't cancel out. I felt like doing a pirouette and dancing across the room (emotional, right?). I met the most wonderful, loving people. They are the reasons for my private convictions. My conviction that we need to take time to find out who we are, where we are going, what we are to do with our life, and ever so many questions we may have.

If we don't ask questions, life gets very boring and depressing. There are answers out there, even though at times some of them seem to be "On Hold". That's why I enthusiastically encourage men and women to keep a journal. Take time (and it really can be found) to become friends with yourself, and listen to what is going on around you. I know journal writing is not for everyone. But by all means, find what it is that makes you a better communicator with life.

This time, what I thought was a mistake turned out to be a blessing - to myself and I believe, to others. I wish as much for you in the days to come --- blessings!





AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 6.10 OF ARTICLE VI OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF LOWELL.

THE CITY OF LOWELL ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Section 6.10 of Article VI of the Zoning Ordinance of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 6.10. Illumination of Parking Areas. Parking areas shall be illuminated in accordance with the standards set forth by the Illuminating Engineering Society of North America in the "Recommended Maintained Horizontal Illuminance for Parking Facilities" Section of the most recent edition of the IES Lighting Handbook as such section may be amended and revised from time to time. For the purposes of determining appropriate lighting levels for open parking areas, there is established three (3) levels of activity in accordance with such standards: high activity, medium activity, and low activity. Open parking areas shall be classified in one of the three levels by the Planning Commission at the time of site plan review and the developer or owner shall comply with the applicable standards of such level of activity.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after its publication in the Lowell Ledger, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Lowell. YEAS: Councilmembers: Doyle, Thompson, Collins, and Maatman.

Elderly eye care program

Eyesight lost through some diseases can be preserved and possibly restored at any age -just ask the more than 200,000 elderly citizens nationwide who have dialed 1-800-222-EYES By calling this toll-free

Helpline number, eligible Michigan callers receive a referral to a local eye physician and surgeon (opthalmologist) who has volunteered to provide needed medical eye care through the National Eye Care Project. The ongoing public service program is designed to bring medical eye care and information to the nation's disadvantaged elderly.

Program sponsors -- the Foundation of the American Academy of Ophthalmology and state ophthalmology societies -aren't stopping at 200,000 callers, according to Frederick W. Bryant, MD, president of the Michigan Ophthalmological So-

Older Americans suffer more than half of the blinding eye diseases that are diagnosed in the U.S. each year -- a statistic ophthalmologists are determined

to change through the project. "Ophthalmologists estimate that about half of elderly blind ness can be prevented by early diagnosis and treatment," said-Bryant. "The National Eye Cares Project has certainly contributed to this effort by providing medical information and removing financial obstacles that may discourage elderly people from seeking much needed care."

Since the project began in May 1986, 5598 Michigan residents have called the Helpline. and 3,695 have been referred for a comprehensive medical eye exam and treatment for potentially blinding eye diseases. Thus have treated 1,104 cases of cataracts, 109 cases of glaucoma, 45 cases of diabetic retinopathy, and 234 cases of macular degeneration. All of

To be eligible for project services, a caller must be age 65 or older, a U.S. citizen, and no onger have access to an ophthalmologist he or she has seen in

Services provided by the volunteer ophthalmologist are offered at no out-of-pocket cost to the patient. For this project, volunteer ophthalmologists are accepting Medicare and/or health nsurance assignment as payment in full for their services. If the patient lacks insurance coverage, medical eye care is provided without charge.

Hospital charges, prescription drugs and eyeglasses are not covered by the program.

The National Eye Care Project is open weekdays, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. (Pacific time). The Helpline number is 1-800-222-EYES. (3937).

Area youths trek Venus at Veen Observatory

It's Friday night, and six to seven Veen Observatory members of the junior section have gathered with the observatory director Dave DeBruyn, on an early spring evening, to zero in on a view of Venus.

"It should look like a half moon tonight," said junior fouryear member Greg Collins.

The scope used to bring the half-moon shaped Venus into focus will be the Jeffery Borr 12.5 telescope reflector.

There are approximately 60 junior Veen Observatory members, "The junior section is the healthiest its been in a long time," DeBruyn said. "It's great to see the enjoyment the boys get from the observatory and the enthusiasm they show."

Junior member, Ken Clarke, says his interest was first tapped about the time Haley's Comet came along.

"I first became interested through the Grand Rapids Public Museum," Lowell resident Scott Maloley said.

Of the six members present

this evening, Maloley is the only one from Lowell.

"Collins is from Grand Rapids, Mike Johnson is from Grandville, and we have a boy that travels from Hudsonville," DeBruyn said.

The group may have focused its attention on Venus (Friday, April 11) however, this coming year Mars will grab most of its planet scoping observances. This fall Mars is scheduled to be as close to the earth as it has been since 1971," DeBruyn said. "We will be trekking and charting its movement."

Right now, members spend time trekking galaxies. "In the summer we focus on planets and star clusters," Collins said. "In the fall we're looking for nebulae and in the winter season it's nebulae and dust clouds."

DeBruyn has been the director at the Roger B. Chaffee Planetarium for over 20 years. He has been involved with the Veen Observatory since its fostering in 1965. "Jim Marron leased his property for the construction," he said.

DeBruyn also heads up its adult section, which has approximately 125 members.

"One of the biggest misconceptions people have, is they think they have to know something about astronomy to be a member," treasurer, Ron Vander-Werff said. "You need not know a thing. People may join to learn."

He continues, "Some firsttimers come in and are intimidated by the equipment on the Borr telescope, but in time a person learns the purpose of all the year old facility.

DeBruyn adds that he believes Lowell has one of the best equipped amateur observatories in the country. "It was built in 1965 by members of the Grand Rapids Public Museum," DeBruyn said. "The only other one in the area is the Muskegon Astronomical Society."

The outside telescope, the 17.5 inch Dobsonian, is used for galaxy, nebula and deep sky observations.
