# Drought of '88 dries up fields

Although it is still too early to say, Kent County along with other counties in the state are expected to be given disaster status unless rain rescues farmers from their continuing struggle with the drought of 1988.

"It is too early to tell yet," Ellen Moore, vice president of the Kent County Farm Bureau, said. "Farmers in the government program however have been able to use acres set aside for haying and grazing."


"If nothing changes, it is quite possible Kent County will be given disaster status," said ASCS county executive director Dave Vain.

Without any significant amount of rain within the next two weeks, very little, and in some cases nothing, will be salvageable.

Marsha Wilcox, information director for the Kent County Farm Bureau and also a dairy farmer, says that small grains (wheat, oats, barley) have been diminished. "There isn't enough moisture to fill their heads, thus the yield will be down."

According to Wilcox, the first cutting hay/afalfa was not bad, but the second cutting will be about 25 percent of its normal cutting. "Provided there is rain, there maybe a third and fourth cutting," she said.

All agree that corn still could

provide a normal yield if there is rain within the next couple weeks.

Fred Klahn, a lifetime farmer who works 2,000 acres adds, "the next couple weeks will be critical. Some of the alfalfa fields can still come back with some rain."

Klahn is skeptical about new seedings. He adds that in the past the seed of the alfalfa plant lays out there, so if there was rain during July 4 some alfalfa would

still grow.

According to Wilcox, soybean is not yet critical, but cannot withstand the dry weather much

Because most pesticides release active ingredients upon contact with moisture, pesticides have had little opportunity to work, leaving weeds to double the trouble farmers have with dry conditions. "To respray would

#### A FEW THOUGHTS ON HYPERTENSION

Hypertension is one of the most common chronic medical disorders, affecting at least 60 million people in the U.S. alone! Often termed "the silent killer," high blood pressure is a major risk factor for heart attack, stroke and kidney damage. Hypertension usually causes no symptoms until it has caused organ damage and most patients are not aware that there is anything wrong when the disease is first detected. This is why hypertension is sometimes difficult to treat. Even with massive detection and control programs for high blood pressure that have been available for several years, at least 2/3 of hypertensive patients are not aware that they have high blood pressure or are not adequately controlled!

Extensive evidence has proved that treatment of hypertension significantly reduces risk. However, to achieve this therapeutic benefit the patient must comply with his/her anti-hypertensive regimen. From 20-50% of hypertensive patients stop taking their blood pressure medication for various reasons - most of the time because of undesirable side effects. Of those that continue to take medication, less than half adhere to the program sufficiently to maintain satisfactory control of their blood pressure.

For hypertension management to be fully successful, it requires a true partnership between the patient and physician. Appropriate communications must be maintained between the parties regarding medication dosages, side effects, costs and goals. This relationship must be flexible so that treatment goals are realistic for the indi-

Besides medication, several other non-pharmacologic means are available to achieve blood pressure control. Obesity is very common in hypertensive patients and weight loss alone can reduce pressures to acceptable levels in some individuals. Moderate salt restriction will also reduce blood pressure. Regular aerobic exercise and stress management techniques have also been helpful in lowering blood pressure.

What we are trying to say is that the patient and physician have an ongoing relationship in the management of hypertension. The plan for treatment of hypertension must be acceptable to the patient in order that the maximum benefit is achieved. Any plan should be able to be refined or changed as the need arises, whether this is through use of a medication or other non pharmacologic methods.



# CITY COUNCIL CITY OF LOWELL KENT COUNTY, MI

Councilmember Fonger, supported by Councilmember Collins, moved the adoption of the following ordinance:

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 88-13**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 25 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF LOWELL, "WATERS, SEWERS AND SEWAGE DIS-POSAL," BY ADDING SECTION 25-111, AMENDING SECTIONS 25-107, 25-109 AND 25-113 AND REPE-ALING SECTION 25-112

#### THE CITY OF LOWELL ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Section 25-107 of Article IV. Chapter 25 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell, entitled "Charges for Shutting Off, Turning On Water," is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 25-107. Charges for Shutting Off and Turning On Water. The City may from time to time by resolution of the City Council establish charges for shutting off and turning on the supply of water to premises.

Section 2. That Section 25-109 of Article IV, Chapter 25 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### Sec. 25-109. Water Service Charges.

(a.) Water service charges including any late payment penalties, interest or charges shall be established from time to time by resolution of the City Council. The water service charges shall be based upon the water usage of the user. The user charge and the debt service charge, i.e., readiness-to-serve charge, shall be specified separately. No free service shall be furnished by the water system to the City or any person, public or private, or to any public agency or instrumentality. The City shall pay for water service supplied to it or any of its departments or agencies at the rates established pursuant to this Section from time to time.

(b.) If there is evidence of a malfunctioning water meter, the City Manager shall have the authority to estimate the quantity of water at which the billing is made until such time as the malfunctioning meter is repaired and replaced. The estimate of usage shall be based on previous months of similar usage.

(c.) Rates and charges established hereunder shall be reviewed annually by the City Council and adjusted as needed to provide needed revenues to cover the water system's costs and expenses.

(d.) All users shall be notified at least annually of the amount of the user charge and the amount of the debt service charges, i.e., readiness-to-serve charges.

Section 3. That Section 25-110 of Article IV. Chapter 25, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell, entitled "Delinquent Water Service Charges to Constitute Lien; Discontinuance of Service for Nonpayment of Charges" is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

#### Sec. 25-110. Billing and Enforcement.

(a.) Lien. Water service charges, including any late payment penalties, interest and charges, shall constitute a lien on all premises served which lien shall become effective immediately upon provision of water system service to the premises. Whenever such charges are delinquent and remain unpaid, the charges shall be entered on the next ad valorem property tax roll for the property served and collected in the same manner as ad valorem property taxes. The City Treasurer shall, on or before March 1 of each year, turn such delinquent and unpaid charges over to the County Treasurer in the same fashion as delinquent unpaid ad valorem property taxes. Provided, however, such charges shall not be a lien on the property served if the owner of that property has leased the property, the owner is not according to a lease provision liable for such water service charges, the City is so notified in a writing signed by both the owner and lessee and proof of such lease is provided the City as required by applicable law. Where the owner is not responsible for such charges, the lessee shall, before the commencement of water services to the premises, cause to be deposited with the City Treasurer an amount equal to an estimated three (3) months' water service charges and shall cause such deposit to be continued at that level throughout the lease term. The City shall apply the funds in that deposit against any and all delinquent charges of the

(b.) Discontinuance. The City shall have the right to shut off and discontinue the supply of water to any premises for the nonpayment of water service charges and rates when due. If water rates and charges for service furnished to the premises are not paid within twenty (20) days after the due date thereof, water service to such premises will be shut off and discontinued and will not be restored until all such charges and penalties have been paid and a deposit equal to that provided in such subsection (a) has been paid.

(c.) Other Remedies. The remedies provided in this Section shall be cumulative of any and all other remedies under state law, common law, and these codified ordinances.

(d.) Billings. The City will bill users periodically as provided by resolution of the City Council.

(e.) Hearing. The City Manager may send to a user who has not paid water service charges within twenty (20) days of the date due a notice that, at the user's request, a hearing will be scheduled with the City Manager to show cause why the user's billing is incorrect. If the City is considering discontinuing the user's water service, such a notice shall be sent giving the user an opportunity to request a hearing with the City Manager to show cause why such service should not be discontinued. Such hearing shall be informal, and the decision of the City Manager shall be final.

Section 4. That the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell is hereby amended by adding a new Section to be numbered Article IV, Chapter 25, Section 25-111, which Section 25-111 shall read as follows:

Sec. 25-111. Audit. The water system shall be audited annually as a part of the annual City audit.

Section 5. That Section 25-112 of Article IV, Chapter 25 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell. entitled "Collection and Payment of Water Rents Generally," is hereby repealed.

Section 6. That Section 25-113 of Article IV, Chapter 25 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 25-113. Penalty. Any person who shall violate any provision of this Article or any rule or regulation adopted hereunder upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500) or imprisonment not to exceed ninety (90) days, or both in the discretion of the court. Each day's failure to comply with any such provision or rule or regulation shall constitute a separate violation.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after publication in the Lowell Ledger, a newspaper of general circulation in the City. YEAS: Councilmembers Fonger, Collins, and Mayor



# Limit your exercise during hot weather

The balmy days of summer encourage us to start an exercise program, or to stay on a program already started. But when the weather turns hot and humid, even athletes at the peak of condition should take precautions.

That's when heat stroke or heat exhaustion -- a medical condition called hyperthermia -- can strike, regardless of age or physical condition, warns Dr. Larry J. Sell, senior vice president for Health Care Affairs at Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Michi-

Here are tips Dr. Sell suggests you follow when exercising during heat spells:

\*Exercise during the morning or evening hours

\*Wear a hat because as much as 30 percent of body heat is absorbed through the head. Cotton clothing is best because it absorbs water and helps cool the body. Loose clothing lets air flow through

\*Before exercising, drink at least a pint of water even if you're not thirsty. Drink more as you exercise. Cold water is easier to drink and helps bring body temperature down.

During hot weather, sweat glands secrete moisture that evaporates from the skin and cools it. Most people can maintain normal temperature in the face of very hot external temper-

But sometimes the regulatory system of the body simply doesn't work and body temperature rises out of control, causing hyperthermia. When body temperature rises to 105 degrees, a true medical emergency exists, and immediate professional medical attention is required.

These are warning symptoms of hyperthermia to look for, according to Dr. Sell:

\*Hot, dry, flushed skin, but no sweating

\*Agitation, confusion, seizures \*Faintness, dizziness,

lethargy or coma

\*Headache, nausea

\*Rapid pulse and heartbeat

\*Slow deep breathing if the victim is still, rapid, shallow breathing if the victim is moving about

If any of these symptoms appear, a doctor should be called immediately since not all victims will have all the symptoms.

Those who haven't been exercising regularly shouldn't start on hot, humid days, says Dr. Sell. Even those with a good training base should proceed slowly during a heat wave or when the weather suddenly goes from warm to hot.

Seniors, and those with chronic diseases, particularly heart ailments, or persons on drugs that reduce the ability to sweat, such as diuretics, should not exercise when it's very hot.

Pay attention to body signs during hot, humid weather, suggests Dr. Sell. When you experience discomfort, stop. Otherwise, regular exercise in the summer, done moderatley, can contribute to physical and emotional good health.
