Sharing Power

School improvement process involves people within building

Years ago it was the principal who had the college education and determined the focus of educational attention. As time has evolved though, teachers, too, bring college degrees with them to the classroom, and not just high school diplomas.

While some principals and administrators may cringe at the thought of sharing power, sharing responsibility and sharing success, Lowell Superintendent Fritz Esch and Lowell Principal Dick Korb do not. They welcome it. "Lasting and meaningful changes in our society have never come about as a result of being passed down from the top," Korb said. "All successful movements in any organization port. It comes from those people who are closest to the action, the staff, administrators and students of the school setting."

With this thought in mind, the Lowell Board of Education

pledged its support for a school improvement process involving the people working within a given school at the February school board meeting.

"Outside of the Strategic Planning Committee there currently exists no formal method within the structure of the Lowell Area Schools which would assure an on-going process for school improvement," Esch said "The school improvement process

gives us a method." Korb said the process to improve teaching and learning for students started two years ago. "The Kent Intermediate School District has an improvement program in which individuals are trained to work with school dishave come about as a result of a tricts. Korb believes such a process allows ownership into a problem and ownership into the success providing improvements. "Principals need input. I have talented people working with me, who have many abilities. Why not tap

them?"

Esch said that the Lowell Board of Education realizes that the enthusiasm for school improvement will be different in each school, due to each school's individual personality, and that involvement may not be of interest at this time. "The board endorses the creation of building which shows them how to come based school improvement plans," he says.

> For an improvement process of this sort to work there must be a commitment from the Board of Education and central admin-

istration must encourage school improvement; a building level commitment to the school improvement process; a common language for participants; a place to meet for participants; and a time to meet for participants. With these points in place, then individual schools are able to focus on strengthening lags or soft spots, and things counterproductive to student education by using and relying on resources available.

"This is building based decision making," Alto Elementary School Principal, Jim White said. "It takes research on effective schools and helps us to formulate plans to improve our weaknesses. This is a process, not an event."

White added that in previous years areas were not looked into unless an individual came forward with an idea or need. "Over the years I've sent out a parent

School nears computer program goal

Lowell's school system has been collecting cash-register receipts from Food City Stores since last October. Ginny Webber, school media specialist and coordinator of Lowell's computer program reported that the school has collected \$92,000 in receipts leaving it a little shy of the \$120,000 neccessary for the purchase of the Apple II C computer.


"We've been pleased with the response thus far," Webber said. "The school will continue to collect receipts through May. I'm hopeful that through this Food City program the school can collect enough receipts for a computer and a printer (\$60,000)."

The Food City computer program gives schools an opportunity to acquire any of five different Apple Computer Systems free, plus educational software for classroooms through receipt collecting.

"Schools are collecting register receiptes from Food City and turning them in to the schools and/or store. Food City then gives the school a small portion of every dollar total on those tapes and buys the computers the school needs.

"It's important to note that people may now drop off their receipts at Food City," Webber says. "Apple Computers are ex-



cozy corner

Kyle Elliot Sprague was born I had a couple of spare hours yesterday afternoon, so I did something I've been meaning to do for a long time. A few years ago the Look Memorial Fund financed the microfilming of the old bound copies of The Lowell Ledger and Lowell Journal. These Parents are Dewey and Debra issues date back to the 1870's in the case of the Journal, and to rents are Donna Atkins of the founding of the Ledger in 1893. I had pawed through those Saranac, and Stanley and Toni old copies many times, and to my dismay, I found that the bound issues of the Ledger's first year were in pretty sorry shape. In fact, the binding was missing its cover, and the very first edition was of Tavares, FL, and Andrew and gone. The feeling was like going through your kid's baby book, and finding that the first baby picture is missing. When organizing these old issues for microfilming, I was delighted to find that very first edition, tattered, brittle and torn as it was, among some mis-

Since my lucky find, I have been meaning to have the edition professionally framed, both to preserve it, and to offer it for public display in our offices. That's how I blew off a couple of hours yesterday. The framing should be done in a couple of weeks, and you are welcome to stop by for a look. That is, if you are interested

I got a kick out of reading through the edition before taking it to the frame shop. The format and style are considerably different from today. Two columns of advertisements appear on the left side of the front page. Obituaries were very flowery and melodramatic in those days, and were most often front page news. One appeared on the front of that July 1, 1893 Ledger. The obituary stated that the deceased was the father of 12 children, "ten of whom are still living". Social news was also front page fodder. The social column mentioned who was visiting here from Grand Rapids, and who was visiting in Grand Rapids. It made special mention of someone who had travelled all the way from Muskegon. Imagine that.

A buggy accident also made the news. It seems a Greenville woman, along with an unattached back seat, tumbled from the rear of a buggy when the horse bolted. Reportedly the horse was frightened by a boy on a bicycle. The story was summed up with. "the event created considerable commotion along Bridge Street"

Another article was headlined, "Fatal Accident". It told of a fellow, "now living and working in Grand Rapids, but late of this place", who had fallen down an elevator shaft at work. The article went into grisly detail of how his skull was crushed above his right eye and pieces of bone had been driven into his brain. But, the most incredible part of the article was that the poor guy wasn't dead yet, and the newspaper had written him off. The last sentence in the article stated that guy wasn't likely to recover, and death was expected within hours. Can you imagine the lawsuit if a newspaper did that today . . . and the guy lived?

I had the front page framed, as well as an inside page containing a salutary message from the founding publisher, F.M. Johnson. In his comments, Johnson aligned himself politically with Grover Cleveland and threw down the gauntlet to the rival Lowell Journal. From what I have gathered, Johnson was a fiesty little guy who liked to keep things stirred up. Story has it he kept a baseball bat next to his desk just in case someone with opposing views should pay him a visit. I don't know if he ever had to use it.

By the way, the title for my weekly column originated with old Mr. Johnson. The Ledger used to be located where the Moose is Lodge is now. The building had glass windows on either side of an inset doorway. Johnson's office was in one of these windows (so as to keep an eye on the town), and he called it his "cozy corner". Consequently, he titled his weekly views "The Cozy Corner". Lacking a better idea, or imagination of my own, I picked up the title, even though my columns are exactly 180 degrees from the fiery editorials Johnson wrote. Guess I just wasn't cut out to keep a ball bat next to my desk.

Well, the old Ledger has been around for nearly 100 years now. It survived forty years of competition with the Journal. It struggled through the great depression with a blind editor and publisher. It writhed through a collapsed sale and subsequent attacks from the I.R.S. in the early 1970's. It suffered through 30 some years of competition with the Lowell Buyers Guide. And, probably it's toughest test of all, it has weathered 13 years with a know-nothing

Maybe this bit of background gives you some idea as to why was so tickled to discover that very first front page, and why I'm spending a small fortune to have it framed. I guess I'm just proud to be part of a business that has been so much a part of Lowell's history. I hope I'm still here four years from now to see the old rag through its centennial edition.

P.S. If you're looking for something to do on a dreary winter day. and sick of the soaps, stop by the Lowell Library, and browse through the microfilm copies of those old Ledgers and Journals. I guarantee you'll get a kick out of it.

1989 assessments may be appealed directly to the assessor prior to March 7, 1989 by calling 676-0777 for an appointment. On March 7, the control of the roll is transferred to the Board of Review. Your rights to appeal to the Board of Review are not waived by appeals to the assessor.
