Prices range from \$7.50 to \$11.50 for a quantity of 25 tree seedlings. Quantities of more than 500 of the same species are cheaper per seedling.

## Fun Street

### Area residents await city/county agreement so improvements to Fun Street may begin

Each year 25 percent of the revenues collected from gas and weight tax for road maintenance and improvements are used toward local roads, while 75 percent of the revenues are used toward primary roads.

That local road percentage totals roughly five million dollars. The Kent County Road Commission is responsible for 1,900 miles of primary and local roads - it covers a circumference of 24 miles wide and 30 miles long.

"I think with the revenues given to us to work with, the Road Commission does an excellent job," Kent County Road Commission Director Jim Porritt said. "Many people believe that the money used for roads comes from their property tax. It does not. It comes from weight and gas taxes."

Porritt's job keeps getting harder and harder as the cars become more efficient. "With the efficiency of today's cars, our road revenues decline." While this year's revenue is still higher than last year, Porritt added it does keep pace with inflation.

That may explain why some local streets never see any of those monies. Case in point - the residents of Fun Street have attended nearly a handful of City Council meetings within the last couple of years, inquiring as to when they can expect Fun Street improvements. First, they were told by the county to check with the City of Lowell and then Lowell told them to check with the county. Since that little game of pass-the-buck, Fun Street resi-

dents have learned they must wait for an agreement between the county and Lowell to share the cost of improvements.


When can this agreement be expected? "I don't know," says Porritt. "It could happen within the next year, but I'm not sure," says Lowell City Manager David Pasquale. "If it does come about, we are looking at widening and graveling Fun Street."

Kent County has standards and specifications for various roads to meet. "The standards vary according to the type of road," Porritt says. He adds that few existing roads meet the standards set. "Many of the roads were started back in the days of wagons and trains."

In the meantime, the City of Lowell has started improvement and maintenance work on Jefferson from North to Fremont. The work includes removing existing asphalt and replacing it with a two-inch thick surface. Work is also being done on Monroe from Main St. to Fremont. It will be Roto-tilled and then an asphalt surface will be put down.

Church Street, west of town, will be pulverized and then asphalted.

Lowell road revenues budgeted for 1989-90 reached \$105,665. The city's proposed fund balance started the year at \$330,390. Its ending balance is \$174,480. Pasquale said the estimated revenue coming from weight and gas tax this year is \$44,200. He adds that approximately \$21,000 is proposed to be transferred from major to

local street repair funds.

How is it decided what streets

get attention every year? "We have a priority list," Pasquale says. He says roads proposed for work in 1990-91 are Lafayette and Avery from Main Street to

Monroe. Until then, Fun Street residents wait, possibly wishing they would have looked beyond seclusion when deciding where to build a home.





A new state law will protect egg consumers from false size and freshness claims.


**25 YEARS AGO IN THE LEDGER - SEPT. 3, 1964**

REVACCINATION FOR MEASLES

We have had several questions recently from patients asking whether they or their children should be revaccinated for measles prevention. Apparently, a local news program noted that measles outbreaks are on the rise and this has prompted the calls.

In the first half of this year over 7,000 cases of measles have been reported nationwide but only two cases have been reported in Kent county. Several of the cases have occurred in college-age students and others who have been previously vaccinated.


Measles is an infection caused by a virus. A fever is usually present and is followed by cold symptoms-sore throat, runny nose, generalized fatigue. One to four days later a rash will appear, starting on the face and working down. Most healthy individuals tolerate the disease without complications but a few may develop ear infection, pneumonia or encephalitis.

Most of the recent outbreaks have occurred in children greater than ten years old. Very few cases have been reported in younger children or in adults.

The current vaccine that is given to all children at 15 months is a purified weakened virus extract that provides life-long immunity to 90-98% of recipients. It is currently believed that those born before 1956 have had measles and are immune to another outbreak.

In children vaccinated before age 15 months there may be a greater susceptibility to infection. There may also be a slightly higher risk of infections in those immunized prior to 1980.

The risks and side effects of revaccination are minimal so the current recommendations are to offer revaccination to children older than 10 years, college students or others who work or live in institutions that are at high risk for exposure. The Kent County Department of Public Health currently has no official recommendations and has left this up to the discretion of the physician and patient.



Inmates who fashion everyday items into dangerous weapons will have less material to work with under a law recently signed by the governor.

Public Act 168 (Senate Bill 15), which I supported, limits the amount of property a high-security inmate can possess. It also clears the way for the state to implement its program to crack down on violent prisoners.

Inmates are now limited to property that fits into both a duffel bag and footlocker. When the new law takes effect in late September, about 6,000 prisoners in the two highest security levels and some in the third level will be able to have only enough to fill either a duffel bag or footlocker.

Prisoners will have to dispose of any additional items. Department of Corrections officials say the law offers incentives for inmates to behave and get into the state's three lowest security levels. It also brings punishment for those who don't cooperate.

LISTENING TO EXPECT

It fell off the top of the library shelf in my study. I picked it up and smiled in recognition. It is a little book, but big on changing a person's life.

I was introduced to it almost fifty years ago. It is still so dear to me, that running my hand over the cover of it brought tears of gratefulness. Its short title is memorable: DICK AND JANE.

Mrs. Ayres was my first grade teacher. Like many of the students, I loved her. She taught me to read. I did so well that I was selected to read a paper I wrote called THE FIREPLACE. It was an honor, but it was scary, too. Three other students and I were to read over the air at a local radio station. Perhaps that was the beginning of my reading, writing and speaking to people.

Eugen Rosenstock-Huussy's insight about language is like a bow tied around the DICK AND JANE books. She observes that "Language is not speech, it is a full circle from word to sound to perception to understanding to feeling, to memorizing, to acting and back to the word about the act thus achieved. And before the listener can become a listener, something has to happen to him: He must expect."

Two teachers, Mrs. Ayres in the first grade and Miss Johnson in the third grade, taught me to "expect." There were other teachers that added meaning and discipline to words, but for those two beginner teachers, I am forever indebted.

Expectation—that's what makes the difference in people's lives. We learn to become listeners by expectation. That's a wonderful way to begin a new season of learning—in the classroom, at work or in the home.

Not all teachers have the gift of giving from an expectant heart; not all pupils care if they do. But when the pupil and the teacher both care, they become expectant learners together. And when it is all said, and the results flow back year after year, both of them are glad that they didn't give up, when at times they wanted to.

"See Dick, Look Jane!" Just two children looking for life. Hurrah for them! And if you are learning to "expect" today, hurrah for you, as well.

## Blanchard weds at Mackinac Island

Governor James J. Blanchard and Janet A. Fox were united in marriage on Saturday, Sept. 2 at the Governor's Summer Residence on Mackinac Island in a small private family wedding.

Following the 6 p.m. ceremony, they boarded a horse drawn carriage for the short ride to their private reception at the Grand Hotel.

In addition, Governor and Janet Blanchard and their families led the Mackinac Bridge Walk on Labor Day, Sept. 4.

Governor Blanchard is the third Governor to be married in office. Stevens T. Mason, Michigan's first governor (1835-1840), married Julia Elizabeth Philips in 1838 in New York. The other was Gov. Charles M. Crosswell (Governor 1877-1880), who married Elizabeth Musgrave in 1878.

This was the first gubernatorial wedding at the Summer residence on the Island. Built in 1902 for a Chicago attorney, the

home was purchased by the Mackinac Island State Park Commission in 1944 (for \$15,000) for use as the Governor's Summer Residence. The Victorian home stands on a high bluff overlooking the Straits of Mackinac and is a favorite landmark for visitors approaching Mackinac Island.

Many conferences, meetings and social gatherings are held at the residence during the summer. Gov. Blanchard hosted 24 of the nation's governors in 1987 and many of the Presidential candidates in 1988. President Truman, Kennedy and Ford have been guests, as have numerous other national and state leaders.

In 1984, Gov. Blanchard first opened the Residence to the public on Wednesdays, mid-June through Labor Day. Since that time, thousands of island visitors have enjoyed touring the historic home and seeing its magnificent view of the Straits of Mackinac.

## Keech charged in child's death

Charles Edward Keech, 34, of Lowell was charged Friday with second-degree murder in the beating death of David Dickerson, a five-year old boy from Lowell.

Keech, who lived with the boy's mother, Patricia Dickerson on a rural road in Ionia County, was being held on \$100,000 bond after his arraignment in Ionia County District Court.

Keech was arrested at his place of employment, a Grand Rapids auto body shop, following a three-week investigation, according to Ionia County Sheriff Terrence Jungel.

Keech had been a suspect since the Dickerson boy was rushed to Butterworth Hospital on August 11.

The boy apparently died from blows to the head and suffered other injuries.

Sheriff Jungel cautions the investigation is not over, but is a step along the way. Officials

were hoping to interview more people, but more arrests were not expected.

An Ionia County social worker from the DSS has been suspended for 60 days without pay for apparently mishandling the various reports that were filed about the child being abused.

The abuses were reportedly first brought to the attention of the DSS in early July.



# Lowell rallies for victory with late 4th quarter score

Goggins' late 25-yard touchdown run ignites 11-8 win

Lowell's traditionally resilient defense "tested tough" in its home opener against West Catholic, as the Red Arrows clipped the Falcons 11-8 in the two schools' first meeting in 64 years.

"Our defense bent, but it did not break," Lowell Coach Phil Christensen said. Brett Knoop battled for a yard on first down; following a delay of game, Goggins scrambled for two yards; and then on third and 15, Ryan Holtz rolling to his right, lofted a ball down the right sidelines leading Mike Gahan, who had beaten his defender and ran under the ball for a 42-yard pass reception. "That was the ballgame, our guy got beat deep," Galvin said.

Not really, coach, that was just the first of three big plays in an eight-play drive. The second big play came on an apparent interception of a Holtz pass, but a roughing the quarterback call

nullified the turnover and gave Lowell a first down at the West Catholic 25 yard line.

The play that followed proved even bigger, as Kevin Goggins found a hole over the left side and rambled in for a touchdown giving Lowell a 9-6 advantage. The Red Arrows then caught West Catholic off-guard on a two-point conversion with Goggins doing the honors and extending the lead to 11-6.

When asked for an explanation of what happened on the play, Christensen refused to comment.

He saved his superlatives for the fine goal-line defensive effort by his traditionally tough defense on the next series.

"We controlled the game in spurts and got a big effort from the players," Christensen said.

On the shoulders of a momentum-building 39-yard Arrow-deflected completion from Nate Wolf to Paul Rockwell, West Catholic was inside Lowell's 20 with less than five minutes to play. Three plays later the Falcons had it first and goal at the eight behind the power running of Brennan Spielmaker.

A costly procedure penalty backed up West Catholic to the Lowell 13. Spielmaker answered with back-to-back six yard runs, positioning the ball at the one on fourth down with roughly four minutes to play. Spielmaker, again, got the call, this time Tim VanAmburgh and a host of Arrows were there to meet him inches from the goal line and preserving Lowell's 11-6 lead.

Lowell ran four plays and then took a safety (11-8) before kicking from the 20. "I never thought about trying to punt it out of the endzone," Christensen said.

The Falcons got the ball at their 47, but were unable to move the ball in their final four offensive plays of the ballgame.

"There were no surprises. The single back didn't surprise us, Galvin said. "We knew coming in that Lowell was a tough, hard-hitting group. Coach Christensen has a fine program here." Lowell moved the ball well in the first half, but was devastated by penalties (handful of personal fouls). "I apologized to Coach






