# City ordinance has "cats by the tail" City Council says "Yes" to feline control

"With the ordinance, the City of Lowell is saying that owners of cats have a reponsibility to make sure their cats don't stray," Lowell City City Manager Dave Pasquale said.

As a means of addressing the cat control problem in Lowell, the City Council approved a cat-control ordinance. It will provide for violations to owners having cats running at large. Under the ordinance seizure and impounding authority is given. Also, no person can have no more than three cats under care other than those cats under six months of age.

The City's effort at a means of cat control, particularly where there is cat complaints, raised some concern by city residents. Some residents at the meeting said a leash is impractical and fencing does not work.

The proposed ordinance calls for cats to be retained by a leash of eight feet or less when off the premises of the owner. Female cats in heat are to be restricted to a building of fenced enclosure. The ordinance also disallows cats from creating a nuisance by noise, odor or any other manner.

"This is not an anti-cat ordinance. It's a means of addressing the cat problems some residents are experiencing," Pasquale said. The ordinance goes into effect 10 days after publication.

The Lowell City Council and YMCA agreed to proposals that will formalize an agreement eliminating the current documents in force.

Council members Bill Thompson, Jim Hodges and City Manager, Pasquale along with YMCA representatives David Hagens and Jim Reagan formed a committee, which provided the following recommendations:

\* Provide that the YMCA operate the pool on a year-to-year basis due to the questions on the pool's longevity and the planned improvements at Stoney-Lakeside Park.

\* Have the City give a flat \$6,000 contribution to the pool operation, eliminating the matching of YMCA memberships. The \$25 gift certificates to City residents would remain.

\* In an effort to balance the Y budget, no electrical, water and YMCA administrative charges would be addressed. The Lowell Light and Power agreed to the proposed elimination of electrical billings at its Nov. 13 meeting on a year-to-year basis.

\* Any surpluses derived would be given to a maintenance reserve fund. Deficits would be split between the YMCA and the city.

These proposals were passed by the City Council 4-1. The only council member not in favor was Jack Fonger.

In other council news a public hearing was set for Dec.4 for a setback variance at 961 Lincoln Lake.

Chris Childs has requested a variance so that he can construct a detached garage closer than 60 feet to the road right-of-way. As drawn, the garage would be 44 feet from Lincoln Lake and 23 feet five inches from Hunt Street.

A current part-time office position held by Debbie Crawford was upgraded to full-time. The increased volume of work in the Deputy City Clerk, City Treasurer and Account Clerk have necessitated this request. The full-time position would commence Jan. 1, 1990.

The Council gave its approval to have bids taken on the police department renovation project. The adopted 1989-90 City Budget has included the renovation of the old fire bay area in City Hall to accommodate additional space for the Police Department. The work is scheduled to start when the fire department moves to the new station. An amount of \$32,000 has been set aside in the budget for the project.

The East Jordan Iron Works bid of \$8,541 was okayed by the council for the work on the Hudson-Riverside water main materials.







#### **HEALTH COLUMN** IMPETIGO


One of the more common pediatric skin disorders we see is Impetigo. Many patients mistakenly refer to this primarily pediatric disease as "Ifantigo".

Impetigo is an infection of the skin. It is caused in the vast majority of cases by either a staph or a strep germ. It begins as isolated red lesions covered by honey-colored crusts. These lesions are usually found in shape and are frequently oozing. The earliest skin changes consist of blister formation. The blisters eventually rupture, causing the characteristic crusting, scabbing, and oozing noted previously. This infection occurs most commonly on the face, less frequently on the extremities and trunk. If the blisters or scabs are picked, the child can transmit the infection to other body parts. Additionally, this is a disease that can spread quickly from one child to the next in the nursery or day care setting.

The primary reason for early recognition and treatment of Impetigo is to prevent secondary complications of the disease. The most frequent complication is that of glomerulonephritis, which is a kidney disorder that may result from delayed or ineffective treatment of Impetigo.

Once the child is identified as having Impetigo, treatment is initiated with an oral antibiotic. Duration of treatment should be seven to ten days, depending on the extent of the lesions. A newer prescription topical antibiotic is also effective against Impetigo, but the over-the-counter antibiotic ointments are not recommended

Remember - early detection and treatment of Impetigo is essential to prevent any complications of this pediatric skin disease.



# VERGENNES TOWNSHIP

### COUNTY OF KENT

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1/1989

#### CABLE COMMUNICATIONS

An Ordinance of the Township of Vergennes for the regulation of cable services within the Township; to establish rules applicable between subscribers and cable communication companies; to require a franchise for cable services; to establish requirements and procedures for issuance of a franchise and relating to the termination and renewal of franchises; and to establish penalties for violations of this Ordinance.

THE TOWNSHIP OF VERGENNES ORDAINS:

#### Section I **Definition of Terms**

- 1.1 Terms. For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following terms, phrases, words and abbreviations shall have the meanings ascribed to them below. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future tense, words in the plural number include the singular number, and words in the singular number include the plural number:
- a. "Affililiate" when used in relation to any person, means another person who owns or controls, is owned or controlled by, or is under common ownership or control with, such per-
- b. "Basic Cable" means any service tier which includes the retransmission of local television broadcast signals.
- c. "Cable Act" means the Cable Communications Policy Act of 1984, as amended, codified at 47 USC Sec 521 et seg.
- d. "Cable Operator" means any person or group of persons (a) who provides cable services over a Cable System and directly or through one or more affiliates owns a significant interest in such Cable System, or (b) who otherwise controls or is responsible for, through any arrangement, the management and operation of such a Cable System.
- e. "Cable Service" means (i) the one-way transmission to subscribers of video programming or other programming service, and (ii) subscriber interaction, if any, which is required for the selection of such video programming or other programming service.
- f. "Cable System" means a facility, consisting of a set of closed transmission paths and associated signal generation, reception, and control equipment that is designed to provide cable service which includes video programming and which is provided to mulitple subscribers within a community, but such term does not include (a) a facility that serves only to retransmit the television signals of one or more television broadcast stations; (b) a facility that serves only subscribers in one or more multiple-unit dwellings under common ownership, control, or management, unless such facility or facilities use any public right-of-way.
- g. "FCC" means Federal Communications Commission. or a successor governmental entity thereto.
- h. "Franchise" means an initial authorization, or renewal thereof, issued by the Franchising Authority, whether such authorization is designated as a franchise, permit, license, resolution, contract, certificate, agreement or otherwise, which authorizes the construction or operation of a Cable System or the provision of cable services.
- i. "Franchise Authority" means the Township of Vergennes. County of Kent, Michigan, or the lawful successor, transferee or assignee thereof.
- i, "Franchisee" means a cable communications service or company having a franchise to operate a cable communication system or provide cable services within the Township of Vergennes, County of Kent, Michigan.
- k. "Gross Revenues" means the monthly Cable Service revenues received by a Franchisee from Subscribers of the Cable System; provided, however, that such phrase shall not include revenue received from any national advertising carried on the Cable System, nor shall such phrase include any taxes on Cable Service which are imposed directly or indirectly on any Subscriber thereof by any governmental unit or agency, and which are collected by the Franchisee on behalf of such governmental unit or agency.
- I. "Person" means an individual, partnership, association, joint stock company, trust corporation, or governmental entity.
- m. "Public Way" shall mean the surface of, and the space above and below, any public street, highway, freeway, bridge, land path, alley, court, boulevard, sidewalk, parkway, way, lane, public way, drive, circle or other public right-of-way, including, but not limited to, public utility easements, dedicated utility strips or rights-of-way dedicated for compatible uses and any temporary or permanent fixtures of improvements located thereon now or hereafter held by the Franchise Authority in the Service Area which shall entitle the Franchise Authority and the Franchisee to the use thereof for the pur-

pose of installing, operating, repairing and maintaining the Cable System. Public Way shall also mean any easement held by the Franchise Authority within the Service Area for the purpose of public travel, or for utility or public service use dedicated for compatible uses, and shall include other easements or rights-of-way as shall within their proper use and meaning entitle the Franchise Authority and the Franchisee to the use thereof for the purposes of installing or transmitting Franchisee's Cable Service or other service over poles, wires, cables, conductors, ducts, conduits, vaults, manholes, amplifiers, compliances, attachments and other property as may be ordinarily necessary and pertinent to the Cable Sys-

- n. "Service Area" means the present municipal boundaries of the Franchising Authority, and shall include any additions thereto by annexation of other legal means all such subject to density as described in Section 3.9.
- o. "Service Tier" means a category of Cable Service or other services, provided by Franchisee and for which a sepa rate charge is made by Franchisee.
- p. "Subscriber" means a person or user of the Cable Sys tem who lawfully receives Cable Services or other service therefrom with Franchisee's express permission.
- q. "Video Programming" means programming provided by, or generally considered comparable to programming pro vided by, a television broadcast station.

#### SECTION II Requirement of Franchise Agreement

- 2.1 Requirement of Franchise Agreement. It shall be unlaw ful for a person, or an affiliate of such person, to construct or operate a Cable System within the Township of Vergennes or provide Cable Service within the Township of Vergennes without having obtained a Franchise Agreement from the Township of Vergennes, which Franchise Agreement shall include, at a minimum, compliance with the specifications of this Ordinance.
- 2.2 Non-Exclusive Franchise. Unless otherwise stated the Franchise, any franchise granted by the Township of Vergennes shall be non-exclusive

#### SECTION III Standards of Service

- .1 Conditions of Street Occupancy. All transmission and distribution structures, poles, other lines, and equipment installed or erected by a Franchisee pursuant to the terms nereof shall be so located so as to cause no interference with the proper use of Public Ways and with the rights and reasonable convenience of property owners who own property that adjoins any of said Public Ways.
- 3.2 Restoration of Private and Public Ways. If during the course of a Franchisee's construction operation or maintenance of the Cable System there occurs a disturbance of any Private and Public Way by a Franchisee, it shall, at its expense, replace and restore such Private and Public Way to a condition reasonably comparable to the condition of the Private and Public Way existing immediately prior to such disturbance
- 3.3 Relocation at Request of Franchising Authority. Upon its receipt of reasonable advance notice, not to be less than five (5) business days, a Franchisee shall, at its own expense. protect, support, temporarily disconnect, relocate in the Public Way, or remove from the Public Way, any property of a Franchisee when required by Franchising Authority by reason of traffic conditions, public safety, street abandonment, freeway and street construction, change of establishment of street grade, installion of sewers, drains, gas or water pipes, or any other type of structures or improvements by the Franchising Authority; but, a Franchisee shall in all cases have the right of abandonment of its property. If public funds are available to any company using such street, easement or right-of-way for the purpose of defraying the cost of any of the foregoing, such funds shall also be made available to a Franchisee.
- 3.4 Relocation at Request of Third Party. A Franchisee shall, on the request of any person holding a building moving permit issued by the Franchising Authority, temporarily raise or lower its wires to permit the moving of such building, provided: (a) the expense of such temporary raising or lowering of wires is paid by said person, including, if required by a Franchisee, making such payment in advance; and (b) a Franchisee is given not less than ten (10) business days advance written notice to arrange for such temporary wire changes.
- 3.5 Trimming of Trees and Shrubbery. A Franchisee shall have the authority to trim trees or other natural growth overhanging any of its Cable System in the Service Area so as to prevent branches from coming in contact with a Franchisee's wires, cables or other equipment. A Franchisee shall reasonably compensate the Franchising Authority or property owner for any damages caused by such trimming, or shall, in its sole discretion and at its own cost and expense, reasonably replace all trees or shrubs damaged as a result of any construction of the System undertaken by a Franchisee. Such replacement shall satisfy any and all obligations a Franchisee may have to the Franchise Authority or property owner pursuant to the terms of this Section.
- 3.6 Use of a Franchisee's Equipment by Franchising Authority. Subject to any applicable state or federal regulations

or tariffs, the Franchising Authority shall have the right to make additional use, for any public purpose, of any poles or conduits controlled or maintained exclusively by or for a Franchisee in any Public Way; provided that (a) such use by the Franchising Authority does not interfere with a current or future use by a Franchisee; (b) the Franchising Authority holds a Franchisee harmless against and from all claims, demands costs, or liabilities of every kind and nature whatsoever arising out of such use of said poles or conduits, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees and costs; and (c) at Franchisee's sole discretion, the Franchising Authority may be required either to pay a reasonable rental fee or otherwise reasonably compensate Franchisee for the use of such poles conduits, or equipment; provided, however, that a Franchisee agrees that such compensation or charge shall not exceed those paid by it to public utilities pursuant to the applicable pole attachment agreement, or other authorization, relating to the Service Area.

- 3.7 Safety Requirements. Construction, installation and maintenance of a Cable System shall be performed in an orderly and workmanlike manner. All such work shall be performed in accordance with applicable FCC or other federal state and local regulations. A Cable System shall not endanger or interfere with the safety of persons or property in the Service Area.
- 3.8 Aerial and Underground Construction. In those areas of the Service Area where all of the transmission or distribution facilities of the respective public utilities providing telephone communications and electric services are underground, a Franchisee likewise shall construct, operate and maintain all of its transmission and distribution facilities underground; provided that such facilities are actually capable of receiving Franchisee's cable and other equipment without technical degradation of the Cable System's signal quality. In those areas of the Service Area where the transmission or distribution facilities of the respective public utilities providing telephone communications, and electric services are both aerial and underground, Franchisee shall have the sole discretion to construct, operate and maintain all of its transmission and distribution facilities, or any part thereof, aerially or underground. Nothing contained in this Section 3.8 shall require Franchisee to construct, operate and maintain underground any ground-mounted appurtenances such as subscriber taps, line extenders, system passive devices (splitters, directional couplers), amplifiers, power supplies, pedestals, or other related equipment. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Section 3.8, in the event that all of the transmission or distribution facilities of the respective public utilities providing telephone communications and electric services are placed underground after the effective date of this Ordinance. a Franchisee shall only be required to construct, operate and maintain all of its transmission and distribution facilities underground if it is given reasonable notice and access to the public utilities facilities at the time that such are placed underground.
- 3.9 Required Extensions of Service. A Cable System as constructed as of the date of the passage and final adoption of this Ordinance substantially complies with the material provisions hereof. A Franchisee is hereby authorized to extend a Cable System as necessary, as desirable, or as required pursuant to the terms hereof within the Service Area. Whenever a Franchisee shall receive a request for service from at least three (3) Subscribers within 660 cable-bearing strand feet, (one-eighth cable mile) of its trunk or distribution cable, it shall extend its Cable Sytem to such Subscribers at no cost to said Subscribers for system extension, other than the usual connection fees for all Subscribers; provided that such extension is technically feasible, and if it will not adversely affect the operation, financial condition or market development of the Cable System, or as provided for under Section 3.10 of this Ordinance. Such technical, operational and financial feasibility or market development standards to be no more or less stringent than those in effect in any other of the Franchisee's nearby Township franchises.
- 3.10 Subscriber Charges for Extensions of Service. No Subscriber shall be refused service arbitrarily. However, for unusual circumstances, such as a Subscriber's request to locate his cable drop underground, existence of more than one hundred fifty (150) feet of distance from distribution cable to connection of service to Subscribers, or a density of less than three (3) Subscribers per 660 cable-bearing strand feet of trunk or distribution cable, Cable Service or other service may be made available on the basis of a capital contribution in aid of construction, including cost of material, labor and easements. For the purpose of determining the amount of capital contribution in aid of construction to be borne by Franchisee and Subscribers in the area in which Cable Service may be expanded, Franchisee will contribute an amount equal to the construction and other costs per mile multiplied by a fraction whose numerator equals the actual number of potential Subscribers per 660 cable-bearing strand feet of its trunks or distribution cable, and whose denominator equals three (3) Subscribers. Potential Subscribers will bear the remainder of the construction and other costs on a pro rata basis. Franchisee may require that the payment of the capital contribution in aid of construction borne by such potential Subscribers be paid in advance
- 3.11 Service to Public Buildings. A Franchisee shall provide without charge one (1) outlet of Basic Service to the Franchising Authority's office building(s), fire station, police station, and public and accredited private school building that is passed by the Cable System. The outlets of Basic Service shall not be used to distribute or sell Cable Services in or

throughout such buildings. Users of such outlets shall hold a qualified transferee or assignee of its Cable System, which Franchisee harmless from any and all liability or claims arising is reasonably acceptable to the Franchising Authority, Franout of their use of such outlets, including, but not limited to, those arising from copyright liability. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary set forth in this Section 3.11, a Franchisee shall not be required to provide an outlet to such buildings where the drop line from the feeder cable to said buildings or premises exceeds two hundred (200) cable feet, unless it is technically feasible and if it will not adversely affect the operation, financial condition or market development of the 4.4, neither Franchising Authority nor a Franchisee shall be Cable System to do so, or unless the appropriate governmental entity agrees to pay the incremental cost of such drop line in excess of 200 cable feet. In the event that additional outlets of Basic Service are provided to such buildings, the building owner shall pay the usual installation fees associated therewith, including, but not limited to, labor and materials. Upon request of a Franchisee, the building owner may also be required to pay the service fees associated with the provision of Basic Service at the additional outlets relating thereto.

- 3.12. Service Requirements. A Franchisee shall respond to all subscriber service complaints within forty eight (48) hours of receipt of complaint. Should a cable-caused complaint not be resolved within thirty days, the Franchising Authority shall have the right, in addition to such other remedies as described in Section VII, to require a Franchisee to perform requisite tests of the portion of the cable system involved and provide documentation of such tests to the Franchising Authority.
- 3.13. Public and Leased Access Requirements. A Franchisee shall designate one (1) downstream video channel, free of charge, for non-commercial public access television. Franchisee shall provide for downstream video channels for leased access programming at fair market rates, as provided for within the Cable Act of 1984.

#### SECTION IV Regulation by Franchise Authority

- 4.1 Franchise Fee. A Franshisee shall pay to the Franchising Authority a franchise fee equal up to 5% of Gross Revenues received by a Franchisee from the operation of the Cable System on an annual basis. For the purpose of this section, the 12-month period applicable under the Franchise for the computation of the franchise fee shall be a calendar year. unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the Franchising Authority and a Franchisee. The franchise fee payment shall be due and payable ninety (90) days after the close of the preceding calendar year. Each payment shall be accompanied by a brief, independent CPA certified report from a representative of Franchisee showing the basis for the computation. In no event, shall the franchise fee payments required to be paid by a Franchisee exceed 5% of Gross Revenues received by a Franchisee in any 12-month period.
- 4.2 Rates and Charges. The Franchising Authority may not regulate the rates for the provision of Cable Service and other service, including, but not limited to, ancillary charges relating thereto, except as expressly provided herein and except as authorized pursuant to federal and state law including, but not limited to, the Cable Act and FCC Rules and Regulations relating thereto. From time to time, and at any time, Franchisee has the right to modify such rates and charges including, but not limited to, the implementation of additional charges and rates; provided, however, that a Franchisee shall give notice to the Franchising Authority of any such modifications or additional charges to Basic Cable Rates thirty (30) days prior to the effective date thereof.
- 4.3 Renewal of Franchise. The Franchising Authority and a Franchisee agree that any proceeding undertaken by the Franchising Authority that relate to the renewal of a Franchisee's Franchise shall be governed by and comply with the provisions of Section 626 of the Cable Act unless the procedures and substantive protections set forth therein shall be deemed to be preempted and superseded by the provisions of any subsequent provision of federal or state law.
- 4.4 Conditions of Sale. If a renewal of a Franchisee's Franchise is denied and the Franchising Authority either lawfully acquires ownership of the Cable System or by its actions lawfully effects a transfer of ownership of the Cable System to another party, any such acquisition or transfer shall be at a fair market value, determined on the basis of the Cable System valued as a going concern, but with no value allocated to the Franchise itself.

If Franchisee's Franchise is lawfully revoked for cause and the Franchising Authority acquires ownership of the Cable System or by its actions effects a transfer of ownership of the Cable System to another person, any such acquisition or ransfer shall be at an equitable price. A Franchisee and Franchising Authority agree that in the case of a revocation, at Franchisee's request, which shall be made in its sole discretion. Franchisee shall be given a reasonable opportunity to effecuate a transfer of its Cable System to a qualified third party at fair market value, determined on the basis of the Cable System valued as an ongoing concern. The Franchising Authority further agrees that during such a period of time, it shall authorize the Franchisee to continue to operate pursuant to the terms of its prior Franchise; however, in no event shall uch authorization exceed a period of time greater than twelve (12) months from the effective date of such revocation. If, at the enc of that time, a Franchisee is unsuccessful in procuring

chisee and Franchising Authority may avail themselves of any rights they may have pursuant to federal or state law; it being further agreed that Franchisee's continued operation of its Cable System during the twelve (12) month period shall not be deemed to be a waiver, nor an extinguishment of, any rights of either the Franchising Authority or the Franchisee. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary set forth in Section required to violate federal or state law.

- 4.5 Transfer of Franchise. A Franchisee's right, title, or interest in the Franchise shall not be sold, transferred, assigned or otherwise encumbered, other than to an Affiliate, without the prior consent of the Franchising Authority, such consent not be unreasonably withheld. No such consent shall be required, however, for a transfer in trust, by mortgage, by other hypothecation, or by assignment of any rights, title or interest of a Franchisee in the Franchise or Cable System in order to secure indebtedness.
- 4.6 As-Built Prints. A Franchisee shall, at the completion of construction, provide the Franchising Authority with a complete set of "as-built" construction prints showing all Trunk and Distribution for that portion of the system constructed within the Service Area. Updated "as-built" prints shall be supplied to the Franchising Authority annually on or about the anniversary date of the Franchise.

#### SECTION V Compliance and Monitoring

- 5.1 Testing for Compliance. The Franchising Authority may perform technical tests of the Cable System during reasonable times and in a manner which does not reasonably interfere with the normal business operations of a Franchisee or the Cable System in order to determine whether or not a Franchisee is in compliance with the terms hereof and applicable state or federal laws. Except in emergency circumstances, such tests may be undertaken only after giving Franchisee reasonable notice thereof, not to less than two (2) business days, and providing a representative of a Franchisee an opportunity to be present during such tests. In the event that such testing demonstrates that a Franchisee has substantially failed to comply with a material requirement hereof, the reasonable costs of such tests shall be borne by a Franchisee. In the event that such testing demonstrates that a Franchisee has substantially complied with such material provisions hereof, the cost of such testing shall be borne by the Franchising Authority. Except in emergency circumstances, the Franchising Authority agrees that such testing shall be undertaken no more than two (2) times a year in the aggregate, and that the results thereof shall be made available to a Franchisee upon Franchisee's request. A Franchisee agrees to provide to Franchising Authority "as-built" prints of a system within one hundred twenty (120) days of completion. Franchisee will also provide to Franchising Authority copies of all annual performance tests generated pursuant to the Cable Act or rules promulgated thereunder.
- 5.2 Books and Records. A Franchisee agrees that the Franchising Authority may review such of its books and records. during normal business hours and on a nondisruptive basis, as is reasonably necessary to monitor compliance with the terms hereof. Such records shall include, but shall not be limited to, any public records required to be kept by a Franchisee pursuant to the rules and regulations of the FCC. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary set forth herein, a Franchisee shall not be required to disclose information which it reasonably deems to be proprietary or confidential in nature. The Franchising Authority agrees to treat any information disclosed by a Franchisee to it on a confidential basis, and only to disclose it to employees, representatives, and agents thereof that have a need to know, or in order to enforce the provisions hereof

#### SECTION VI Insurance, Indemnification, and Bonds of Other Surety

- 6.1 Insurance Requirements. A Franchisee shall maintain full force and effect, at its own cost and expense, during the term of the Franchise, General Comprehensive Liability Insurance in amounts and upon terms as required by the
- 6.2 Indemnification. A Franchisee agrees to indemnify, save and hold harmless and defend the Franchising Authority, its officers, boards and employees, from and against any liability for damages for any liability or claims resulting from property damage or bodily injury, (including accidental death), which arise out of a Franchisee's construction, operation, or mainte nance of its Cable System, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorney's fees and costs.
- 6.3 Construction Bond. A Franchisee shall provide to the Franchising Authority a construction bond in amounts and upon terms required by the Franchise.
- 6.4 Bonds and Other Surety. Except as expressly provided by the Franchise, Franchisee shall not be required to obtain or maintain bonds or other surety as a condition of being awarded the Franchise or continuing its existence. A Franchisee hereby warrants and covenants that the legal, financial and technical qualifications of Franchisee are sufficient to

afford compliance with and performance of the terms of a Franchise. The Franchisee and the Franchising Authority recognize that the costs associated with bonds and other surety may ultimately be borne by the subscribers in the form of increased rates for Cable Services. In order to minimize such costs, the Franchising Authority agrees to require bonds and other surety only in such amounts and during such times as there is a reasonably demonstrated need thereof.

#### SECTION VII **Enforcement and Termination of Franchise**

- 7.1 Notice of Violation. In the event that the Franchising Authority believes that a Franchisee has not complied with the terms of a Franchise, it shall notify the Franchisee of the exact nature of the alleged noncompliance.
- 7.2 Franchisee's Right to Cure or Respond. A Franchisee shall have thirty (30) days from receipt of the notice described in Section 7.1 to (a) respond to the Franchising Authority contesting the assertion of noncompliance, or (b) to cure such default or, in the event that, by the nature of default, such default cannot be cured within the thirty (30) day period, initiate reasonable steps to remedy such default and notify the Franchising Authority of the steps being taken and the projected date that they will be completed.
- 7.3 Public Hearing. In the event that a Franchisee fails to respond to the notice described in Section 7.1 pursuant to the procedures set forth in Section 7.2, or in the event that the alleged default is not remedied within sixty (60) days after the Franchisee is notified of the alleged default pursuant to Section 7.1, the Franchising Authority shall schedule a public meeting to investigate the default. Such public meeting shall be held at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Franchising Authority which is scheduled at a time which is no less than five (5) business days therefrom. The Franchising Authority shall notify the Franchisee of the time and place of such meeting and provide the Franchisee with an opportunity to be heard.
- 7.4 Enforcement. Subject to applicable federal and state law, in the event the Franchising Authority, after such meeting, determines that a Franchisee is in default of any provision of the Franchise, the Franchising Authority may:
- a) Foreclose on all or any part of any security provided under the Franchise, if any, including, without limitation, any bonds or other surety; provided, however, the foreclosure shall only be in such a manner and in such amount as the Franchising Authority reasonably determines is necessary to
- b) Commence an action at law for monetary damages or seek other equitable relief or for other relief provided by
- c) In the case of a substantial default of a material provision of the Franchise, declare the Franchise Agreement to be revoked; or
- d) Seek specific performance of any provision, which reasonably lends itself to such remedy, as an alternative to
- A Franchisee shall not be relieved of any of its obligations to comply promptly with any provision of the Franchise by reason of any failure of the Franchising Authority to enforce prompt
- 7.5 Acts of God. A Franchisee shall not be held in default or noncompliance with the provisions of the Franchisee, nor suffer any enforcement of penalty relating thereto, where such noncompliance or alleged defaults are caused by strikes, acts of God, power outages, or other events reasonably beyond its ability to control.

#### SECTION VIII **Unauthorized Reception**

8.1 Unauthorized Reception. It shall be unlawful for any person to intercept or receive or assist in intercepting or receiving any communications service offered by a Cable System, unless specifically authorized to do so by a Cable Operator or as may otherwise be specifically authorized by state or federal law.

#### SECTION IX Penalties and Injunctive Relie

- 9.1 Penalties. Subject to Section VII and state and federal law, any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment for a period of not more than ninety (90) days, or by both fine and imprisonment.
- 9.2 Injunctive Relief. Subject to Section VII and notwithstanding the existence of any criminal remedy as hereinbefore provided, any violation of this Ordinance shall constitute a nuisance per se, and the Township shall be empowered to seek injunctive relief in a court of appropriate jurisdiction to enjoin such a violation and abate such nuisance.


