Lowell's City Council approves 10-year hangar lease

At its regular Monday evening meeting, Lowell's City Council approved a new 10-year airport hangar lease with its owners Jim Serne, Roger Odell and Douglas

The expiring lease left two options - to extend the lease another 10 years or to buy Serne, Odell and Olin out based on one half the appraised value.

After investigating into the buy out, Olin, Serne and Odell preferred to extend the lease.

Serne proposed a rent-free use of all three stalls for individuals concerned, in exchange for the

City taking ownership of the hangar. In reviewing a proposed lease agreement with City Attorney Dick Wendt, Serne expressed concerns about not having guarantees for 12 rent-free years (rather a 10-year lease with a two-year option) and the possibility of still being subject to property taxes. Thus, Serne did not want to pursue this proposal further.

A motion for Lowell schools to collect their summer taxes was deferred until Dec. 18 so that the school could see what the township will do. In other council news:

Variances were approved for 961 Lincoln Lake (southeast corner of Lincoln Lake and Hunt) for Chris Childs setback variance for his detached garage and a public hearing was set (Dec. 18) for 306 E. Main (southeast corner of E. Main and Monroe) for Lowell Granite Company's setback, parking and loading.

The Council heard a City Audit presentation by Virgil Biggs and Tom Dickinson of Biggs, Hausseman, Thompson and Dickinson. The Raymer Company Inc. bid of \$25,669 was approved by the Council for the installation of a new production well west of the water treatment Plant.

The Council also approved the recommended appointment of Mark Hines to the Airport Board.

The Flat River Snowmobile Club got the okay to use an area of Division Street for Parking.


