FCC ruling forces Lowell to drop channels 6 and 10 Subscribers are asked to send in suggestions for replacements; future rate hike likely

Lowell Cable subscribers will have their cable feed to Channels 6 (WLNS) and 10 (WILX) dropped due to a recent FCC ruling on local television rights, according to Lowell Cable Supervisor Herb Haines.

The ruling is to provide local stations with exclusive rights over distant stations. The FCC also believes the ruling will help to diversify local programming.

"It won't do much to change our position. There is no duplication of our Fox programming. Cables that carry our feed don't carry the feed of other FOX programming stations," he said.

Krause added that it will have an effect on the weekend sports programming. The Lansing stations didn't always carry the same games as the Grand Rapids' stations, which gave viewers a choice. "The ruling will give local That choice will be lost.

"It will cost Lowell Cable \$12,000 for the equipment," Haines said. This compounded with the signal supplier cost increase which went into effect the beginning of January and cable subscribers should not be surprised to see their monthly subscription rate increase. Haines says, "I don't think there is any doubt that Lowell Cable will be going to the City Council for rate changes."

Cable is using blankers to block the signal. It then uses' jumping cables to transmit a local station over the distant station.

Barricades designed to stop trash dumping Road Commission will erect barricades at both ends of the 1320 ft. S.E. of Timpson & 36th St.

Hoping to discourage a continuing trash dumping problem, the Kent County Road Commisssion will put up a barricade to close off the 1320 feet SE of the Timpson and 36th St. intersection in Lowell Township.

"The County received authorization on Thursday, Jan. 18," said Tom Byle, Director of Road Maintenance. "As the work load permits, a barricade will be erected. Right now, we're looking at late winter or early spring."

Property owners pleaded to have it closed off. However that request was denied because there is still an easement there for road building.

Residents were willing to fence it off themselves but were told by the county they could not.

Lowell Township Supervisor, John Timpson said he is hopeful the barricade will discourage people from dumping their trash. "There will be a barricade erected at each end, so people wishing

The most common symptom of sinusitis is a sense of fullness or facial pain overlying the involved sinus. If the frontal sinus is infected, there is usually pain in the forehead. There may also be accompanying intermittent yet profuse nasal discharge perisisting after resolution of a common cold. Postnasal drip is also common.

vegetables. I prepared the seafood and keilbasa for the pot. I was having a ball. You'd be safer at a ninja convention than you would have been in that kitchen as I wielded knives, strained pots of boiling water and fried ingredients. I think the kids and the dog were less impressed than scared.

This Cajun cooking calls for frying your vegetables and spices in a roux. The roux is made by heating oil in a big skillet until it smokes (about 500 degrees) then you briskly whisk in an equal amount of flour. The mixture turns to a black paste as it heats. Then you add your vegetables and seasoning and continue to stir madly as the mess smokes up the entire house with its indescribable and wonderful aroma. Then you spoon that mixture and the keilbasa to the boiling stock and let it rapidly simmer uncovered for about a half an hour. Next you add the seafood, and bring the whole thing back to boil. You can imagine what the house smelled like. On second thought, maybe you can't.

About nine thirty I served the concoction over the specially prepared rice that was a treat in itself. Needless to say, Casey, whose taste ranges from macaroni and cheese to creamed corn, didn't like the stuff. Angie, Terese and I chowed down big time. It was every bit as tasty as it was aromatic. It was one of those meals that make you care less what you are going to look like in a swimsuit next summer.

So, what's all this got to do with a foggy head? Well, the day has long since passed when I could go out for latenight beer and pizza with the boys and expect my innards to let me sleep the night through. You can imagine what a gut full of spicy Cajun food at bedtime did to me. Between wild dreams, tossing, turning, Alka Seltzers and trips to the men's room, I didn't get much sleep. And, what I did get couldn't be called, "quality slumber" by any stretch of the imagination! Somehow that wonderful aroma from earlier in the evening didn't smell so great in the middle of the night. True sinusitis can be a potentially dangerous infection if not treated in a timely fashion, so we urge evaluation by your physician if you develop any of its symptoms

GV Blood Program hosts Commendation Night





A FINGER-LICKIN' GOURMET

It's hit again---it's a seasonal disorder. Time for a change once again; a change in recipes, for bored taste-buds. I read that a woman usually has ten favorite recipes that she uses over and over and that is most often the extent of her creativity. I thought that was a little hard on women, until I checked my most often fixed meals, and the quote was almost on target. I still think I'm more creative than that, but the facts tell me different. Oh. hum!!!

My friend Janet woke me up early one morning with her cherry voice, "Good morning Joan, how's everything in Michigan? It's a beautiful day in Tennessee." As we talked she told me of the excitement of winning a cook-off contest for her chicken recipe. I perked up! I am not a morning person, but when Janet calls my day usually gets off to a slight dance. With the sound of that new recipe, I asked for it, got it and quite often now, my family asks if we are going to have Janet's chicken.

This recipe is EASY to make --- hurray!! Janet suggested having mashed potatoes, peas and applesauce with it. From start to finish; the chicken (with its own gravy) was done, the potatoes mashed, peas tender, and I had time to make fresh applesauce, ALL IN ONE HOUR. Now ladies, you just can't beat that. I save a little time by skinning the chicken the night before or in the morning. I use a large frying pan.

GOURMET CHICKEN WITH MUSHROOMS Broiler Chicken, cut into parts, skinned 1/2 Cup Flour Teaspoon Salt 1/4 Teaspoon Pepper 1/4 Teaspoon Thyme 174 Cup Margarine Onion, chopped 1 Cup Canned Mushrooms, drained 2 Cups Apple Juice, unsweetened (Spears brand) 2 Tablespoons Lemon Juice In a plastic bag, mix together flour, salt, pepper and thyme.


Add chicken and shake to coat. Reserve any remaining flour mixture. In frypan, place margarine and melt over medium heat. Add chicken and brown on all sides. Drain off excess grease. Combine remaining flour mixture, onion, mushrooms, apple juice, lemon juice and mix together. Pour over the chicken. Cover. Cook slowly for 1/2 hour or until chicken is tender. The finished product is a mildly sweet browned chicken in light-colored gravy dotted with mushrooms. Delicious! Serves: 4-6.
