The Kent County Sheriff Department's report stated that Daniel Joseph Barrett, 19, of Lowell, was eastbound on M-21 when he suffered an epileptic seizure, causing his vehicle to cross the road and enter a small dip in the boulevard. 

YMCA & City sign one year agreement The current

30-year lease expires in June

With the heated summer of 1989 behind them, the City of Lowell and the YMCA came together on a one-year agreement on the usage of the parks, and the management and leasing of King Memorial Pool.

The current lease on the pool expires in June. The City and the YMCA held meetings prior to the agreement so that discussions could make for a smoother transition.

The two sides agreed that the lease on the pool would run from year-to-year due to the pool's age and not knowing its future condition. City Manager Dave Pasquale added that the development of Stoney/Lakeside Park's beach area for public swimmimg was also a contributing reason for the year-to-year lease.

"I don't believe the beach

this year. The YMCA is not obligated to operate the pool and then have the city go into direct competition with it," former YMCA Director Jim Hodges said. "Although at some point I think it is possible the beach will replace the pool."

Routine maintenance and repair of the swimming pool will be handled by the YMCA. The new agreement states that the YMCA will not be responsible for major repairs. If such repairs are determined by the YMCA to be necessary, the YMCA will notify the City in writing. Thereafter, the YMCA and the City shall meet to determine the extent of such repairs, the cost, how such cost should be shared and whether the repairs should be made or if the pool should be closed.

Who decides what the definition of major is? "It will have to be a mutual agreement on both sides," Pasquale said. "We want the pool to be monitored so we know







to a bad start and it tends to set the tone for the rest of the week? Yesterday got off to a reasonable start, so I really didn't think it was going to one of "those" Mondays. Someday I'm going to learn to just quit thinking . . . it seems to get me into trouble.

I got a good night's rest on Sunday, and consequently had a terrible time prying myself from under those comfy covers Monday morning. 

Anemia, often termed "low blood" is a disorder of the red blood cell due to a variety of causes. Mild anemia is usually asymptomatic and is often found by accident while performing routine lab tests. As anemia worsens, symptoms such as tiredness, fatigue or paleness may occur. Many patients with anemia will complain of being run down. In severe cases of anemia, shortness of breath, dizziness, palpitations and headaches may occur.

Anemia is actually a decrease in the number of red blood cells in our circulatory systems. Red blood cells function by transporting oxygen and carbon dioxide between our lungs and tissues. It's easy to see how a shortage of red blood cells can lead to the above symptoms.

The most common cause of anemia is that due to iron deficiency. Iron deficiency occurs if we do not include enough iron rich food in our diets. Women are very susceptible to iron deficiency anemia because of their monthly loss of blood during menses, which must be replaced. Iron is a necessary building block incorporated into the red blood ell and enough must be present in the diet to continually replace old or lost red blood cells. Vitamin B-12 and folate

deficiency can also lead to anemia. Another common form of anemia is that due to continual slow blood loss as in internal bleeding. The GI tract is always a potential source for hidden blood loss to ulcers, hemorrhoids or certain cancers.

Anemia is easily diagnosed by performing a complete

blood count to check the red blood count. Once anemia is diagnosed, a cause must be searched for so that the proper treatment can be offered. Your doctor will often check your stool for hidden blood and order tests to examine the GI tract to rule out hidden blood loss. Iron deficiency anemia in healthy menstruating women can be avoided by maintaining a balanced diet and taking a daily vitamin with iron.

Commission Order - CFI-112.90 (Under the authority of Act 230 of the Public Acts of 1925, as amended) OPEN SEASONS AND CATCH LIMITS ON PIKE, WALLEYE, SAUGER AND MUSKELLUNGE

Under the authority of Act 230 of the Public Acts of 1925, as amended, being sections 300.1 through 300.5 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, the Natural Resources Commission at its October 4, 1989, meeting ordered that for a period of five years it shall be unlawful to take the following named species except within the open seasons and daily limits as prescribed below:

Open season: On walleye, sauger northern pike and muskellunge (including tiger

Region I: All Upper Peninsula waters, including the surrounding Great Lakes and connecting waters not otherwise closed to fishing shall be from May 15 through March 15.

Regions II and III: All Lower Peninsula waters except the Great Lakes and connecting waters not otherwise closed to fishing shall be from the last Saturday in April though March 15.

Regions II and III: The Great Lakes and connecting waters shall be open year around; except that muskellunge in Lake St. Clair, and the St. Clair and Detroit rivers may be taken only from the first Saturday in June through December 15 of each

For the purposes of this order, all drowned river mouth lakes such as Manistee Lake, Lake Macatawa and Muskegon Lake are considered as inland waters and are subject to inland water regulations.

Daily Catch Limits: Statewide limits shall be five (5) singly or in combination for largemouth and smallmouth bass, walleye and sauger and northern pike; the daily catch limit on muskellunge is one (1) (including tiger muskellunge) except that the daily catch limit on Lakes St. Clair and Erie and the Detroit and St. Clair rivers shall be six singly or in combination for largemouth and smallmouth bass, walleye, sauger, and northern pike when the catch includes at least one walleye or sauger.

This order supersedes the Commission Order entitled *Open Seasons and Catch Limits on Pike, Walleye, Sauger and Muskellunge", effective April 1, 1987 and assigned number CFI-112.87.

Michigan homeowners and renters would receive \$349 million of property tax relief under a homestead property tax credit revision bill introduced by State Representative Susan Grimes Munsell (R-Howell).

House Bill 5422 is part of a 4-bill package to amend the homestead credit calculation and expand eligibility for seniors and disabled people.

This legislation will bring substantial property tax relief to our homeowners and renters in times of increasing assessments.

The Munsell bill would: --increase the percent of the property taxes that exceed 3.5 percent of household income that are eligible as the credit from 60 percent to 75 percent.

--increase the maximum amount of the credit from \$1,200 to \$2,600 per year.

--index the maximum amount of the credit to the All Urban Detroit Consumer Price Index

--increase the portion of rent used in the credit calculation from 17 percent to 20 percent --increase the household income categories in which senior citizens, paraplegics and quadriplegics are entitled to returns of their property taxes greater than the amounts that exceed 3.5 percent of household income.

Other bills in the package include House Bill 5423, which I sponsored, to expand the circuit breaker by approximately \$4 million to include totally and permanently disabled persons as entitled to a 100 percent credit or refunds of their property taxes above a certain percentage of their household income.

House Bill 5424, sponsored by Rep. William Runco (R-Dearborn), would exclude any Social Security benefits received by seniors from the calculation of household income used for homestead credit purposes. House Bill 5425, introduced by Rep. Roman Kulchitsky (R-Warren), would entirely remove the homestead property tax credit cap for all senior citi-
