An early Saturday morning accident claimed the life of a Lowell man over the Memorial Day weekeend.

Ken VanderWerff, 19, of 273 Jane Ellen Dr., was thrown from a vehicle after it went into a ditch and rolled several times. VanderWerff was pronounced dead at the scene. The Sheriff's Department reported that Vander-Werff was not wearing a seat-

A 1981 Jeep CJ-5, driven by Michael Jaworowicz, was southbound on Segwun about one-tenth mile south of Alden Nash when his vehicle left the road while negotiating a curve.

The Kent County Sheriff's Department reports that Jaworowicz fell asleep while driving before the vehicle left the road.

Accounting moves provide local street fund with much needed funds

In an accounting book move, the Lowell City Council approved a budget amendment to loan money from the general fund instead of the major street fund to cover part of the cost to construct the Valley Vista Drive extension.

Last year, authorization was made to have the Major Street fund loan the Local Street fund \$80,500 to help cover the Valley Vista extension project.

However, after some further thought, Lowell City Manager, Dave Pasquale and City Treasurer Judy Noonon recommended to the Council that the loan come from the general fund instead.

This would allow the Major Street Fund to provide more available monies for road improvements. It was also thought that the General Fund has a greater fund balance to accommodate the loan.

"We didn't have enough in our local street fund to finance the Valley Vista extension," Pasquale said. "By borrowing from the general fund, the monies are not tied up in a loan."

"Basically, this is a means of looking at funds and finding the best way to finance it," Pasquale said.

I've got a couple of side bars to last week's column about time seeming to accelerate as we grow older. The first thing I want to mention is the fact that the piece almost wasn't published. I did my usual "cozy corner" routine last Tuesday. rolled out of bed around 4:30 a.m. and came in to write while there is nobody around to distract me. As is usually the case, I had no idea of what I was going to write about when I sat down at the computer screen. I had a particularly tough time giving birth to an idea. The labor and final delivery didn't go so great either. But, when I put the finishing touches on it I was pretty happy with what I'd tossed together. Believe me, that's not always the case.

After everyone had arrived for work I went out to run a couple of errands. When I returned, my typesetter confronted me immediately and blurted out, "Roger, I'm sorry. I lost your column!". She'd put another file in place of my column, and there wasn't a hard copy of it anywhere. You can kick my dogs. You can call me names. You can even kick me. But, if you really want to get me upset, you can lose my column. We used to have a typesetting machine that would sometimes shut down without warning and you'd lose everything that hadn't been saved to a diskette. It trashed nearly complete "cozy corners" several times. I almost ax murdered it once. I muttered something to the distraught typesetter and went out to the back shop to kick and pound some things.

After I had regained my composure I came back to the front room and screamed "Do you realize I drag my %@# out of bed at 4:30 in the morning to write that thing!?!?! How long have you been running these **#☆№%@ machines anyway!?!?!". Another employee tried to come to the rescue by saying, "Do-do happens!". I wasn't impressed, and stared a few holes through her too. I went out back to kick and pound some more.

I had written off my column for the week. I'd considered publishing a blank space with a small description of what had happened, complete with names. A little later on in the

morning the guilty typesetter said something like, "It's too bad about your column. It was a real good one.". She'd apparently read it on the the screen prior to trashing it. Her comment got me to thinking, and I had calmed down considerably, so I went to work trying to resurrect the thing. I think I came fairly close to the original.

I have to admit I've received more compliments about that column than any column in recent memory. Maybe the resurrection was better than the original, but just for spite I'll never admit to it.

One of the compliments I received came from an old friend who I don't see very often. At least I think it was a compliment. We send him the Ledger and he says he reads my column religiously each week to see what's happening in my life. I saw him this weekend and he said something like, "Hey, I really liked your column last week!". But then he added, "I got to the end of it and said to myself, 'He really can write.'. I wasn't sure how to take that. Here's a guy who's been reading my column for years, and finally one week he decides I can write. I guess I'll take it as a

Finally, there was a little side bar to the column that hit me later in the week. Last Friday was Bob Dylan's fiftieth birthday. I've been a pretty big Dylan fan over the years, so I stuck around the house to watch the feature the "Today Show" had about him. The thought that Bob Dylan is fifty is pretty heady stuff in itself, but an extra little dose of deja vue hit me like a runaway truck.

Dylan's birthday brought back a vivid memory of being in the army, laying in my bunk in a Quonset hut in Oui Jong Bu, Korea. It was 1971. I was 21 years old. I was part of the "sixties" generation, and Bob Dylan was one of our heroes. Part of that generation's doctrine was never trust anyone over thirty. So, as I lay there in my bunk reading the comics section of the "Stars and Stripes" the "Peanuts' strip for that day caught my attention. One of the regular characters, Charlie Brown, Snoopy, Linus or whoever, was reading a newspaper and saying things like, "Oh my gosh! This can't be true! It just can't be!". Finally in the last frame, the character had put down the paper and said simply, "Bob Dylan is thirty today!". I couldn't believe it either.

So, a little piece on the "Today Show" took me back to my cot in Korea just like Doc Brown's souped up Delorean in "Back To the Future". The thing I want to know is, what happened to the twenty years in between?

Each leader is in charge of a small group of students during 10 three-day sessions that begin June 12 and run through July 23.


They were selected for their jobs on the basis of a personal interview, references, academic standing, curriculum, work experience and campus involvement in student organization.



AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING STANDING. STOPPING AND PARKING ALONG A POR-TION OF MAIN STREET IN THE CITY

Councilmember Hodges, supported by Councilmember Thompson, moved the adoption of the following Ordinance:

WHEREAS, the City of Lowell has the authority pursuant to Section 625(4) of the Michigan Vehicle Code, Act 300 of the Public Acts of Michigan of 1949, as amended MCLA 257.675 (4), to adopt an ordinance prohibiting standing, stopping and parking along a State of Michigan trunk line highway within the limits of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is necessary to prohibit standing, stopping and parking along portions of Main Street (M-21) in order to alleviate dangerous conditions and the interference with the free flow of traffic along such portions of Main Street (M-21).

THE CITY OF LOWELL ORDAINS:

Section 1. Standing, stopping and parking is prohibited along both the north and south side of Main Street between Alden Nash Road and Hudson Street. Appropriate signs shall be placed by the City and/or other appropriate governmental

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after its publication in the Lowell Ledger, a newspaper of general circulation in the City.
