Melton, his wife, Teri, and their two children Josh and Shirley had their visit shortened when their neighbor called to inform them that their home had caught fire.


When Melton and his family arrived at their home on 612 N. Monroe, Lowell firefighters were on the scene attempting to put out the blaze.

Chief, Frank Martin, the blaze started in the attic. He said electrical was the probable cause but that could not be determined until an investigation was completed.

Melton's neighbors, Michael and Vicki Schmidt, called 911 at 4:15 p.m. Sunday. "Michael was outside playing basketball with his brother, Gale. They had quit playing to go take a look at where we are going to construct our garage. That's when they noticed smoke coming from the roof of Melton's home," Vickie Schmidt said. "He yelled to me

to call 911."

Lowell Fire did not leave the scene until 8:30 p.m., according to Martin. He estimated the damage to be roughly \$60,000. "I would say it was gutted. What the fire didn't get, heat, smoke and water did."

"As is the case with small communities, people rally around one another in times of need," Vicki Schmidt said.



PURCHASE OF NEW MINI COMPUTER Presently, the City has an eight year old Tiger 64 minicomputer which handles Payroll, finance (budget, accounting and checking reconciliation), accounts payable, voter registration, cemetery and utility billing. It was proposed that this equipment be replaced with a Versyss Solution I/Model 150. The new systems would provide greater speed, especially in the utility billing reports and in back-up time. The memory would be expanded from 512 K to 4 Mega Bytes. The total investment of \$21,690 will include the purchasing of \$2,250 of additional software for automatic back up, voter registration transfer and system conversion. The annual savings on hardware maintenance is projected to be \$2,984 annually. Councilmember Hodges expressed concerns about dealing with only one vendor. ATHLETE'S FOOT

Athlete's foot is the most common fungal infection seen in the physician's office. Athlete's foot is caused by the ringworm fungus living on the dead protein-rich skin found on the surface of the foot. This condition is seen mostly in adolescent and adult males. It is seen most frequently in the warmer months because of increased perspiration. Fungi grow best in warm moist dark regions, this is why the foot is an ideal habitat.

The clinical manifestations of athlete's foot can vary depending on the severity of the case. Mild cases present with peeling, cracking or maceration of the skin in the toe webs, especially the last toe web. More severe cases present as scaling, redness, or small water filled blisters along the sides and soles of the foot. Most cases involve some degree of

itching. Occasionally an allergic reaction can occur called an "id" phenomenon, leading to involvement of the hands with peeling, small, blisters and intense itching.

Athlete's foot can be confused with psoriasis, eczema, or contact dermatitis as in poison ivy, so your doctor may take a small skin scraping and examine it under a microscope to confirm the diagnosis.

Most cases of athlete's foot can be treated by applying a topical medication to the affected area twice daily for a couple of weeks. More severe cases are treated with oral medication in addition to the topical agents.

To prevent athlete's foot, it is important to wash the feet at least once daily and to thoroughly dry the feet including the web spaces.

Wear cotton socks and avoid wearing occlusive shoes which retain moisture. If the web spaces become involved you can separate the toes by placing small pieces of lamb's wool between the toes which will inhibit moisture retention. During warm weather wear sandals allowing moisture to evaporate. Dusting an antifungal powder in the shoes may also aid in

prevention of recurrent fungal infection of the feet.




Lowell Area Historical Society's display of famous Lowell authors continues into Showboat week with the works of Howard Henry Peckham.
