Gary Rivers fifth on win list; gains number 400 at E.G.R.

If Lowell is to O-K White wrestling what Michigan is to Big Ten Football, then East Grand Rapids may currently be the Northwestern.

It wasn't always that way.

Back in the mid 50's and early 60's, the Pioneers were revered as a top notch wrestling program.

In large part, that success could be attributed to Carl

Nestor. Nestor was on hand to watch Lowell coach Gary Rivers record his 400th career dual meet win last Thursday evening. Nestor was also one of the

at Lowell. "I was a graduate from Central Michigan University. The only wrestling experiarce I had was through an intramural program at Central. Carl came out to Lowell and taught the kids how to execute take-downs. He did this for a number of years. I respect him greatly for that."

Over the last couple of weeks, reporters, fans, and admirers have asked Rivers how he's been able to coach wrestling for 32 years.

Nestor, who started the East Grand Rapids wrestling program back in 1955, may have answered it best by simply stating, "Gary Rivers loves wrestling."

His love for the game goes beyond amassing wins for Lowell.

When Belding and Saranac were starting wrestling programs, Rivers was there running wrestling assemblies.

When young free spirited Red Arrows need help with a move or technique, Rivers

seeks help from Lowell wrestling alumnus. Many are never more than a handshake away on nights of dual meets.

"When there is something I want young wrestlers to get, I call on ex-wrestlers," Rivers said. The 32-year wrestling mentor deflects much of his success to all of his confident. cocky, sure-of-themselves wrestlers. He is also grateful and very much aware of the help he has received from assistant coaches. "A good example of that is Tom Harper. He assisted me for several years and has done a hell of a job with the Middle School wrestling program," he ex-

The milestone of 400 victories assures that the 199192 season will always hint of a specialness for Rivers. It is also a year that has been outlined with a heart-sinking nervousness. Rivers, an icon as far as high school wrestling coaches go, has had to battle back from a holiday heart at-

It has just been within the last couple of weeks he's been allowed to return to the bench. "I was told I had to sit quietly or I couldn't return," he says. So far he's done pretty good and refrained from getting excited. "The matches up to now haven't been real close, which has made it easy," Rivers explains. "See me after 10 minutes after a match. You Saturday's (Feb. 15) conference meet."

Rivers who has to walk 20

minutes a day, bookends the exercise with a five-minute warm-up and cool down. "I do this while the boys run in practice."

Lowell's coach still enjoys coaching as much as he did 32 years ago.

"I like the one on one achievementaspectofit," Rivers explains. "I have a great deal of respect for athletes in track, cross-country and gymnastics."



PUBLIC HEARING. Steven and Amy Meeuwenberg NAY: 0. had petitioned for a variance so they could build a new home with 1359 square feet floor area at the northwest corner of Grindle and Hillside Court. This was proposed in a R-1 district where 1500 square feet floor area is required. In their petition the Meeuwenbergs stated that the reduced floor area would considerably lessen the cost of their first home.

At its January 27 meeting, the Planning Commission recommended to the Zoning Board that the variance be granted (6 to 2 vote).

Approximately twelve residents in the immediate area stated their opposition to the variance request because they felt that the required 1500 square feet of living space should be followed. Tom Reedy (714 Hillside Court) stated that prior to building his house four years ago he applied for a variance and was denied.

IT WAS MOVED BY MAATMAN and seconded by FONGER to deny the variance request from Steven and Amy Meeuwenberg to reduce floor area requirement of a new house from 1500 to 1359 square feet at 714 Hillside Court in the R-1 district.

B. 1601 W. MAIN - BERNARD'S TRUE VALUE PARKING VARIANCE RELATED TO BUILDING AD-DITION - SET PUBLIC HEARING (2/18). The Planning Commission, at its January 27 meeting, reviewed a site plan for a proposed 3960 square foot addition to Bernard's True Value. The Commission noted that 39 parking spaces were required, for the addition where six (6) added spaces were provided. Presently, 36 spaces are currently on site. The Planning Commission would not waive the parking requirement nor provide a recommendation to the Zoning Board (4 to 4 vote). In May of 1987. the Board did grant a parking variance to Bernard's. requiring 26 spaces where 48 were required.

Item #2. PUBLIC INFORMATION SESSION - REVIEW OF ESTIMATED COST REGARDING NORTHEAST SIDE PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS. John LeFevre of Fishbeck, Thompson, Carr and Huber stated that in 1989 a Water Reliability Study was conducted and it identified the northeast side as a high priority for water system improvements. He presented the proposed cost estimates for water, street and sewer improvements for the northeast side. The affected property owners were provided with the cost for two alternates. The first alternate provided water mains with grading and street improvements. The second has added sanitary sewer and curb and gutter. Approximately eighty residents were present at the meeting to receive information about the proposed projects and express their concerns.

LeFevre stated that the water pumping booster station is needed to serve residents in the higher elevations in the northeast area of the City. Inadequate pressure is currently observed in the area of High Street and James Street. The booster station is apportioned to each affected property owner at \$1,077 as part of a special assessment. Future development (such as the proposed Highland Hills condominium project) would be charged this amount plus any accrued interest at the time of construction

Most residents, affected by the northeast water improvement project and present at the meeting, asked why they should be financing water mains for the condominium project. LeFevre stated that the City would be covering the portion of the booster station needed for the condominium project, not the affected property owners. Most residents agreed with the City that resolving the water pressure problem in the area must be accomplished. Mayor Maatman said that the costs will never be less than they are now. He also mentioned that the reason for this informational meeting was for the Council to hear from the public regarding this matter. The Council thanked those who attended the meeting, noting they wish to find the best possible solution to address water service

No further action was taken on this issue by the Council at the meeting. .

Item #3. POLICE DISPATCHING AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY OF WALKER. Police Chief Emmons stated that Lowell, being on the east side of Kent County, is one of the worst area's for receiving transmissions from the Kent County Sheriff's Department. One of the problems is the terrain between the City of Lowell and the Kent County Sheriff's Department. Chief Emmons and City of Walker Police Chief Walter Sprenger presented a proposal to contract with the City of Walker for off-hour dispatching services under a three year agreement of

\$15,000 per year. The agreement with Walker will provide a substantially upgraded system. It is anticipated that 911 calls will be handled at no change in cost Approximately \$14,000 in equipment for the new system would be handled through the drug forfeiture monies and Walker also agreed to pay for a share of these costs.

IT WAS MOVED BY THOMPSON and seconded by GREEN to approve the contract with the City of Walker for off-hour (6:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. Monday through Friday, weekends and holidays) dispatching services for three years at \$15,000 per year. YEA: 5.

Many staff hours were spent in identifying issues related to management, grave space purchase, care of lots and grave spaces, memorials and markers, and interments in the city cemetery. It was recommended by the city staff that the Council adopt the Cemetery Rules and Regulations as





OPEN BURNING

proposed ordinance to define and regulate open burning within Vergennes Township. Under the proposed ordinance no open fire (not to include burning in a proper debris burner) would be permitted when the ground is not snow covered unless a burning permit is first obtained from the City of Lowell Fire Department, which has fire control responsibility for the township. Farmers or others having a valid need for more than one open fire per year, could obtain an annual permit, with each open burning reported in advance to the Fire Department. Use of outdoor cookers for preparing food, heating devices properly used in building and construction, and supervised burning of empty fertilizer or other bags used in agriculture would also be exempted from the permit requirement.

Persons allowing an open fire to escape control could be held liable for property damage and fire suppression costs. The primary purpose of this proposal is to prevent the type of uncontrolled open burning that each year results in fires that escape containment, result in additional fire control costs to township residents, and on occasion cause property

> **FIRE PROTECTION** (COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL DISTRICTS)

proposed ordinance amendment to increase fire resistance in all commercial and industrial buildings constructed with a fire separation distance of less than 30 feet. The effect of the proposal would be to require that all commercial or industrial buildings to be built without the 30 foot separation must be built to increased levels of fire resistance as provided in the BOCA national building code used by the Township.

VERGENNES TOWNSHIP RECREATION PLAN

The 1989 Vergennes Township Master Plan recommends that a recreation plan be developed as part of Community Facilities planning. The proposed recreation plan, developed under this recommendation, is presented for public comment. The proposed plan identifies future needs and goals for recreational opportunities as expressed in the 1988 Vergennes resident survey that was part of Master Plan development These future hopes call for cooperation with the State, County and local agencies in meeting the recreational needs of a growing population. A short (1-5 years) and long (5 - 10 years) range of objectives is given.

This plan is proposed for review prior to consideration by the Township Board. The plan, if adopted, will be for planning purposes only, and does not affect existing ordinance language Any future ordinance changes that might result would require individual consideration under public hearing

Owens-Ames-Kimball reviews development budget

Lowell's School Board heard some special news at a special board of education meeting Monday night.

Ron Denhof, chief estimator for Owens-Ames-Kimball Co., in reviewing the design development budget update, told the Lowell Board that its cost for the school construction project has come in roughly \$30,000 under its cost.

The revenue, including the bond interest, is currently estimated at \$34,484,728. The current cost estimate is currently at \$34,452,592

The estimated cost for the site work, which would include concrete, electrical service, lighting, storm water detention ponds, etc..., is budgeted for \$1,826,348.

The outdoor athletic facilities has been budgeted for \$1,304,461

Of all the estimated costs Denhof said he was least sure about the cost for on/off site sanitary and on/off site water. Denhof estimated roughly \$1.6 million for the two.

"There are still questions that remain on those two projects, Denhof said. "Of the estimates given in the budget review, we know the least about sanitary and water." Answers to those questions will be learned when it is learned what municipalities will participate and to what part they will participate.






