

McDonald's granted variance for reader board Second one in 9 years

With the concern of sign proliferation in the business area, the Lowell City Council went ahead and approved a sign variance for McDonald's Restaurant located at 1300 W. Main.

A variance was needed because the current sign has already exceeded its maxi-

McDonald's has proposed to install a 24 square foot reader board on its pole sign. The maximum allowable square footage for the sign is 91 square feet. On June 24, 1984, the City granted McDonald's a variance to approve an additional 10.3 square feet over the maximum for the sign.

The request by McDonald's for a 3-by-8 foot (24 square feet) is to allow more visibility and to have an equal footing with its competitors who possess reader boards.

Bernard's True Value Hardware owner, Charlie Bernard, stated that he was concerned with the sign prolifera-

With the concern of sign tion taking place in the Lowell business area.

Kevin Smith, Curtis Cleaners, stated he had no problem with the reader board as long as it was 10 feet above ground.

Pasquale said the sign square footage is based on the width of the property.

Councilman Don Green said a sign specification has been set, and in giving variances the City runs the risk of the signs becoming bigger and bigger.

Councilman Hodges said that in the spirit of fair competition, he felt the City should do what it can to help and enhance business within the community.

With the help of the 1984 variance the sign footage on the McDonald's property is 101 square feet.

The Council approved the variance by a 4-1 vote. Councilman Bill Thompson was the only one to vote no.

### Autumn weather just in time for Festival

On Saturday, Sept. 26 at 10 a.m., the 24th Annual Fallasburg Fall Festival gets underway. The two-day festival, which runs from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday, is sponsored by the Lowell Area Arts Council, but many other individuals and organizations also do their part towards the success of the festival.

Entertainment will be provided on the outdoor stage each day. Master of Ceremonies Gordon Gould of WOOD Radio will kick off the program on Saturday at noon by introducing the first act, Choice Ingredients. At 1 p.m. No Refund takes the stage followed at 2 p.m. by Down River Players. Two hours of rousing music from Beats Settin' Home finishes Saturday's program.

Sunday's program begins at 11 a.m. with Quodlibet. Amadaun takes the stage at noon followed at 1 p.m. by Ralston Bowles. The Proulx Family Tradition goes onstage at 2 p.m., and the weekend's entertainment ends with The

Hill People beginning at 3 p.m.

At 4:45 Sunday the drawing begins for the raffle. The grand prize is the "Rose Gazebo" quilt designed by Dolores Dey. In addition, over fifty other works of art are included in the raffle, all donated by the festival artists. Tickets can be purchased at the festival information booth. The information booth will also be the place to pick up the handbill, seek emergency aid, and visit the philatelic display being planned by the Lowell Branch of the U.S. Post Office. A special cancellation has been designed by Tami Eldridge for the two days of the festival, making it a collector's item. Mail can be mailed at this reincarnated Fallasburg Post Office.





As you all have guessed by now, this is in direct reference to the Rockford School teachers' strike which was finally put to rest Friday after 19 days of negotiations and tension

When the strike first started, it directly affected a town of roughly 3,400 people. As the number of strike days grew from one to 10 and then to 15, events occurred that increased the scope of the strike from a town of 3,400 to 85 percent of the county's seghool district, or 49,967 students (based on 1990 cals).

The intensity of the strike jumped as dramatically when the Rockford Board of Education announced that any teacher who did not report back to school by Monday, Sept. 21 would risk being replaced and/or fired.

No longer was it a face-off between the Rockford Board of Education and its teachers. Now the KCEA, 17 schools strong , said it would support the Rockford teachers, stating, if any firings occurred, all schools belonging to the KCEA would

■ Hawkins told me the threat of a county-wide strike had

nothing to do with money. Instead, it was intended to reaffirm allegiance to one another in case of replacement or firing.

This was definitely a power move on the part of the KCEA. figuring 17 schools with teachers on strike sends a louder and stronger message than one.

A gentleman asked me Friday if I actually thought if one or 17 schools striking was going to change the position or direction of the Rockford Board of Education? A good question. In the end, Rockford teachers still needed the graces of its own Board; 16 other schools weren't in a position to get that for them. Had Monday come without a settlement, and had this thing lingered on, the Board may have become even more convinced and stubborn with its position.

Looking back, the bigger question may be about the teachers from the other schools within the KCEA. They were prepared to walk had things not been settled and Rockford teachers been replaced or fired.

What did they have to gain as compared to what they had to lose? Hawkins told me a strike would have gained Rockford support, support others hoped would be reciprocal if the roles were reversed.

I expressed to Hawkins that a school like Lowell had much more to lose from such a move than it could gain. Hawkins did not agree. He didn't think Lowell had anymore to lose than other school districts.

However, how many schools battled twice to get their most recent operation millage passed? How many schools are in the middle of a bond issue, which required the support and trust of its community? How many schools will be going before its constituents in a year or so to have its operational millage increased so that it can open and run its new \$26 million high school?

After all that, to walk out on the district so that an allegiance can be shown for fellow teachers in Rockford. In my opinion, the KCEA had the most to gain. A show of power,

that its teachers were unified and that they were willing to sacrifice and stand up for one of its members.

Was it in the best interest of Cedar Springs? A town that went through a bitter fight just one year ago?

I claim it would have caused many ugly confrontations within a number of the school districts in the KCEA. Confrontation between the general public and local teachers.

After things were settled, would the communities have been able to put this behind them and move on? No more so than teachers could look another teacher in the eye who crossed the picket line.

I was in no way against the Rockford teachers getting what they deserve and being treated fairly. It's difficult if not impossible, to sit 20-30 miles from the scene and to know if either side is negotiating in good faith. I'm not sure people in Rockford always knew.

My biggest problem with the whole thing was with where the allegiance lied. I understand that for a Union to be strong and be functional its members must work as one toward the common goal. The Union is there to protect the rights of its members and to make sure they are not raked over the coals.

The problem I had with the threat of this sympathy strike or whatever its correct term is, was while it was looking to do what was best for the Union, a teacher's allegiance to their community and school district seemed not to matter.

That seemed funny to me in that it is the community which basically pays their salaries.

One other overview, while schools teach students not to succumb to peer pressure, to do what is right for them as an individual despite what the masses are doing, it seems to me that the Union depends on teachers not to be able to practice what they teach. Instead, it depends on teachers succumbing to peer pressure (if everyone else is walking out I guess l should too), and to not be able to do what is right for each of them individually, morally and spiritually

In defense of the teachers though, a strike is a damned if you do and damned if you don't situation.

This time though, choices did not have to be made, for that here's a motion for one big HALLEJUJAH!

There have been others, but nothing in recent memory has gotten my immediate attention quite like the engine problems experienced last week in my antique biplane at about a thousand feet. Talk about focused! The Swedish bikini team couldn't have distracted me!

Here I was, cruising along on a cool, but gorgeous morning, about twenty miles from my planned fuel stop in Joliet, Illinois, when the fifty-some-year-old radial engine started coughing and sputtering. With rabbit quick (okay, geriatric opossum) reflexes, I simultaneously advanced the throttle, pushed the fuel mixture to full rich, checked the primer, fuel shut-off and magneto switch for proper positioning and began Canning the countryside for a suitable hayfield or quiet road to put down on. I was so busy I didn't have time to wet my pants, even though I'd been looking very much forward to my

plane ran better, but not great. I checked my chart for the Say no more! nearest airport. There happened to be two airports adjacent to a little more altitude just in case the engine quit completely. I post-crash fire became fully involved.

I nursed the wheezing old crate on to the first airport. Feeling much relieved with the sight of a nice paved runway beneath me, I experimented with the throttle. Any reduction resulted in much poorer performance. By that I mean, the engine acted like it wanted to quit! Needless to say, I kept my experimentation to a minimum. This was one time in my life I complied with the old adage, "If it ain't broke, don't bleep with it".

I circled the airport for awhile, gained some more altitude and thought about my options. Prudence told me to land right where I was. But, the field looked pretty deserted, so practicality told me to muddle on to Joliet where I knew there was a mechanic. Practicality also brought up the point that I might actually be stupid enough to land, fuss with the engine, then try

I also convinced myself that the engine would scramble out of the wreckage with two broken legs before the probably quit when I throttled back on final approach. I planned accordingly. This basically meant I'd keep my approach higher than normal so I could glide (like a set of car keys) into the airport. There was nothing else to do, as my antique has no radio, so I couldn't alert the crash trucks.

It sure seemed like a mighty long ten miles to Joliet. When I finally got there I sputtered over the airport, got a good check on the windsock, looked for other planes and began my approach. When I throttled back on final approach the engine did as I had predicted, it quit deader than a geriatric opossum that couldn't dodge a speeding semi. It wasn't the best landing I've ever made, but it was damn sure the quietest!

Labor/management relation. ships in school districts need to be brought into the 20th Century where local decision making is allowed. Laws governing the state supported educational institutions need to provide boards of education with the power for local decision making. Funding for public education needs to be equitable and fair for all in-formula school districts with a reduced reliance on the property tax.

Any "symptomatic" approach to solving the ills of public school finance or administration is like trying to find a cure for the common cold. It just isn't going to happen until our laws address the "systemic" issues.

eral extraction operations. He mentioned the Planning Commission has provided very extensive language including such items as landscaping, hours of operation and fees required for insurance. The ordinance requires a special approval use based on a site plan submitted to the Planning Commission. He further stated the Planning Commission has great latitude in addressing community concerns about gravel mining and recommended the passage of the ordinance.

Councilmember Thompson questioned what are the authorized hours regarding noise nuisance complaints. Chief Emmons responded that allowable construction noise begins at 8 a. m. Thompson felt the mineral extraction ordinance (start time at 7:00 a.m.) should follow along with the City ordinance. Mayor Maatman saw no conflict between the two regulations. Councilmember Thompson further questioned what is the City's final protection if mining operation requirements are not met at the end of their operation. City Manager Pasquale responded the City will have a performance bond from the owners. Blough added that the Commission will have an annual review of the site and site plan, at which time the renewal may be denied if there is a violation of requirements. City Manager Pasquale mentioned that Jeff Slugget's (an associate of the City Attorney) letter of August 14, stated that this is a lawful use of property and such uses cannot be excluded from the zoning ordi-

It has been recognized by the Kent County Police Chiefs Association that updating of the agreement is needed. The documents presented provide the updates on mutual aid and was approved unanimously by the Association. Chief Emmons explained that the agreement is very protective of local community's rights. No locality must respond. This would be particularly critical if the locality would be short staffed at the time or handling an emergency of its own. #### ROCKFORD IN RETROSPECT

Now that the Rockford strike is settled and the media hype has subsided, the situation is worth reviewing from a factual point of view. School district employees have had the right to bargain for salaries and working conditions since the early 1960's. Since that time I don't recall an August or September where some districts were not bogged down in negotiations which lead to a teachers strike. Lowell Area Schools had a four

day strike in 1979 and many employees and residents still talk about those days as if they happened yesterday.

This year was a particularly bad year for growing informula school districts to bargain contracts because state funding for in-formula school districts such as Lowell and Rockford was substantially reduced. The state aid formula has traditionally used the fourth Friday of the current school year as a basis for "state aid" which is designed to bring poor districts up to a "state average". This year's state aid bill set last year's enrollment as the basis. Rockford had just passed a 3.8 mill increase and has an additional 300 students this year. Since the amount of state aid is figured on student count and the amount of local millage, the Rockford School District lost a minimum of \$1.2 million which is a direct result of the state aid formula. That makes Lowell's loss of \$385,000 seem a little easier to accept, but proportionately it is not.

The right of public employees to strike is prohibited by law and most teacher contracts have a "no strike" clause. However, the law and the contract clause is often violated due to technicalities as judges generally refuse to force teachers back

to work while they continue to bargain. Whether public employees should have the right to strike is a topic for another article. What is crucial is the end result of three weeks of labor strife which was flamed by media coverage.

The details of the tentative agreement have not been made public but teachers will get an increase in salary. No fact finder, mediator, or arbitrator to my knowledge has ever suggested a settlement which was above the teachers last offer or below the board's last offer. The settlement is always in the middle and the dollar difference is usually negligible.

The worst part of a teacher strike is the aftermath. Once open lines of communication return to normal, parents, teachers, students and taxpayers continue to rehash the issues to confirm their positions. The hurts and memories will run deep in Rockford for years to come and there will be a sense of distrust among all on both sides of the issue. In addition, the district's operational efficiency will be somewhat hampered because of differing relationships inside each bargaining unit.

So was the Rockford strike worth it? Probably not. While

"We kept them out of the endzone and then come back and march 80 yards for our second score," Dailey explains.


