

The proposed design concept was selected to accommodate the maximum number of Grattan Township customers within the shortest pipeline design and construction timetable.

Phase II is scheduled to commence in the spring of 1993. It will extend the Five Mile Road lateral to Murray Lake Avenue and Gavin Road.

Council sets 3 public hearings for Nov. 16

Public hearings were set for Crystal Flash, McDonald's and for a new sewer ordinance Monday night at the Lowell City Council meeting.

Crystal Flash wishes to install a new pole sign near the intersection of Main and West Street Street. The 104 foot sign would replace the existing signage of 138 square feet.

The proposal causes the need for two varainces.

The new sign exceeds the maximum square footage for pole signs by 54 square feet.

A pole sign is not allowed within a triangle formed between points on the front and side lot lines within 35 feet from the intersection. The new proposed sign would fall within that intersection.

A public hearing was set for Nov. 16.

McDonald's received the approval to install a 3-by-8 foot reader board sign at the zoning board of appeals meeting on Sept. 21. A 10 foot ground clearance is necessary to meet code.

It was thought that the clearance could be achieved. But, the reader board has only eight feet of clearance. Thus, McDonald's has asked for a variance. A public hearing was set for Nov. 16.



"It was an empty feeling. It could have been worse though, it could have been the middle of the night. I don't think I would have ever gotten out," Heyboer explains. Lowell Fire Chief Frank

Martin said the fire began at 5:15 p.m. "The cause of the fire was electrical. There was more smoke and heat damage than fire, however, the trailer was a total loss."

Since losing her home, Heyboer has received tremendous support from her fellow employees at Cumberland Manor and from area busi-

Shari Ferguson, office manager of Cumberland Retirement Village, said Heyboer is still in need of appliances, linens, kitchen ware, dishes and glasses.

Heyboer said the most difficult losses from the fire are the memories in a box that are now gone forever. "The only picture my family had of my brother Jerry, who died at the age of 26, was destroyed. Pictures of my kids were also destroyed," Heyboer says.



ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE

Alzheimer's disease currently affects about four million Americans. Approximately 1/2 of all nursing home beds are occupied by patients with Alzheimer's disease and 100,000 people will die of this condition annually. Alzheimer's disease will affect about 10 percent of senior citizens over the age of 75. Currently, there is no cure for Alzheimer's disease.

The major symptoms of Alzheimer's disease are progressive forgetfulness, social withdrawal, errors in judgement, decreased knowledge of current events, and inability to make simple calculations. Over a period of months to years, the patient's ability to function in activities of daily living deteriorates. Language disturbances often occur leading to rambling speech patterns, loss of ability to express thoughts clearly, and even total lack of speech.

In this case, a buy-sell agreement, funded with life insurance and disability buyout insurance and paid for by the business, guarantees a buyer. Such a buyer would have the money to purchase the business at a "going-concern price" and would be forced, for all practical purposes, to convert your business into cash for your heirs.

In summary, then, the businesss is often the greatest asset of a Sole Proprietor. Helping this asset to grow and preserving its value in case of death or disability and at retirement should take priority in all business planning. The future successful successors of any business do not grow on trees. Whether family members or outsiders (i.e., key employees), they have to be selected in advance and groomed for a number of years. Ways to achieve "fairness" among children are possible. A will and an adequately funded buy-sell agreement will go a long way toward seeing to it that you leave your business in style.

Section 1. Grant of Gas Franchise and Consent to Laying of Pipes. Etc. Subject to all the terms and conditions mentioned in this ordinance, consent is hereby given to Michigan Consolidated Gas Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Michigan (the "Company"), and to its successors and assigns, to lay, maintain, operate, and use gas pipes, mains, conductors, service pipes, and other necessary equipment in the highways, streets, alleys, and other public places in Sections 6 and 7 of the Township of Grattan, Kent County, Michigan, and a franchise is hereby granted to the Company, its successors and assigns to transact local business in said Sections 6 and 7 of the Township of Grattan, for the purposes of conveying gas into and through and supplying and selling gas in said Sections 6 and 7 of the Township and all other matters incidental thereto.



Lowell Red Arrows sting Yellowjackets, 27-16

Friday night was a re-birth of a rivalry that started in the

Some 92 years and 53 games later the the Red Arrows and Yellowjackets met again. This time at Burch Field.

The result was the same as that first Lowell home game back in October of 1900, the Red Arrows left the field victorious. Then the score read 11-0. Friday night it read 27-

"Lowell and Greenville was a great rivalry and nothing happened tonight to prevent that rivalry from continuing." Greenville coach Paul Engel said.

The last time the two teams met was in 1983, Greenville held the upper hand then, 16-8.

However, in the season finale for both clubs Friday night. Lowell fired its "Catlin(g) Gun" 16 times in earning its fourth win of the year to go against five defeats.

Phil Catlin led a balanced Lowell running attack, as he rushed for 111 yards and scored one touchdown. The Red Arrows came out strong as its offense marched

the ball 70 yards in 10 plays with senior Jim Inman taking it in from six yards out, giving Lowell an early 7-0 lead. "That was a great first drive for us," Lowell coach Phil

Christensen said. "However, I think we let up a little bit after that and Greenville came back at us."

Actually, the Yellowjackets took advantage of a Joe Minier interception at the Lowell 13 yard line. Todd Baxter returned the interception to the Red Arrow five. Three plays later, Justin Colby took it in from two yards out. Greenville grabbed an 8-7 lead when the extra point snap was fumbled and then pitched to Zak Kemp who ran it into the endzone.

The score remained 8-7 until the third quarter. Then, on what Engel called the key play, Greenville's Jon Leslie completed a pass to Kemp over near the Red Arrow sideline, and the ball was knocked loose on a jarring hit by Lowell's Rob Kennedy. Greenville coaches questioned whether or not it was a completed pass. "That play changed the momentum," Engel said afterward.

The Greenville coach was right about that. Lowell turned that fumble into a seven play, 66 yard touchdown drive. Catlin did the scoring honors from 13 yards out, thanks to some tremendous blocking by Lowell's offensive line. Aaron Stencel ran around the right end for the two-point conversion, giving Lowell a 15-8 lead.

If the turnover that ended Greenville's first possession of the second half was big, than Chad Masengale's fumble on the Lowell seven yard line was larger than life. It stalled Greenville's best drive of the evening, and in all liklihood, prevented the Jackets from tying the score.

To Lowell's credit, it made Greenville pay for the mistake. The Red Arrows, executing Christensen's smash-mouth style football as well as they have all year, marched 93 yards in 11 running plays. Jim Inman capped the drive on a 24-yard burst over the right side. For Inman it was his second score of the evening. He finished his last high school game with 11 rushes

for 71 yards. The score gave Lowell a 21-8 lead.

"We had people in the right spots on that drive, Lowell blocked them," Engel said. "Lowell's success on that drive wasn't because we were missing assignments, it's because they made good plays."

Lowell made it 27-8 three minutes later, following a George Ponchaud interception. This time it was Joe Minier running the ball 20 yards for the score.

Greenville then added a touchdown in the final minutes against Lowell's second unit defense.

"Our defense played a heck of a game against a team that has good skilled players," Christensen said. "Our boys have played tough all year. The Wyoming Park game is the only game we

felt we were out of."

For Christensen, a 1969 graduate from Greenville, the win was special. "Yeah, it's nice to beat your old school. I played with Justin Colby's father back in 1968," said a nostalgic Lowell coach.

Lowell held Greenville to 51 yards rushing on 23 carries. In the air Greenville was 12-of-19 for 153 yards with one interception and one touchdown.

The Red Arrows rushed for 291 yards on 49 carries. Through the air Lowelll was 0-for-2.

Greenville finished the season at 2-7.

Lowell finished up winning four of its last five games.

Ltem #5. REQUEST TO MICHIGAN AERONAUTICS COMMISSION TO ASSIST PAVING THE LOWELL CITY AIRPORT MAIN RUNWAY. City Manager Pasquale stated the Airport Board has been interested in providing improvements to the Lowell City Airport. He added the Board is in the process of completing an airport Master Plan along with resolving obstruction problems near Lincoln Lake Rd. A key element to the improvements is the asphalting of the main runway (12-30). In viewing the future development of this facility, the sphalting is a high priority of the Board. The estimate for the paving, which includes a 300 foot runway extension, NAY: 0. is \$168,480. The Michigan Aeronautics Commission can provide a 50% grant toward these improvements. Roger Brown, Chairman of the Airport Board, stated there are several funding options to supply the local share. These include hangar incomes, fuel sales, tie down rentals and the current airport fund balance of \$13.000. He noted that there are hangars that will become property of the airport in the future and will enerate additional revenue. In addition, there is an airport parcel of land by Vergennes Road worth approxi mately \$20,000 - \$25,000 that could be sold. The possibility of a grant from the Look Memorial Fund along with corporate donations is also being explored.

In order to assemble the local financing, a commitment for a State grant is necessary. The Aeronautics Commission will consider this request at its November 18 meet ing, assuming Council approval of the application. Councilmember Thompson questioned how much money

he Airport owes for the improvements to the airport including the new hangar and road improvements. City Manager Pasquale responded the downpayment for the hangar built in 1990 was paid out of the airport fund along with the road improvements. Roger Brown stated a loan was taken out with the State of Michigan in the amount of \$36,000. The hangar to be built this fall will have a \$40,000 loan. Brown added the hangar rentals pay the loan, taxes and insurance plus generate \$1,500 - 1,700 to the Airport. Thompson stated that the City needs to sure that the Airport is self supporting.



Item #4. DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY - RESOLUTION OF INTENT AND SETTING PUBLIC **HEARING DATE ON CREATION OF AUTHORITY (11/** 16). City Manager Pasquale explained that there have been several informational meetings sponsored through the Chamber of Commerce several informational meets ings sponsored through the Chamber of Commerce since the last City Council session concerning the Downtown Development Authority. A proposed district boundary has been proposed by a study committee and a map was presented.

City Attorney Richard Wendt discussed what is involved regarding the legal requirements to form a DDA. He stated the first step in the process is the passage of a Council resolution of intent and setting a public hearing date to establishing a DDA. The purpose of the publishing hearing scheduled Monday, November 16 is to consider an ordinance whether a DDA should be formed and to establish boundaries of a downtown district. After the public hearing, it would be appropriate for the Council to consider adoption of the ordinance. A major portion of the work involved will be completed by a nine member authority board in preparing development and tax increment financing plans.

Wendt stated the district should include the downtown area of a community in order to prevent the deterioration of the property, improve property tax values, and to create economic growth. He concurred with the proposed district which included Main Street from Division to Alden Nash and involved industrial properties such as Chadalee Farms, Metric Manufacturing, Newell and King Milling. The proposal to include the Flat River islands to Attwood Corporation was not considered






