Car/bus accident shows need for public awareness

No injuries incurred when car fails to stop for school bus unloading students

Wet roads and a misunderstanding of the law may have been the cause of an accident Thursday on M-21 just west of Settlewood. The accident involved two cars and a school bus.

"Some police officers tell me that these types of accidents are occurring more frequently, people just don't realize that the red flashing lights mean all motorists must stop," said Larry Mikulski Bus Superintendent for Lowell. "It looks to me like the second car was expecting the first car to keep on going."

Mikulski went on to explain, "until the public is more educated, either by law enforcement officials or some other organization, this kind of accident will happen more frequently. Only next time some child may get hurt."

Citizens voice concern over new sidewalk along North Hudson

Want or need? That was the main question citizens of Lowell had for the City Council in regards to a proposed sidewalk along the east side of N. Hudson.

The sidewalk would include 31 parcels of land covering almost 3,220 ft. The total cost is estimated at \$35,000, \$10 per foot for a new walk and \$12 per foot for replacing old and cracked sidewalk already in place.

City officials have proposed that property owners assume all of the cost. Payment of the sidewalk can be paid in full or over a five year period, with a seven percent interest charge on the unpaid balance.

The sidewalk placement program is part of a five year plan by city officials to outfit the community with sidewalks in areas of need.

For the past three years the city has assisted home owners in building sidewalks along the area with the understanding that a larger sidewalk would be built joining all properties along the east side of N. Hudson.

The one question citizens wanted answered was "Does the city want the new sidewalk to improve the looks of the city or is there a definite need for it?"

City officials claim that with the new high school coming, traffic along the street will increase and students will need the sidewalk.

City Councilmember William F. Thompson said the new sidewalk would "accommodate the children who need it to get to school safely."

Citizens were concerned that the opposite would happen and a new sidewalk would be an increased safety hazard for children, as well as ruin the aesthetic appearance of homes.

"If young children have to cross the street a serious accident could occur because of the traffic," said Dan Phillips, of 1028 N. Hudson.

Roger Brown, of 724 Riverside Dr., said that "uprooting hedges and trees would ruin the aesthetic quality of homes along the street."

Citizens in favor of the sidewalk cited a need for it because currently, kids ride their bikes or walk in the road because no sidewalk is in place.

After hearing citizens comments the council adopted a resolution to obtain bids for constructing new sidewalks and prepare a special assessment roll.

A second hearing will be held before any construction is to take place. If enough citizens along both sides of N. Hudson oppose the sidewalk project it may be tabled.

AAA urges planning to halt fire tragedies

Because home fires already have claimed the lives of 20 Michigan children this vear, AAA Michigan urges homeowners to develop an effective escape plan to help prevent further tragedies.

"The most important step a family should take is to remove any barriers in the home that would prevent quick evacuation in a fire," said AAA Michigan Community Safety Services Manager Jerry Basch. "We strongly advise against placing security bars over windows unless they can be easily opened from the inside, especially by chilmeans greater emphasis on outside the home to make sure smoke detectors, fire extinguishers and family evacuation planning.'







Last week I explained the circumstances that plopped me down in the front row of the first class cabin on a DC-10 from Chicago to San Juan. A fog delay in Grand Rapids had my traveling companions and I running about six hours behind schedule and flying on stand-by status. In an extremely rare stroke of good luck, I ended up in first class on the packed flight. Typically, my luck would have me bumped from the flight completely and traveling to San Juan on a bus.

I was served an icy cold fresh orange juice in a stemmed glass as we awaited departure. A wave of guilt swept over me as I thought of my traveling companions shoehorned back in coach class. It took me a while to shake this feeling . . . at least two or three nano-seconds.

As the plane taxied to the runway, the captain came on the intercom with some flight information that he thought would be of interest to the passengers. One little tidbit that stuck in my mind was the take-off weight of the fully loaded DC-10. Anyone in their right mind knows that it is physically impossible to get 410,000 pounds into the air. I managed to find comfort in the fact that in my front row, first class seat, I'd die at approximately the same instant as the idiots in the cockpit, who actually believed they could get that much aluminum (old beer cans), people, baggage and jet fuel airborne.

After burning off approximately 200,000 pounds of jet fuel roaring down the runway, we were airborne and winging our way to San Juan. I soon discovered that, as an added plus, the fellow in the seat next to me was German, and spoke very little English. This meant I would be spared the typical small talk usually babbled back and forth among airline passengers. No boring accounts of some guy's job as a traveling artichoke salesman. No heavy political talk about the Clinton's cat. And best of all, no pictures of grandkids to pretend to ogle over.

Our charming flight attendant brought around menus. That's right, menus! There were several selections of entrees, salads and desserts. There was even a wine list! And, it wasn't your typical airline fare, like vessel mystery meat and fried mush. We had choices like Caesar salad, Beef Wellington and ice cream sundaes with a selection of toppings. I ordered linner, got another cup of excellent coffee in a china cup, not styrofoam, and settled into my book, trying very hard to put my traveling companions' coach class dilemma out of my

Finally, my curiosity got the best of me and I wandered back into coach class. It looked like a Haitian refugee boat back there. I finally spotted one of my buddies sandwiched between a big fat guy and a woman with an infant on her lap. The fat guy looked like he might have a good case of B.O. and the baby definitely needed a diaper change. My friend was

doing remarkably well under the circumstances. He was snoozing, and had a slight glow around his nose. There were several empty vodka bottles on the tray in front of him and more stuffed in his shirt pockets in case he woke up.

Content that everyone was doing okay, I returned to my big leather seat just as they were serving my salad. After dinner they started the in-flight movie. I leaned my seat way back, put on the headphones, kicked my feet out and enjoyed the show. I felt like the movie stereotype of the guy who sneaks into the boss's office, puts his feet on the desk and lights up a big cigar.

The movie ended and the captain announced we were beginning our descent into San Juan. The flight attendant brought around steamed towels for us to freshen up with. The next thing I knew, we were on the ground and taxiing up to the gate. I grabbed my carry-on bag and bounded down the gantry well-fed, well-rested and fresh as a daisy.

I met my friends (the boat people) in the terminal. For some reason their attitude wasn't on a par with mine, so I kept a comfortable distance from them. For one thing, I didn't want to take a bunch of guff about my good fortune at getting a first class upgrade. For another thing, the friend I'd checked on during the flight smelled suspiciously like a dirty diaper.



"CRIME VICTIMS' RIGHTS STRENGTHENED

No crime package is complete until it addresses the rights of crime victims. The Michigan Senate did just that last week through the passage of its Crime Victims' Rights Package. The eight bill package, guided by Senator William Van Regenmorter, passed by an unanimous vote. It follows action last month, which saw the Senate pass a crime package that would give law enforcement the tools it needs.

Under the package, crime victims receive a greater amount of consideration by the justice community. The eight bills strengthened the Crime Victims' Rights Act of 1985 in many

ways. For example: Prosecutors would be required to consult with a victim before plea negotiations with the criminal are finalized.


· Courts would be required to ensure the payment of restitution for crime victims before any other court orders fines or costs.

· Increases the assessment that defendants must pay upon conviction to ensure that crime victims are fully funded by the criminal, not the taxpavers.



Item #1. DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY - CONSIDERATION OF ORDINANCE APPROVING DEVELOPMENT AND TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PLAN - PUBLIC HEARING. Robert Pfaller, Dean Lonick and Dr. James Reagan were recognized as members of the Downtown Development Authority as the public hearing was opened. City Manager Pasquale explained the Downtown Development district, which was established last November, encompasses the Main Street area from Division St. to the West City limits including industrial properties such as Chadalee Farms, Newell, Metric Manufacturing. Root Lowell and King Milling. DDA was strongly supported by the Downtown mer-

Priority will be placed on streetscape work (decorative sidewalks and lighting) along Main Street from Amity to Division. Additional projects proposed include: parking lot improvements and upgrading, property acquisition and demolition and Riverfront improvements along the

Pasquale explained that tax increment financing is the vehicle for funding the improvements. Property tax revenue increases within the downtown area are diverted from the general units of government (such as School District, City and County) to the DDA for funding these improvements with 1992 as the base year. All revenue increases (except for school bonded debt) whether by market value adjustment, new construction or additions would be placed in a fund in order to provide improvements. Pasquale added the captured SEV has been reduced \$259,800 from \$1,354,600 to \$1,094,800 to reflect the assessment roll after Board of Review. This would provide \$67,612 in captured tax increment revenues. Assuming 3% growth, revenues over a 20 year period have been calculated to \$1,798,326.00. The option of bonding had been discussed with a maximum of 80% of anticipated revenues needed to utilize this

Pasquale explained if the property tax/school finance reform proposal is passed on June 2, assessment increases would be limited to 5% or the rate of inflation whichever is less (3% in 1993). Under this proposal DDA's which have a contractual agreement (bond) in place by October 1, the State would guarantee monies for debt service. Pasquale mentioned that the City's tax increment revenues would be greatly diminished under the proposal. Bonding would be a necessity to undertake improvements. He added that this plan does not propose any new taxes. However, it is a diversion of newly added property tax dollars to pay for public

Some residents expressed their concern that their homes were included in the DDA district. Pasquale responded that the number was limited as much as possible. However, state law has mandated that district property borders must be contiguous. James Barber, 318 King, questioned what the advantages of the project would be to the residential properties. Pasquale stressed that there will be no additional taxes required and that future improvements from the DDA could benefit the residences. Arthur Warning, owner of property located at 104 E. Main St., supported the DDA and the improvements that it will provide. He did caution that such projects should be carefully planned. Pasquale said the

chants seeing this as promoting their investment. He added it is a cooperative effort between City government and business. Pasquale emphasized that projects will be carefully planned and involve property owners. Barbara Barber, 318 King, mentioned the continuing problem of youth loitering along Main Street. Police Chief Emmons responded that improvements have been made and the Police are continuing to address the problem. Mayor Maatman closed the public hearing.

Item #2. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS GA-RAGE - CLEAN UP OF FUEL STORAGE AREA. City Manager Pasquale explained that the Council approved an expenditure last year to remove underground fuel tanks behind the Public Works Garage on South Hudson St. During the course of the tank removal, leakage was discovered. At that point, the City sought assistance in analyzing the extent of the spillage and to plan to remedy the site. North Garfield Excavating of Wyoming subcontracted with TMI Environmental Services of Mt. Pleasant to provide an analysis and a remediation plan to be forwarded to the Michigan Department of Natural Re-

Tim Smith, Ed Higuera, Tom Coppola and Karl Kramer of TMI Environmental were in attendance to address the Council. Higuera explained that as the excavation proceeded, it was noticed that a gasoline smell associated with the soil was presented. At 12 feet in depth, under ground water was already contaminated with gasoline. Once the water is reached, it begins to move off-site. At that point, the ground water must be quickly captured and cleaned as well as the soil.

Higuera explained the next step involves the development of a purge system. This includes a recovery well (four inch) system with activated carbon. Extraction of ground water is proposed to be captured at 5 gallons per minute. Higuera added this is an interim measure for the ground water which will capture the contamination and keep it contained. At that time, if sufficient capacity exists the contamination will be discharged either through the City's Wastewater Plant or the storm drainage sys-

Item #6. COUNCIL COMMENTS. Councilmember Green said that the Parks and Recreation Commission, at their April 17 meeting, received a recommendation from the Pool Committee (a group of Lowell area residents considering options for a future swimming pool) to leave the King Memorial Pool closed for one more year After that time, it will be decided whether to construct a year-round indoor pool or provide a new outdoor pool at a different location. All options available to the City should be investigated before eliminating the present

Councilmember Thompson questioned if the pool was well secured against trespassers. City Manager Pasquale said the pool is secure being empty. However snow and rain does catch on the bottom of the pool. Councilmember Hodges added there is the danger of ground pressure in the winter months. Some water is needed in order to hold the bottom in the ground. Director of Public Works Siciliano added the fence around the pool is secure. Councilmember Green felt that the Parks and Recreation Commission, prior to the construction of a new pool, wanted the funding for the maintenance as well as the initial construction secured. It was the general consensus of the Council to accept the recommendation.

Item #7. MANAGER'S REPORT. City Manager Pasquale reported on the following:

A. City Manager Pasquale said that the Mayor Ex change visit to Rockford has been scheduled for Tuesday,

B. The April agenda and March minutes of the Light and Power Board were presented.

C. City Manager Pasquale said on Thursday, April 15, he met with Rise' Rasch of MDOT, David Groenleer of the Kent County Road Commission, Fritz Esch and Larry Mikulski (Transportation Director) of the Lowell Area Schools to discuss a possible traffic light at the M-21-Alden Nash-Bowes intersection. From the meeting, several conclusions arose:

- MDOT would not approve a traffic light without evidence of sufficient volume of traffic. A light would not be installed ahead of the new high school completion.

Bowes must be relocated to match Alden Nash. This requires engineering, land acquisition and construction

- The Road Commission will handle needed improvements on Alden Nash.

- MDOT would consider a flasher light as an interim measure. This would delineate the intersection.

- With limited State funding, the City may wish to fund some of the intersection widening on the M-21 legs. This would expedite the project, instead of waiting for State funding.

Pasquale recommended that the proposal for preliminary engineering design on Bowes Road relocation be secured. Possible routes for Bowes would be examined as well as construction costs provided.

Councilmember Thompson questioned if the City should wait for a traffic count to determine if there is a need for a traffic light. Pasquale felt there will be a need for a signal. He wanted to know what the construction and land acquisition costs would be.

It was the Consensus of the Council to seek preliminary engineering cost estimates for the Bowes Rd./M-21 intersection.

D. In discussing the issue with City Attorney Richard Wendt, Pasquale said that the revenue and special assessment bonds will be separated for the northeast side work. It is estimated that \$525,000 in revenue bonds and \$56,000 in special assessment bonds will be sold. This will assist in the recapture of General Fund expen ditures spent in the project. A bond resolution will be prepared for the May 3 meeting.

E. Two Economic Stimulus Projects were submitted to the County Community Development office on Friday April 16. This included the intersection widening of South Hudson and Bowes (\$30,000 City share, \$30,000 County) and west side water main work (\$127,000).

A walking program is an easy program that you can begin after checking with your doctor about exercising. All you need to participate is a watch and a pair of comfortable shoes. Begin by deciding where to walk and pick a course that is relatively flat to begin with. You may find that the track at the local high school or an indoor mall is the best area.

Ask a friend to walk with you. Studies show that people who participate in exercise with other people are more apt to continue exercise than those who exercise alone

Remember to drink plenty of fluids and don't overdo it, especially in the beginning. Let your body adjust to exercising. In the summertime, exercise earlier in the morning and later in the afternoon to avoid the hottest period of the day.

If you have more questions about the right exercise program for you, see the doctor.





Recently, the buyer of my vehicle was in an accident and killed himself and the driver of the other car. Since the vehicle's title was never transferred from my name to the buyer's name, do I have any liability problems?

JONATHAN SAYS: No. Under Michigan law, the owner of a motor vehicle who has made a bona fide sale of the vehicle by transfer of title" and has delivered possession of the vehicle, along with the Certificate of Title properly endorsed to the buyer, will not be held liable for any damages thereafter resulting from negligent operation of the vehicle by another.

Since you delivered not only the vehicle but the endorsed Certificate of Title over to the buyer at the time of transfer, his failure to have the title of the vehicle transferred to his name would not impose any liability on you.

DEAR JONATHAN: Recently, I moved from California to Michigan. Presently, I have a holographic will which I wrote while in California. My question is whether I need to prepare a new will under Michigan law or if my present holographic will would be considered legal. I have become a legal resident of Michigan if that makes any difference in your

JONATHAN SAYS: The holographic will (handwritten will) you prepared as a resident of California would be considered valid in Michigan, provided that the will was deemed valid when executed in California. Therefore, as long as holographic wills are recognized in California and you have included all of the necessary elements to make that will valid in California, then the holographic will should be accepted here in Michigan.

Since you know what a holographic will is, I am assuming you were given some direction on how to prepare it and that you included the necessary elements to make it valid under

He said that having the trust will allow his estate to avoid being probated. He also said that having the trust would avoid the imposition of any taxes at his death. Is

JONATHAN SAYS: Yes and no. Any asset which is titled in your name alone at the time of your death has to be probated before it is transferred to the appropriate beneficiary. One way you can avoid having your assets probated is by implementing a revocable living trust and transferring your assets from yourself individually to yourself as trustee of your living trust. Many people think that by simply setting up the trust that their estates will automatically avoid probate. But in addition to setting up the trust, you have to actually transfer your assets to the trust prior to your death.

However, although assets owned by your revocable living trust will avoid having to be probated, those assets are not exempt from taxation. This is a common misunderstanding many people have. The reason assets in a revocable living trust are subject to taxation at death is because the person who set up the trust had total control of those assets during his or her lifetime and benefitted from those assets during his or her lifetime. As a result, from a tax standpoint, you will be treated as owning those assets at the time of your death.

Upon death, there are two types of death transfer taxes to which the assets in a revocable living trust may be subject. The first is a federal estate tax. However, this tax only comes into play if the total taxable estate is over \$600,000.

The tax that most people will have to contend with is the Michigan inheritance tax. This is a tax on each beneficiary's right to receive property from a decedent's estate. The amount of the inheritance tax depends upon the relationship of the beneficiary to the decedent. For example, a niece or nephew who receives a gift of \$25,000 from a decedent will be assessed a much higher inheritance tax on the gift than a child who receives a gift of equal value.
