Tri County area voters tip the scales in Proposal A defeat



Gubernatorial candidate Representative Howard Wolpe said Michigan people saw through Proposal A.

"It was Governor John Engler's effort to provide tax cuts for the largest property owners and tax increases for just about everybody else," Wolpe said.

School Districts and local politicians in the Kent County rebutted that area Wednesday's voting results provided two separate views of the world. It divided Michigan into two separate states.

Of the 83 counties that participated in the June 2 election, 70 of them passed



Proposal down.

The total number of votes tallied in the 13 counties was percent (876,043) of those Proposal A and 13 voted the 1,055,377. The Tri County

area, Macomb, Wayne and Oakland accounted for 83

Of the 13 counties that voted down the proposal, there were a total of 724, 984 "no" votes. Wayne, Oakland, and Macomb accounted for 627,816 of those "no" votes or 87 percent.

There were 330,393 "yes" votes in the 13 counties, the Tri County area accounted for 248,227 of those or 75 percent.

Of the 1,163,528 "no" votes statewide, the Tri-County region cast 54 percent of them. Macomb, Oakland and Wayne Counties made up 40 percent of the total voting populous.

The Tri County area defeated the proposal 72 percent to 28 percent.

The rest of the State passed Proposal A 59 percent to 41 percent.

"Voters learned that the "Us vs Them" mentality goes much deeper than the legislature," said Representative Jack Horton of the 73rd House

Vindicated in Victory

41 votes gives Township the go ahead on Light Industrial development

Vindicated in victory.

That's how Lowell Township Supervisor, John Timpson described his feelings Thursday morning following the approval of the highly contested Proposition I rezoning issue.

"I'm pleased the community has seen fit to agree with the decision of the Township board," Timpson said. "The vote of the Township people gives us a reasurrance that we are doing the right thing."

The right thing Timpson refers to is the rezoning of approximately 206 acres of land located in Section 28 at the northwest corner of I-96 and M-50 from Ag-1 and Ag-2 to light industrial.

The developer of the approximately \$30 million light industrial site is Bob Grooters. One of the three or four companies interested in the site includes Lowell's ITM. The company's future plans include building a 100,000 square foot corporate machining facility.

Silent Observer on the murder of their daughter/sister, and the John Timpson family looks and hopes for immediate gratification.

Then, when hours, which seem like days and days, which seem like weeks, pass without a word, their hearts and minds are stirred once again.

It seems unfair that a family which has endured the tragic death of one of their loved ones, must also endure the roller coaster of emotions through the process of seeing that the murderer is brought to justice.

doesn't seem to be working fast enough, the family has walked the streets of the inner Eastown, stapling, tacking and taping 700 wanted posters of a composite sketch of the suspected murderer.

Teresa Beachum, sister to Suzanne Timpson-Wittenbach, also spends time talking to the tots of the inner city pleading with them not to carry and/or use guns. Their answer is "no, no we won't." Yet, it was not that long ago that the murderer of Suzanne was the age of those kids.

"We are not spending the money to provide child care for the mothers of these kids, so they can hold a job, and so When the judicial process their kids can get a better

education. As they grow older, the young teenagers of the inner city need to be trained so that they can hold a job with local industry and not have to resort to violence, crime and robbery," Beachum explains. "We need to put the money up front instead of waiting until the end result."

As Beachum has learned, often what jail has to offer three dinners a day, clean clothes and a roof overhead is better than what many had while out of jail.

the inner city, I've talked to people who are under fire all the time. It's like a small Bosnia, but people are using handguns instead," John Timpson said. "People should

be able to walk the streets without fear. Why should they have to hide from thugs."

Luscombe said she currently pays \$120. If the new amendment passes she would pay \$575.



"Captain Memorial Day" . . . alias, Mike Lindhout! Somehow, I just don't think D.C. or Marvel Comics are going to pick up on this one like Superman, Batman or Captain America. For one thing, doing stupid stunts out of boredom on a cold, cloudy Memorial Day doesn't have the class of fighting crime in Metropolis or Gotham City. Nor does Captain Memorial Day's alter-ego of a goofy college kid with a summer job at the phone company have the ring of, "Clark Kent ... mild-mannered reporter for the Daily Planet." Sorry Mike, I'm afraid your fame and fortune as Captain Memorial Day will begin and end right here in the Cozy Corner. But, as fame goes, that probably ranks right up there with having your name mentioned on the outdoor page of the Grand Rapids Press for catching a big carp in the Flat River.

This publicity fetish with Lindhout, a friend of my daughter, dates back several years to a column a wrote about him draping my house and trees with toilet paper. Every time I'm around him, he does stupid stuff in a desperate attempt to again gain fame in the Cozy Corner. It's kinda' the same thing my dog does, only I don't think Thor consciously does stupid stuff to get into my column. He's just stupid. Of course, I sometimes have to wonder about Lindhout.

Out of respect for his parents, who I know to be quite normal, I ignored Lindhout's antics and pleas for several years. I finally caved in and wrote about some of his exploits while vacationing with us in Florida last Christmas. That did it. I created a monster.

Last week I wrote about being trapped at our cottage with what seemed like hordes of my kids' friends over that particularly cold, rainy, nasty Memorial Day weekend. By Monday, we were all a little stir-crazy. Out of a fit of boredom I told Lindhout I'd put him in the Ledger if he'd jump off the top

railing of our deck onto a stack of big inner tubes we use to float the boat lift out to deep water. It must be a good fifteen feet to the ground. I don't know how I came up with the idea, but it just seemed like the thing to do at the time.

A stunt of this magnitude does require some planning and hoopla. We outfitted Lindhout in an old crash helmet I still

have from my high school motorcycling days. Yes, that makes it very old, but no, it's not leather. Surprisingly, they had invented fiberglass back in those days. A red, white and blue semi-circle bunting we hang on the cottage for Memorial Day and the 4th of July became a cape. Before our eyes, Lindhout became "Captain Memorial Day." In his plaid boxer shorts, cape and gold metal-flake helmet, he cut a rather ridiculous figure. Perfect for the stunt he was about to attempt.


After much pre-jump hoopla, akin to the publicity leading up to Evel Knievel's rocket-powered motorcycle jump over the Snake River Canyon, the big moment arrived. Two of Lindhout's friends steadied him as he stood atop the deck railing, my daughter was at the ready with a camera and I searched my pockets for my car keys so as to be ready for the trip to the emergency room.

The jump itself was almost anti-climatic. I had insisted he dive off head first and belly-flop onto the stack of tubes. Instead, Captain Memorial Day jumped feet first, hit the tubes on his butt, bounced once, landed on his feet in the grass and ran across the lawn. No broken bones. No cuts. Not even a scrape. Very disappointing.

Not satisfied, Captain Memorial Day looked for other adventures. He eventually settled on going down a slide my neighbor has placed out in the lake for his grand-kids. It's in about a foot of water. Captain Memorial Day went down the slide head-first on his belly. His gold helmet glistened in the sun. His cape streamed from his out-stretched arms. My neighbor was hollering a warning, "Don't go head-first, you'll break your neck!" He belly-flopped into the chilly water, stood up, took a few bows then headed for the warmth of the cottage and dry clothes. That was the last we saw of Captain Memorial Day.

He may not be a famous crime fighter in the comic books, but Captain Memorial Day did a great job of fighting off the boredom of a cold, blustery, rainy holiday. I hope you're happy Lindhout. You're famous again.



A NEW TREATMENT FOR MIGRAINES

It is estimated that 18 million women and 5.6 million men over the age of 12 suffer from severe migraine headaches. Migraine is not a synonym for "bad" or "severe." Migraine is a very specific type of headache usually caused by a dilation of the blood vessels to the brain. Migraine is typically a throbbing pain, usually on one side of the head, causing nausea and/or vomiting, and resulting in a photophobia (intolerance to light). Once the diagnosis of migraine has been established, the thrust of therapy becomes two fold: 1) Use of a medication to abort the acute onset of the headache. 2) If the headaches are consistently recurrent, a prescription of a preventative medication to limit or abolish the recurrence of

While there have not been many new advances in the

prevention of migraines, a new agent to be used to abort an acute attack is showing promise to many migraine patients. This new agent, sumatriptan (Imitrex) is now available in the U.S. as an injectable preparation. It is a prescription product. and comes in pre-packaged syringes for easy administration. After the injection is given the onset of relief from headache occurs in 10 to 15 minutes. Fifty percent of patients show relief in 30 minutes, more than 80 percent show relief within 24 hours, and 60 percent become pain free at two hours. A repeat injection can be given if no substantial relief is obtained with the initial injection.

Some side effects may accompany the use of sumatriptan. and certain disease states (i.e. coronary artery disease) may prohibit its use in selected individuals. For migraine sufferers this agent offers considerable promise in the management of

"PROPOSAL A FAILS: BACK TO THE DRAWING BOARD"

If there is one thing Michigan taxpayers have asked for repeatedly over the past several years, it's been property tax relief. And with property tax rates hovering about 30 percent above the national average and 1993 assessment increases averaging 11 percent statewide, that's understandable.

I was disappointed in the failure of Proposal A. I believed the proposal to be a good effort toward addressing the double problem of high property taxes and inequitable school funding. It was a credit to the schools and taxpayers of Kent County that it passed so overwhelmingly in our area.

However, considering its failure statewide, I strongly believe the people of Michigan are telling their elected officials Dear Ledger: they want a tax cut - not a tax shift. A cut that provides real tax relief to homeowners. The Senate has led the Legislature on overexcept the screaming and this issue and must continue to work toward this as a solution. the capital improvement

It is also very clear, based on polling results and discussions with both the "Yes" and "No" voters, that they feel that we as a state need to make better use of the educational dollars as an instrument of commuat our disposal. They expect us to do a better job educating our nity information. children with the money we have. Voters know that just

funneling more money into the schools won't deliver results without real reform. A good first step would be to formulate a cost containment and educational quality plan.

Another hurdle to clear is the mistrust many voters have for government in general. While I believe this is a problem to some extent, there was a lot of support for the proposal in the areas of the state where lawmakers really go out and promoted "A." We as legislators and state leaders must continue to work to improve the image of our government through our actions and words.

To solve the property tax and school finance problem will be difficult. We've tried two different ballot proposals in eight months. The first offered a straight property tax cut, but voters turned it down. Even though reimbursement to schools was assured, opponents of the plan spent more than \$1 million convincing voters the cut was not paid for and would result in deep cuts in essential state programs and loss of funding to

Next, we put together a bipartisan plan supported by a wide coalition of groups that provided a significant property tax cut and more equitable funding for public schools. This plan had a funding source that would have guaranteed at least \$4.800 for each student. Still, voters turned it down.

The answer won't be easy. State government has been grappling with this issue for the better part of a quarter century. All we can do is start again and attempt to forge a solution that the whole state can live with. Despite "A's" defeat, we must not lose sight of the need to reduce property taxes so that new jobs can be attracted to Michigan and, at the same time, recognize the need to reform our educational

These issues will be our top priority in the months ahead.

Item#1. 1993-94 BUDGET-PRESENTATION, PUBLIC HEARING AND SETTRUTH-IN-TAXATION HEARING (6/7). As an introduction to the public hearing, City Manager Pasquale explained the following main components of the proposed 1993-94 Operating budget:

A. The millage rate proposed is dependent upon the outcome of Proposal A, a state property tax/school finance reform constitutional amendment proposition. Voters will decide its fate on June 2. A key element of the proposal is the limiting of property assessments to 5% or the rate of inflation, whichever is less.

If the proposal fails, the City would collect \$869,953 (6.7% increase at 13 mills) in property tax revenues. With \$947,500 needed to meet budget, over \$67,000 would be required (with a \$10,000 contribution from the DDA). In order to meet the shortfall, the millage must be increased from 13 to 14 mills.

A passed ballot proposal would reduce assessment Noonon responded that no increases have been allotted increases to 3% for the coming year. This would limit for with the operating budget. Thus, the City's only property tax revenue to \$821,168 (1.5% increase). The alternative would be reducing services or discontinuing shortfall would be over \$126,000. A millage increase employee pay increases from 13 to 15 mills is then required



School officials meet to discuss options following A's defeat

By Thad Kraus Lowell Ledger Editor

Grand Rapids Schools Superintendent Jeffery Grotsky recommended Friday that. rather than making more budget cuts in light of the defeat of Proposal A, he will recommend that the district shut down early in 1993-94.

Less than 24 hours before that announcement, Lowell Superintendent Fritz Esch and school administrators met to discuss the different possibilities available to the district in dealing with a \$1.7 million deficit that stares it in the face for the 1993-94 school year.

Esch said that the \$1.7 million figure assumes the Headlee will fail. The Headlee is worth 2.3 mills to Lowell Schools and/or \$800,000.

The Lowell Superintendent said, how the school will deal with the deficit has not been decided. "We will wait and see how things fallout in Lansing before making a de-

To keep operations the way they currently are and to avoid cuts, the Lowell School District would need the Headlee to pass and for area voters to approve a two mill hike. Esch made it clear that was just one option in dealing with the deficit. "There are several options depending on what Lansing does."

What will Lansing do? It could try again with Proposal A. with or without adjustments. There is the Team 14 legislation, which is a cut and cap program that substitutes state sales tax for an increase in state income tax.

There's the grass roots O-K Proposal, or the legislators

could go ahead and impose a raise in state income tax. Senate House Majority

NOTICE

In Compliance With Title IX and Section 504

INFORMAL PROCEDURE

The person who believes he/she has valid basis for complaint shall discuss the concern with the appropriate coordinator within 30 days. The coordinator shall reply to the complaint in writing within two (2) days. If this reply is not acceptable, formal procedure steps may be initiated.

FORMAL GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

Step 1: A written statement of the grievance shall be prepared and signed: The complainant shall present it to the appropriate coordinator within five (5) business days of receipt of the written reply to the informal complaint.

The coordinator shall further investigate the matters of the grievance and reply in writing to the complainant within five (5) business days by certified mail.

Step 2: If the complaintant wishes to appeal the decision of the Coordinator, he/she may submit a signed statement of appeal to the Superintendent within five (5) business days after receipt of the local Coordinator's response to the grievance. The Superintendent shall meet with all parties involved, formulate a conclusion, and respond in writing to the grievance within ten (10) business days by certified mail.

Step 3: If the complainant remains unsatisfied, he/she may appeal through a signed, written statement to the Board of Education within five (5) business days of receipt of the Superintendent's response in Step 2. In an attempt to resolve the grievance, the Board of Education shall meet with the concerned parties and their representatives within fifteen (15) days of the receipt of such an appeal. A copy of the Board's disposition of the appeal shall be sent by the Board's secretary to each concerned party within ten (10) business days of this meeting by certified mail.

Step 4: If, at this point, the complainant remains dissatisfied, further appeal may be made to the Office of Civil Rights, U.S. Department of Education, Washington, D.C.

"Art Expression Day sends kids off for summer with the knowledge they can have wonderful, creative days on vacation through the world of art."


