# Cuts bring school financing crunch home to Lowell

School Board asks community to help focus on passing the Headlee Waiver in Aug. - 4 community forums set up for public

Hearing no splendor or magnificent swelling about the reductions being proposed to help balance the 1993-94 budget, incoming senior and scheduled marching band drum major, Ryan Pawloski asked the school board that he and the senior class not have to sit and listen to a tape of "Pomp and Circumstance."

Pawloski was referring to the proposed cut of the music program if the Headlee Waiver does not pass on Aug. 24.

again. Making cuts does not give them any initiative to act. Preserving our programs will move them. This will put them on the edge, not the

cutting edge," Beers said.

The motion supported Former Board member unanimously by the Board, authorizes Superintendent Fritz Esch to make necessary reductions in the school work force and services and to take official action notifying affected staff in terms of the master agreements.

The reduction would reflect a savings in expenditures of \$1.38 million. The other bailing the legislatures out \$300,000 of the \$1.7 million

would come from fund equity.

In the area of general certified reductions there would be a total savings of \$102,000. This will include the elimination of the Director for Curriculum and Instruction held by Jim White. He will be re-instated without additional bumped to an elementary principal and Paula Murphy, Alto's Elementary Principal, will be bumped to a teaching position.


Elementary certified reductions will total \$168,000. There will be \$196,000 in Middle School certified reductions. High School certified reductions will total \$290,000.

Non-certified work force reductions will total \$292,000 and service program reductions will add up to \$334,000 (see the charts on page 8 as to what will be re-instated if the Headlee Waiver passes and what would not be re-called or revenue).

Pete Gustafson asked that the Board consider putting on the Aug. 24 ballot a proposal to raise the millage so that the school could keep its programs at the same level as last year.

Board Vice President Marcia Wilcox said the board has kept semblance of the edu-

## Discretionary measurements comforting for **Ericksons'** canine clan

How many dogs are too many?

Lowell's City Council decided except in a kennel as permitted by the City's zoning ordinance, no person shall possess, harbor, shelter or keep more than three dogs other than dogs under six months of age born to a female dog under the care, custody or control of a person.

It seems that discretion is not only the better part of valor, but it may also be the better part of the ordinance amendment limiting the number of dogs per household.

John and Lucille Erickson told the Council at the July 6 meeting that they won't get rid of any of their four dogs, and the Council can't take away something that they already have."

City Manager Dave Pasquale said that the existing ordinance on dogs said nothing about a limit on the number of dogs allowed.

City Attorney Dick Wendt did tell Pasquale that police would be allowed to use discretion over particular cases in this ordinance amendment.

The Ericksons would represent a particular case. Lowell Police Chief Barry Emmons said his department has never had a complaint about

The Ericksons have had said. four dogs (Buffy, Snoopy, Cindy and Babe) for the past three-plus years. "There have been no complaints and the Erickson said.

Erickson's terrier and beagle stay in the house while the shepherd and short-legged shepherd mix stay in the wash room in the back of the house.

"In my 17 years as animal patrol officer there was never a limit on the number of dogs," Erickson said. "In fact, I went to Police Chief Emmons years ago and told him something needed to be done about the packs of dogs that were running around Lowell."

SHINGLES

Shingles, also known as Herpes Zoster is an irritating outbreak of sores on the skin caused by the same virus that causes chicken pox. Shingles occurs when the varicella-zoster becomes active in a person who has harbored the virus in the body after having chicken pox several years earlier. Most of us have had chicken pox as children. After the rush of chicken pox resolves, the virus moves into nerve cells next to the spinal cord where it can lay dormant for many years. Later in life, some trigger can occur which allows reactivation of the virus resulting in Shingles.

Shingles outbreaks occur as sores most often appearing in a band like distribution along one side of the trunk or face. Shingles outbreaks usually occur in people over the age of 50 peaking between 60 and 80 years of age. No one knows what the exact trigger is that initiates a shingles outbreak, but most feel that physical or emotional stress may weaken the immune system leading to an outbreak. People with weakened immune systems as in patients with AIDS or those receiving chemotherapy, are at increased risk of experiencing an outbreak.

Shingles usually start as a burning, tingling or numb sensation starting around the trunk on one side in a band like distribution. Occasionally one may also experience flu-like mptoms. Lesions usually appear a few days later which become blistered and finally ulcerate to form scabs. The scabs finally heal after a few weeks. Unfortunately a common complication of shingles is post herpetic neuralgia - continued pain at the site of the resolved outbreak. About 50 percent of people over the age of 60 may experience this painful complication after a shingles outbreak. This pain can last for weeks to several months and is often difficult to treat.

Treatment with newer antiviral medications and occasionally steroids are used to help prevent persistent pain of a Zoster outbreak - this is especially useful in patients over the age of 60. If you think you are experiencing an outbreak of shingles you should see your doctor as soon as possible so that these medicines can be started right away. If the shingles outbreak occurs on the face affecting one eye your doctor will usually refer you to an opthalmalogist so that special eye medications can be prescribed to decrease the likelihood of damage to the

A person with shingles cannot cause an outbreak of shingles by contact with another person. However, if a person has never had chicken pox, close contact could possibly cause chicken pox in the susceptible individual. Therefore, pregnant women and others who have not ever had chicken pox should avoid contact with a person who has shingles until the lesions are well healed.
