## Cuts bring school financing crunch home to Lowell

School Board asks community to help focus on passing the Headlee Waiver in Aug. - 4  
 ● community forums set up for public

Hearing no splendor or magnificent swelling about the reductions being proposed to help balance the 1993-94 budget, incoming senior and scheduled marching band drum major, Ryan Pawloski asked the school board that he and the senior class not have to sit and listen to a tape of "Pomp and Circumstance."

Pawloski was referring to the proposed cut of the music program if the Headlee Waiver does not pass on Aug. 24.

"I've been in band all my

life, it's taught me team work and leadership," Pawloski said. "I want to be in band my senior year, don't take it away."

There was a lot of that same sentiment echoed for a number of other programs offered in the Lowell School District from the over 200 concerned citizens in attendance Monday night at the July Lowell Board of Education meeting.

"Before the Board cuts any more from athletics, the Athletic Boosters Club asks that the board confer with us. The Boosters has money in its budget and could help minimize

any additional cuts," said Mary Stone.

"I don't and many in this room do not support cuts, but we support looking at other options," Deb Anchors said. "How can we change the mind of the Board?"

Former Board member Linda Beers strongly encouraged the Board and those present to focus on changing the attitude of those in Lansing. "The problem is at the state level. Making cuts in our quality program let's our state legislatures off the hook. We must let them know that quality is important, instead of bailing the legislatures out

again. Making cuts does not give them any initiative to act. Preserving our programs will move them. This will put them on the edge, not the cutting edge," Beers said.

The motion supported unanimously by the Board, authorizes Superintendent Fritz Esch to make necessary reductions in the school work force and services and to take official action notifying affected staff in terms of the master agreements.

The reduction would reflect a savings in expenditures of \$1.38 million. The other \$300,000 of the \$1.7 million

would come from fund equity.

In the area of general certified reductions there would be a total savings of \$102,000. This will include the elimination of the Director for Curriculum and Instruction held by Jim White. He will be bumped to an elementary principal and Paula Murphy, Alto's Elementary Principal, will be bumped to a teaching position.

Elementary certified reductions will total \$168,000. There will be \$196,000 in Middle School certified reductions. High School certified reductions will total \$290,000.

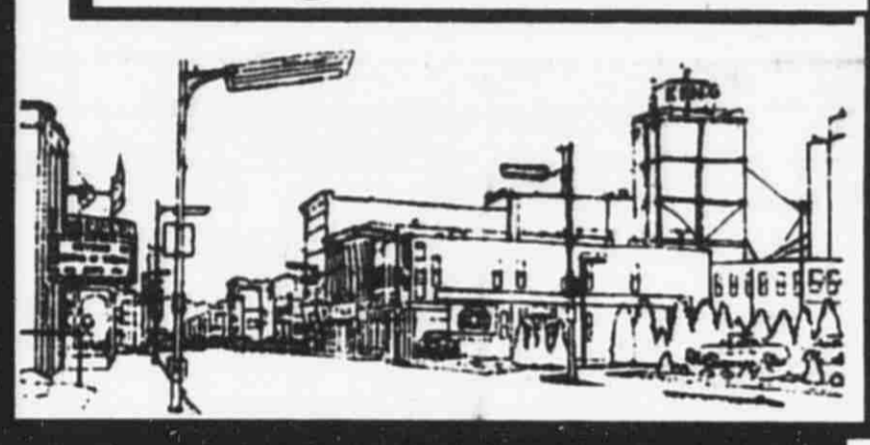
Non-certified work force reductions will total \$292,000 and service program reductions will add up to \$334,000 (see the charts on page 8 as to what will be re-instated if the Headlee Waiver passes and what would not be re-called or re-instated without additional revenue).

Pete Gustafson asked that the Board consider putting on the Aug. 24 ballot a proposal to raise the millage so that the school could keep its programs at the same level as last year.

Board Vice President Marcia Wilcox said the board has kept semblance of the edu-

### Discretionary measurements comforting for Ericksons' canine clan

How many dogs are too many?

Lowell's City Council decided except in a kennel as permitted by the City's zoning ordinance, no person shall possess, harbor, shelter or keep more than three dogs other than dogs under six months of age born to a female dog under the care, custody or control of a person.

It seems that discretion is not only the better part of valor, but it may also be the better part of the ordinance amendment limiting the number of dogs per household. John and Lucille Erickson told the Council at the July 6 meeting that they won't get rid of any of their four dogs, and the Council can't take away something that they already have."

City Manager Dave Pasquale said that the existing ordinance on dogs said nothing about a limit on the number of dogs allowed.

City Attorney Dick Wendt did tell Pasquale that police would be allowed to use discretion over particular cases in this ordinance amendment.

The Ericksons would represent a particular case. Lowell Police Chief Barry Emmons said his department has never had a complaint about

Erickson's dogs.

The Ericksons have had four dogs (Buffy, Snoopy, Cindy and Babe) for the past three-plus years. "There have been no complaints and the dogs don't run loose," John Erickson said.

Erickson's terrier and beagle stay in the house while the shepherd and short-legged shepherd mix stay in the wash room in the back of the house.

"In my 17 years as animal patrol officer there was never a limit on the number of dogs," Erickson said. "In fact, I went to Police Chief Emmons years ago and told him something needed to be done about the packs of dogs that were running around Lowell."

Emmons told him to do

what's right. "I did," Erickson said.

Lucille Erickson said they treat their four dogs better than most people treat one. "To have to give up one dog we couldn't do it. They are all very close to us," she said.

Ericksons added that one of their dogs has cancer and that they won't replace it when it dies.

Pasquale said Wendt's findings will be reported to the

Council on July 19. "Basically it will be to keep the Council aware of what's going on. But I expect the issue will be resolved. I see no reason to push the issue especially since discretion is allowed in particular cases," he said.

John Erickson said if it had to, he would get a kennel license, but he emphasized he would not get rid of any of the dogs.

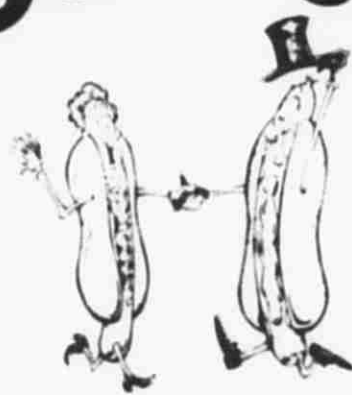

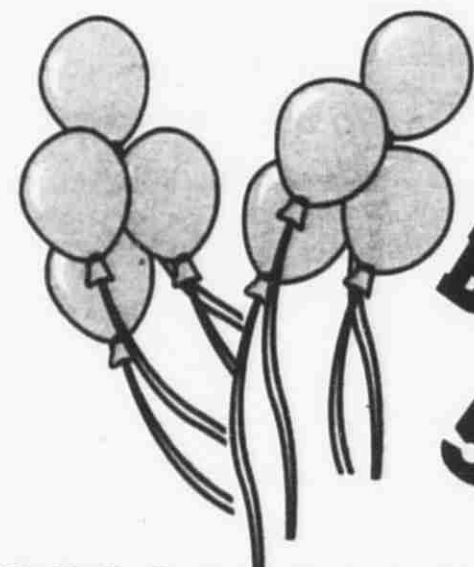
