Orval McKay, family practitioner for over 40 years, served patients and community well

For 40-plus years, he served the people of Lowell through his family practice at 1150 Hudson St. and the entire community through his willingness to become involved in the community as a leader and team player, and through the spirit of volunteerism.

Orval I. McKay M.D., aged 73, died Tuesday morning at

Butterworth Hospital with his family beside him.

"I have never met a man who gave more to individuals and a community than Orval McKay," said an emotional Ray Quada. "Receiving the honor of "Person of the Year" becomes that much more important to me, knowing that Dr. McKay received the award (1989)." McKay was a doctor, chairman of the Look Committee, member of the Lowell Light and Power Board, the Lowell Planning **Dr. Orval McKay** Commission, the Charter Commission, and Airport Commission, and he pursued an active professional life that involved regular visits to the sick and injured at Butterworth Hospital along with regular visits to nursing homes and facilities.



Esch resigns making room for a fresh, new approach to lead changing district After 11 years of service to the Lowell School District, superintendent says his 12th will be his last

Dr. Francis Esch, who has served the district as Superintendent for the past 11 years, announced early Tuesday morning through a press release that his 12th year would also be his last.

Lowell School Board President Ray Quada announced that the board had received and had chosen to honor the request of Esch to resign from his position with the school district effective June 30, 1995.

Esch, who was on his way to Detroit to visit Bushnell teacher Vic DeWaard (being treated for leukemia), was not available for comment.

Quada did say Esch's decision is based upon his belief that the district has experienced significant growth and change over the past five years and that it is now time for the school system to move ahead with new direction and under new leadership.

"Esch indicated that the district had reached a point that with the changing tide in the district, now was the time for someone new to come in and lead the school system," Quada said. Through his written statement Esch said, "During my 11 years of service to the Lowell Area Schools, the board of education has given continued support, guidance and unselfish commitment of personal time to me and my administrative staff. The board members' leadership style of continued support and encouragement have made the successes of the past 11 years possible." Esch explained. "Lowell Area Schools has an excellent teaching and support staff along with a dedicated administrative staff. I am grateful for the opportunity I had to be a member of such a fine educational team."

includes buying out the last year of his contract (salary will remain the same); purchasing three years of universal buy-in credit to Michigan Public School Employee retirement system; remitting the cash value to Esch in cash, annuity or a retirement account; the school will also carry life insurance (\$100,000 policy) on Esch through 1996; and it has agreed to pay out for accrued vacation to a maximum of 60 days.

"The board appreciates Esch's willingness to remain dur-

ing the upcoming school year. his presence will assure continuity to the organization during an important year to the district," Quada said.

In Esch's 11 years of service to the district, Esch has led the system through many difficult periods.

"Esch restored pride in our schools, fostered improved learning, implemented a school improvement program even before it became part of the school law, initiated strategic planning, successfully negotiated fair Dr. Fritz Esch and equitable employee contracts, and led the district through many successful millage campaigns," Quada added. Esch's most significant contribution to the district was the highly successful \$30 million bonding election for the renovation of our existing school buildings and construction of the new Lowell High School.

School district insurance pools are popular in cost-containment era

••• Lowell may join in August if the price is right

The hot phrase in Lowell and many other school communities these days is "cost containment."

Mention insurance and shortly thereafter the words containing costs arise.

School district pools (there are four throughout the state) are avenues by which 75 percent of the schools (500 plus) are saving dollars in the areas of insurance.

Tom Madke, account executive with the national risk management sales division of the Arthur J. Gallagher Insurance Company, says there are currently 17 schools which are members of the protector self-insurance pool in Kent County.

The rates that the pool is able to offer each school varies due to the number of students, automobiles, teachers, buses, trucks, private passengers and property value. The individual school

rate is also largely determined by a school's "loss" history (claims paid for vehicle accidents, windstorms, fire, theft and fall and/or slip).

All these variables, Madke said, make it difficult to compare schools in an effort to come up with an approximate price for a prospective member.

"I can tell you this, all the schools in the pool have saved money," Madke said.

Corrine Toth, secretary to the assistant superintendent for business at Kentwood ,confirmed Madke's statement. "Kentwood is saving money in the areas of building and liability," she said. "We estimate that Kentwood is saving 10-15 percent per year as compared to a conventional plan." Kentwood has been a member since the pool's inception three years ago.

"Right now the pool is working on putting something together for workmen's compensation," Toth said. Madke

added that he hopes it can be in place by July 1 for its pool members.

The pool looks for members it would like to invite to join. Schools interested in joining the pool are then required to fill out an application.

The criteria used to decide whether or not a school will be accepted includes its loss ratio and its loss prevention risk-management policy.

The pool has made it known to the Lowell School District that it would like Lowell to join the pool. Lowell in turn has filled out an application. Madke said a bid will be presented to Lowell by the end of May.

"It is then up to the school as to whether it wants to make the switch before its current policy runs out," Madke said. "Most schools' policies run out in July,"he said.


I was issued a speeding ticket last week. A "County Mountie" clocked me at 68 in a 55. I was out doing what it seems like I'm doing all the time. That is, beating my butt up and down the road making sales calls. It was an open stretch of road, a beautiful day and practically no traffic. When the oncoming cruiser popped up over a hill, I immediately glanced down at my speedometer. I hoped the cop might be of persuasion that allows the working man a few extra miles per hour under such conditions. No such luck.

"Good morning, officer," I said in a cheery voice as I handed him my license. I was hoping that being polite and cheerful might help. If I'd known he wasn't going to give me a break, I'd have said something like, "Hey, donut breath. Why aren't you out fighting real crime instead of preying on hard working taxpayers? Don't you clowns know we're the ones who fill that trough you feed at?" That's what I should have

It had been over two years since my last speeding ticket, so I'm sure his computer showed I didn't have any points on my driving record. Apparently he didn't think it ought to stay that way. When he handed me the ticket, I said, "No such thing as a warning any more?" He told me he'd given me a break and wrote the ticket for 65 instead of the actual 68. That saved me a point and five bucks. "Gee, thanks!" I said with all the sarcasm I could muster. I drove away fuming.

This incident got me thinking. (Oh, oh, we're in trouble now.) My guess is a huge percentage of tickets issued are just like the one I received the other day. That is, a few miles over the posted speed limit on a clear, dry day on open roads. In in heavy traffic or bad road conditions, but watch out for the other words, "easy pickin's" for the cops.

In the past year, the Michigan Legislature has passed landmark reforms to help prepare our youngsters for the challenges of the future. To ensure schools are fully funded and students have more choices, we've tackled school finance and education reform. To help break the cycle of poverty, we've supported welfare reform. To make our street and schools safer, we've passed tough anti-crime proposals.

But lawmakers are not the only Michigan citizens trying to make a difference. Across the state, communities are getting involved. This Wednesday, nine of my Senate colleagues and I took a bus trip to Detroit to learn more about three programs rooted there. Each of these programs is striving to improve the future of the city's most valuable resource-its youth. The day was unforgettable; an enriching learning experience.

Our first stop was at Wayne State University, where we met with President David Adamany and enjoyed a presentation about the WSU University School. As many of you know, Wayne State was the first college to establish a charter school It opened last September, in inner-city Detroit. We spent time with some of the students and staff to better understand the school's programs, goals and progress.

To say the least, I was impressed. These children are so excited about learning, so proud of their school. Imagine what our state would be like if all of our schoolchildren felt this way? Visiting Wayne State's charter school is a great testament to the whole idea behind these academies.

Our school visit was to the highly successful Alternatives for Girls, a non-profit group that aims to help homeless and high risk young women by getting them off the street. AFG was founded in 1986 by a group of neighbors and members of St. Peter's Episcopal Church. The founders were concerned about the increasing number of girls and young women who were out of school and on the streets, often serving as prostitutes to make a living.

AFG makes contact with young women through its Street Outreach program. Using a van as a mobile base, a team of trained volunteers and staff patrols the street of southwest Detroit offering food, clothing, shelter, crisis intervention and transportation to medical centers.

Item #1. GROVE - HIGH STREETS WATER AND SANITARY SEWER IMPROVEMENTS.

A. PUBLIC HEARING ON THE CREATION OF THE SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT AND ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION DETERMINING TO MAKE IM-PROVEMENTS. As discussed in previous meetings, a special assessment district was considered for water and sanitary sewer improvements on a portion of High and Grove Streets. Estimates were provided to extend 130' (to serve three properties) of water main and 500' (to serve six lots) of sanitary sewer. City Manager Pasquale said the public hearing was the first step in the process to consider the special assessment district. If approved, the City would prepare plans to bid the

Patrick Bailey, 186 Grove, stated that he was not in favor of having sewer installed for the vacant lot behind his home. Bailey stated his lot is small, consisting of woods, stumps and brush. He said the assessment would amount to more than what he paid for the lot. Bailey said that he currently has sewer and water for his home serviced from Avery St. Director of Public Works Art Gall stated if the utility is placed in front of the property, it is common for the property owner to be special assessed. Kenneth and Joyce Thuston, owners of the property located at 224 Grove, mentioned that they were not in favor of water and sewer being installed for their rental property. Thuston stated he could not justify increasing the rent on the property to cover the cost of the special assessment.

Mrs. Thuston questioned if the project was being funded solely by the property owners or whether the City was paying for a portion of the cost. Pasquale stated the project would be paid by the property owners in total. Mrs. Thuston thought she wouldn't be able to recover the cost for the assessment. Mayor Maatman responded if in two years the septic fails, then what will the value of the property be. Thuston questioned how the cost figures were arrived for the project. Pasquale said these costs were based on Department of Public Works and professional engineering estimates. The project would be brought to bid and the costs could be less than estimated.

Councilmember Thompson stated if Bailey must run his water to prevent lines from freezing during the winter, shouldn't the City repair the problem with this project? City Manager Pasquale said the City is currently examining several areas in need of repair on the east side. Councilmember Shores stated she felt that City services would enhance the price of property in the long term.

NOTICE TO PARENTS First Day Immunization Exclusion Policy **Effective At The Beginning of the** 1994-95 School Year

Effective at the beginning of the 1994-95 school year, a first day exclusion policy will be in effect. This is supported by Sec. 9208 of the Public Health Code which reads:

"A parent, guardian, or person in loco parentis applying to have a child registered for the first time in a school in this state shall present to school officials, at the time of registration or not later than the first day of school, a certificate for immunization or statement of exemption under section 9215. A teacher or principal shall not permit a child to enter or attend school unless a certificate indicating that a minimum of 1 dose of an immunizing agent against each of the diseases specified by the department has been received and certified to by a health professional or local health department. A parent, guardian or person in loco parentis having a child registered with only these minimum doses of immunizing agent shall present an updated certificate of immunization within 4 months after initial attendance showing that the immunizations have been completed as prescribed by the department."


