# Preliminary financial audit report shows encouraging fund balance

The 1993-1994 Lowell School District audit will indicate a higher than expected fund equity which was unveiled in a preliminary presentation of the Lowell Schools' financial audit report.

Interim Superintendent Dick Korb said the higher than expected fund equity came about as a result of underexpending a conservatively projected budget.

Since the June - adopted budget, Korb said the school has operated under the premise that it would have a \$1.2-\$1.3 million fund equity and a deficit of \$728,000.

With the preliminary audit, which the school board will vote on at the Nov. 14 meeting, school officials learned that it will have an undesignated fund balance of \$1,901,847. This is an increase of \$569,194 over the previous year's undesignated fund balance of \$1,332,653.

Lowell's fund balance of \$1,901,847 as of June 30 represents 10.66 percent of the projected general fund expenditures for the 1994-95 school year. Saurman said that the

district should maintain an eight-10 percent fund balance with 10-15 percent not considered excessive.

Lowell Schools is presently budgeted to tap into that fund balance of \$728,000 for the current school year. The final figures are in the process of being verified by the district's business manager, Dale Folkert, and will be presented in a revised 1994-95 budget in December.

"We will be doing a more frequent and comprehensive job of updating the budget throughout the year and communicating its status to the board and community," Folkert said. "This will allow us to more closely monitor potential savings."

The last budget was completed in June of 1993. It was amended in January of 1994. "Sometimes there is more than one amended budget, it depends on the year," Lowell business manager Dale Folkert said.

Korb pointed out that the planned use of a portion of the fund equity has been reduced through cost-cutting measures. These include the bidding of property and liability insurance and workman's compensation in-

surance; administrative reorganization; replacement of retiring and non-retiring and non-returning staff; and health insurance (MESSA) premium savings of nine percent over the previous year.

The cost-savings in these areas will be outlined in the revised budget presentation in December.

Despite the higher than anticipated fund equity, the school will continue to operate under the notion of a \$1.2-\$1.3 million fund equity. "We are still going to do that," Korb said." We will also continue to attempt to reduce the deficit."

Korb noted that in years past, it has been common for schools to overestimate their expenditures and to underestimate their revenues.

"Times have changed though; it is now necessary for schools to sharpen their pencils and be closer to actuality," Korb said.

In a preliminary presentation of the financial audit report to the Lowell School Board Finance Committee Nov. 2, auditor Phillip W. Saurman gave Lowell Area Schools an "unqualified opinion" which is the highest opinion an auditor may issue.

# Bieri family grateful for community support

Medical prognosis for Art Bieri not encouraging

Recently a beloved member of the Lowell community met with an accident that has residents asking, "Why?"

On Aug. 29 Art Bieri was struck by a deer that had been hit and catapulted by an oncoming car. Bieri was in the passenger side of the front seat and his wife Jan was directly behind him. No one else was injured in the accident.

Art was lifted by Aero-Med to Butterworth Hospital for treatment. During the testing and treatment, he suffered both respiratory and cardiac arrest. While CPR brought him back to life, he was without oxygen up to seven minutes, causing extensive brain damage. Since then he has not regained consciousness and according to Jan, the medical prognosis is not encouraging.

"Art is receiving physical therapy five days a week, but is not responding. The therapy he is receiving is good, but his injuries are just too severe," said Jan Bieri.

Jan wants the citizens of Lowell to have the proper information on her husband's injuries, his prognosis and to inform them of her gratitude for their support.

"Many of you have expressed your grief and bewilderment that life should treat such a wonderful man so unfairly. If God takes him, we are secure that it will only be our loss and that he will be safe with his heavenly father," said Bieri. "We may never know the reasons but we are sure that God knows best."

She said his physical injuries are apparently healed and it pretty much looks like Art is sleeping.

"He receives many loving visits, but we are uncertain of his level of awareness. We are thankful that he probably is not in any great pain," said Bieri.

She encourages residents to visit Art. He was moved to room 101 in the Grand Valley Health Center, 4118 Kalamazoo SE. The visiting hours are 8:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. If you call the Bieri residence the day before and leave a message on the answering machine, Jan will meet you there or have someone there to meet you.

DuPage County consists of 38 cities and townships and has a population of roughly 830,000 people. It is just west of Chicago and is considered one of their collar counties.



### CANKER SORES

Why do we get canker sores? This is a common question of those who tend to get them recurrently. The answer remains: no one really knows. What we do know is that about 20 percent of Americans suffer regularly from these tender shallow ulcers that affect the mouth's mucous membrane lining. Some people swear that they get them from eating spicy foods, or during periods of stress. Some women claim that they get them

What researchers still believe is that canker sores are caused

by a virus. Some claim that they are due to a transient deficiency in the immune system. The fact is that canker sores are not contagious, that they tend to run in families, and that no one has turned up a germ that would be responsible to support the idea of an inherited immune system weakness.

Depending on the severity of the canker sore, treatment is usually symptomatic only - avoidance of foods which bother, hydrogen peroxide/water gargles, tylenol for pain. Some overthe-counter medications (ask your pharmacist) also may help. For the more severe cases, cortisone may be necessary to subside persistent, very inflamed canker sores.



Johnson's war on poverty. His weapon of choice was the establishment of the welfare system; a system created with the intent of ending its own usefulness by eliminating the enemy-

As we know, government welfare has caused more poverty than it has eliminated. Americans have poured nearly \$5 trillion into welfare programs since 1965, only to see welfare rolls swell and program expenses skyrocket. During the same time period, federal, state and local government welfare spending has increased eightfold.

Citizens across the nation have criticized the system for discouraging people from seeking work, encouraging families to split up and providing no road maps for getting off the system and staying off.

Few public leaders have missed the public's message.

During the 1992 presidential campaign, President Clinton acknowledged the need for change, pledging he would "end welfare as we know it" if elected. Although he has taken no definitive action to reform the current system, I hope he still intends to fulfill that campaign pledge.

Fortunately, state and local leaders are not waiting and are able to get to and from a job or school more easily. making inroads into significant reform. We've seen it in Wisconsin; we've seen it in Pennsylvania. Most of all, we've seen it right here in Michigan.

We have made significant changes to Michigan's welfare system in the past four years. We eliminated general assistance for the able-bodied, reserving help only for needy parents and those with disabilities. We also established the Social Contract, which offers welfare recipients a job or job training, an education or community service opportunities.

This comprehensive program, initiated by Governor Engler is the only statewide welfare initiative in the nation. It has already saved state taxpayers \$22 million (Michigan is the first state in the country to report savings from welfare reform).

Most importantly, the waivers enable us to make participation in the Social Contract mandatory. During the first year, those who don't participate in the Social Contract will be referred to either the MOST program or to Work First. These programs provide job training, education, transportation and child care.

Work First, which I told you about in August, is a new initiative aimed to move welfare recipients into the job market as soon as possible. The program focuses on matching client We have made progress. Today, nearly 25 percent of skills with the market's specific needs.



For the past five years, Hagen has collected hundreds of Colleen Hagen is a surgeon who works with many breast devices and elixirs that claim to have healing powers. Hagen takes these devices and speaks to medical and senior citizens' groups in hopes of stopping them from purchasing the cures.

"The people who sell these items prey on the elderly and terminally ill. It hits them the hardest because they are on set incomes and can't afford to throw money away," said Hagen. "These people aren't being stupid; it's just that they are afraid and sometimes are too polite to hang up or say no."

One particular instance that Hagen has revealed includes the case of a man in the 1930's and 40's who would place goat testicle glands into a man to help him become more virile. The man reportedly earned his medical degree in the mail for \$100 and made over \$8 million before he was finished.

Many people don't believe that these cons and scams take place today, but Hagen said there is a portion of society that still falls for these miracle cures.

Groups that are preyed upon today include cancer victims and AIDS patients as well as cases of baldness and poor

DEAR JONATHAN: I started my own business a few years ago. Just recently my business has started to pick up and will need to begin hiring a few people in the very near future. one of my concerns is how to properly interview a job candidate. I know there are certain questions that cannot be asked by an employer when interviewing a job candidate. Can ou give me some guidelines on what types of questions I

IONATHAN SAYS: You are right to be concerned. If you sk questions which are considered unlawful when interviewng a job candidate, you could expose yourself to a discrimination complaint or lawsuit. To minimize this problem you want to make sure that you only ask questions which are llowed under the law.

Generally speaking some of the types of questions or nquiries you should avoid asking or making are as follows: Do not ask the applicant:

1. His/her original name. Instead ask the applicant his/her

2. Her maiden name.

3. His/her birthplace. 4. The birthplace of his/her parents, spouse or other close

5. His/her age or date of birth. You can ask the applicant if she/he is 18 years or older if this age is a legal age requirement

6. His/her religious denomination or religious affiliations 7. His/her complexion or color of skin.

8. For a photograph.


JONATHAN SAYS: Assuming you are an adult, you need to file a petition to change your name in the county of your residency. In that petition, you have to indicate who you are and what name you want to change your name to, the reason for making the change, that the change is not sought for any fraudulent intent and that you have been a resident of your county for at least one year. You must then file the petition with the probate court. At the time of filing the petition, the court will schedule a hearing which must be at least 14 days from the date of filing the petition.

The next step is to publish notice one time in a newspaper of general circulation that there will be a hearing held on your petition to change your name. The purpose of this notice is to alert any interested party that you are going to change your name so that if they have an objection they can appear at the hearing and be heard.

At the time of the hearing and assuming there are no objections to your petition to change your name, then the court will verify what you have stated in your petition and if it is satisfied with its findings, it will execute an order changing

Your costs will include a filing fee, a publication notice fee and a fee to receive a certified copy of the order changing your

I recently returned from a vacation in Land 'O Lakes, FL. The town is 25-30 miles north of Tampa. It is also where my sister and her family call home. It is also where I can get free lodging thus allowing myself more money for the fun stuff while on vacation.

While I was down there, I spent an afternoon at a place called Gatorland with sis, her three kids, husband, friend of the family and my younger brother.

Gatorland sounds like a kids' park where they walk around and look at crocodiles through a glass. To my surprise and delight, it was actually more than that.

Back to Marlin. These large voracious, thick-skinned long-bodied aquatic reptiles are not only big, but are also very quick by water and land. They also can jump.

I saw these reptiles weighing anywhere from 500 to 1,000 pounds propel themselves three to six feet out of the water to snatch a chicken. No, it wasn't a live chicken. However, that could have been some sight.

Prior to seeing this exercise in agility, my brother and I, along with my 12-year -old niece, broke from the clan to check out the plethora of gators and crocodiles in their natural habitat.

We came upon a crocodile resting on a small plot of marsh land. We picked some twigs off the trees and tossed them in his general direction. We were trying to startle/agitate him and get him to move. Twigs weren't going to do it. So we found a larger branch (roughly five feet in length) which would enable us to reach slightly over the wooden rail and

slap at his jaws. After about a minute of this, the croc had had enough. He lifted and turned his jaws (opened) and a small portion of his underbelly in our general direction. Discretion being the better part of valor, my brother dropped the stick and we moved on.

I have no idea how far off the ground this crocodile could have gotten, but after seeing their jumping ability in the water, it's probably a good thing we didn't find out.

As with any animal or reptile park, there is food you can purchase to feed them. We got a hold of some food and later used our leftover french fries from lunch as bait for the fish which shared the waters with the crocodiles and alligators. What we discovered was by dropping the small portion of food to the side of a crocodile's jaw, the fish (6-8 inches in length) would swim to the top to snare the food. This proved to be a very brave act on their part. What happened was the crocodiles would swing their jaws to the side the food was dropped. If the fish was not quick enough in getting the bait and getting the heck out of there, it became crocodile bait and/or lunch.



# Monies may very well decide what should be done with Bowes Road

Resolutions are nice but they don't pay for engineering or construction costs.

That pretty much seemed to be the consensus of the Lowell City Council in its discussion about the Bowes Road/Alden Nash/M-21 traffic light and related road improvement project.

The city has received resolutions from the township and school stating their interest in seeing intersection improvements made.

"Those resolutions would have meant more if the checks had been enclosed," Lowell councilman Don Green said. "The city cannot incur all the costs."

It is anticipated that a light could be installed during April or May of 1995. Design work would be implemented to determine right - of - way needs and utility relocations.

The critical step in the process is Bowes Road. Either the road must be closed off or relocated - to form a 90 degree angle

at M-21. If relocation is chosen, the light may be installed prior to the new street construction but the present Bowes Road must be closed. Lowell City Manager Dave Pasquale said the light and road projects could coincide during the 1995 construction year.

The engineering study of the intersection would include field surveying, wetland analysis, review of topographic features, soils investigation, schematic plans and detailed cost estimates. Pasquale said the optimum route along with required right - of - way would be selected. The cost would not exceed \$22,500.

"If there is no shared costs between the city, township and school, then I think the city must look at its other options," Thompson said. Those options would include leaving the intersection the way it is or a cul-de-sac.

The township and the county do not want a cul -de - sac, and safety concerns probably would prevent leaving the intersection as is.

"If safety is really an issue and \$15,000 will save lives, then let's do it," Thompson

A traffic count over an eight - hour period showed that in four of the eight hours there was a sufficient amount of traffic to warrant a light. The other four hours the traffic count was marginal.

Mayor James Maatman

said the cost for the engineering and construction (\$150,000) is a drop in the bucket to what the total cost could be. He was concerned with the cost of purchasing property on Bowes Road and the cost for replacement of wetlands.

Concilmenter Jeanne Shores said she was opposed to closing Bowes Road. "I think to do that is wasting our money. At some point it will have to be reopened," Shores said.

Pasquale concurred that relocating and keeping Bowes Road open makes sense in the long term.

Preliminary engineering for the project could be allocated from the local street fund. Funding from the city would come from the general fund monies allocated to the fire station (debt retired earlier this year) in an amount of \$35,000 -\$40,000 per year for two years. A millage increase could be used to provide the balance.

"I don't think anything should be done until there is a commitment from the township and school," Maatman said. "I agree the road should be left open, but to jump in because everyone wants something done would be wrong. Right now I think it would be premature to make a decision."

Councilman Jim Hodges added that more figures needed to be in place as well as the city's and other monies needed.

Maatman questioned why the engineering costs should be the total responsibility of the city.


Pasquale said the township was going to go to the county to see if it would share in the township's cost. "At this point, Kent County is not involved in the engineering costs," Pasquale said.
