
Bleke brought aboard as Lowell's new superintendent

A phone call late Sunday (April 30) afternoon to Lowell school Board president Marsha Wilcox reopened a superintendent search that was closed just six days earlier.

Robert Slotterback, who was chosen as the next superintendent of Lowell Schools, telephoned Wilcox to inform her that he, his wife and children would not be coming to Lowell. Instead he had decided




"It was a most difficult call I had to make to Marcia Wilcox," Slotterback said. "Marcia and the board had just been wonderful to me throughout. There were two reasons for my decision: It will be easier for my wife Kim to find work in the area of cardiac intensive care and Wauwatosa, a bigger school, offered me a substantially greater contract."


A phone call Monday evening (May 1) to Robert "Bert" Bleke, assistant superintendent for curriculum and instruction at Forest Hills Central, carried the message that the Lowell School District wanted him to become its new superintendent.

"I was shocked," Bleke said. "I just about went right off my chair."

After being informed of what had transpired over the previous 24 hours, Bleke asked for some time to think about it before making a decision.

"No one likes to finish second in a two-horse race," Bleke said. "So yes, I was disappointed when I found out Lowell offered the job to someone else. Once I got the pride out of the






