

Siciliano, former director of public works, dies suddenly in Florida

Working 28 years for one employer may lead one to believe Tone Siciliano was a company man.

Family, friends and fellow employees know that wasn't true with Siciliano - he was a true city (Lowell) man.

Siciliano, 67, died unexpectedly Saturday while vacationing in Ocala, FL.

"Tone was a real good community guy," said longtime friend Jim Hall. "He always put the city of Lowell first."


Siciliano was a city employee for 28 years. He had planned to retire at the end of the year.

He started working for the city of Lowell in 1967 at the sewage treatment plant. In 1973 he was named director of the Department of Public Works. Siciliano held that position until August of 1993.

Bob Stewart, who worked for the city of Lowell for 45 years, remembered Siciliano, the fellow worker and friend. "I couldn't have had a better guy to work with. He was a good

Cascade/Alden Nash accident leaves Grosse Point woman in serious condition

Marie Welniak, Lowell, has often heard the familiar sounds of brakes locking up, followed by the crunching sound of two vehicles colliding from her home (corner of Alden Nash and Cascade).

Those familiar sounds revisited her home Wednesday (May 31).

"I heard the semi's brakes lock up, the sound of the collision and then I saw a puff of smoke and a car leave the road and go off into the cornfield," Welniak said. "Accidents happen all the time at this intersection."

Wednesday's accident involved a vehicle driven by a Grosse Point Farms resident and a Town Air Freight semi.

Joyce Osborn, 62, Gross Point Farms, was northbound on Alden Nash when she turned west onto Cascade Road in front of a Town Air Freight semi driven by Kris Sova. He applied his brakes but could not avoid a collision.

Kelley Scott, Middleville, was a couple of cars back when he saw Osborn pull out in front of the semi. "I saw her pull out in front of him and

then I saw a puff of smoke like the anti-freeze blew."

Sova was not injured. Osborn was transported to Butterworth Hospital via AeroMed. She was listed in serious condition with head and chest injuries.

Two candidates challenge incumbents in June 12 school board election

· · · At stake in the election are two four-year terms.

Two four-year term seats on the Lowell School Board will be at stake on Monday June 12.

The two seats up for election are those of incumbents Ann Mulder and Jack Lane.

Mulder completed the final year of a four-year term won by Charlie Kohler, who was unable to complete his term. Mulder earned the opportunity by winning the one-yearterm in the '94 election. She garnered over 830 votes in that election - the most by any candidate.

Lane, school board vice president, is completing his second four-year term.

Challenging the incumbents will be Joe Barnella and write-in candidate Mary

The polls will open at 7 a.m. on June 12 and close at 8 p.m. People in the city of Lowell can vote at the administration building 300 High St. (Precinct I), Bowne Township Hall (Precinct II) and Vergennes Township Hall (Precinct III).

In 1994, along with the one-year term, there were two four-year seats up for election. In that election only 1,592 of the 12,300 registered voters voted or 13 per-

Joe Barnella has been a Lowell resident for the past 16 years. He is a Bay City Central graduate and attended DeVry Tech in Chi-

Currently he owns and operates West Michigan Computer Systems.

He is running for a seat on the board because he hasn't seen much change in the board. He also believes he can add balance.

"I believe there needs to be more responsibility to fiscal management and planning," Barnella said. "The school board needs to be more fiscally oriented and responsible to the community."

Barnella would like to see a healthier fund equity and a focus on getting back to the basics and making education the number one priority.



Item #1. PRESENTATION BY HOPE NETWORK TRANSPORTATION SERVICES. Herm DeGroot of Hope Network Transportation Services was present to propose funding public transportation for residents particularly the elderly and those persons with disabilities. DeGroot explained currently the organization serves the northern part of Kent County. To obtain a ride with the

organization, a 24 hour advance notice is required. He stated that a part of the service is financed through a grant through the Michigan Department of Transportation. The cost is \$15.00 for a wheel chair ride and \$7.00 for a standard ride. He stated that many municipalities utilize Federal Community Block Grant Funds toward

City Manager Pasquale questioned how Hope Network bills for their services. DeGroot said the municipalities are billed monthly. Each jurisdiction sets aside a different amount of funds. The following are examples: (Solon Twp \$1,000), (Plainfield Twp \$13,000), (City of Rockford, \$14,000) and (Sparta Twp, \$3,000).

Pasquale mentioned that in order to utilize Block Grant Funds a decision needs to be made early in the year as to how these funds will be utilized. Pasquale stated that Block Grant Funds have already been allocated for the upcoming budget year. The City would need to determine how it would fund the service for next year. It was the consensus of the Council to defer the decision

on funding Hope Network Transportation Services for

city residents until the winter of 1995-1996.

Item #2. RESOLUTION TO MICHIGAN LOTTERY CHARITABLE GAMING DIVISION REGARDING LOW-ELL AREA CHAMBER OF COMMERCE APPLICATION FOR GAMING LICENSE. City Manager Pasquale noted the Chamber of Commerce will hold a Riverwalk Festival during the Labor Day weekend (September 2nd and 3rd). As part of the festivities, tickets will be sold for a rubber duck race planned down the Grand River on Sunday afternoon.

In order to qualify for a permit from the State, a resolution by the City Council must be adopted stating that the Chamber of Commerce be recognized as a non-profit organization for the purpose of obtaining a gaming

Item #3. PARKS AND RECREATION MASTER PLAN - PUBLIC HEARING AND CONSIDER ADOPTION. The Parks and Recreation Master Plan document outlines the current parks inventory and proposes projects to upgrade the system. An adopted plan is required for future State and Federal Recreation Grants that the City may seek. Councilmember Green stated that at the Parks and Recreation Commission meeting held April 22, 1995, the document was recommended for adop-

to adopt the Parks and Recreation Master Plan as presented which outlines the current parks inventory and proposed projects to upgrade the system.

YEA: 4. MOTION CARRIED

Item #4. 1995-96 BUDGET - PRESENTATION AND PUBLIC HEARING. As an introduction to the public hearing, City Manager Pasquale explained the following main components of the proposed 1995-96 Operating

A. General Fund: The millage rate of 13.85 has been proposed to be retained. The City has planned total expenditures of \$1,730 million leaving a projected fund balance of \$557,645. This can be attributed to greater than expected state shared revenues. The fund balance represents 32% of the budget which is above the City's policy of 20%. Pasquale noted that there are several potential projects which could impact the fund balance including additional clean up costs due to the under ground storage tank contamination at the Public Works

B. Street Fund: There are several potential projects planned including the Bowes Rd extension. At this point, the Kent County Road Commission is in the midst of finishing an engineering plan and study. The budget has allocated \$50,000 toward the first year's cost (the total project amount spread over two budget years with a General Fund loan) to relocate the west end of Bowes Road providing a four way intersection at M-21. This would allow the installation of a traffic light.

Also, the City has proposed upgrading Bowes Rd. be tween S. Hudson and Pleasant. This road does not meet major street standards and should be widened

C. Water Fund: In order to meet increased operating costs, it was proposed that the consumption charge be raised from \$1.50 to \$1.63 per thousand gallons per month. The readiness to serve rate would increase from \$15.75 to \$16 per month. The City is in the midst of preparing calculations to determine what Lowell Township's rate will be.

D. Wastewater Fund: The user rate has been proposed to be increased from \$1.66 to \$1.80 per thousand gallons per month. The debt service charge will rise from \$10.50 to \$11 per residential equivalent unit per month. The rates were reviewed to ensure that adequate rev

enues were present to service the system. No public comments were received. A final public hear ing and adoption of the budget is scheduled for the June 5, 1995 meeting.

Item #5. CHADALEE FARMS (1400 FOREMAN) - AP-PLICATION FOR AN INDUSTRIAL FACILITIES EXEMPTION CERTIFICATE (P.A. 198) - SET PUBLIC IT WAS MOVED BY GREEN and seconded by SHORES HEARING (6/5). Robert Perkins of Chadalee Farms, Inc.

was present to request an industrial tax abatement related to the 17.334 square foot addition to the west side of the plant currently under construction. City Manager Pasquale stated that the cost of building improvements plus machinery and equipment would be \$3.685 million (\$704,000 in construction and \$2,981,000 in equip-

ment). Seventy (70) current jobs are to be retained with ten (10) new jobs to be created within two years of project completion. In reviewing the application, Chadalee Farms would qualify for twelve years of abatement under the point system adopted by the Council.

IT WAS MOVED BY SHORES and seconded by GREEN to set a public hearing date for June 5 to consider a request for Chadalee Farms for a twelve year industrial tax abatement related to the 17,334 square foot addition to the west side of the plant currently under construction. YEA: 4. NAY: 0.

Item#6. AIRPORT BOARD MEMBERSHIP COMPOSI-TION. City Manager Pasquale explained there has been previous discussions regarding the composition of the Airport Board. He noted their concerns not having enough applicants for membership and allowing nonresidents to be regular members. At its January 24, 1995 meeting the Board recommended that seven regular members, be provided, four of whom must be city residents. Currently, the Board has five regular members who must be city residents and two ex-officio

who may be residents. Roger Brown, Chairman of the Airport Board, stated that several meetings were held without a quorum. He would personally want the board to remain seven members with three who may be non-residents allowed to vote. Brown said that there was concern expressed about non city residents voting on the Board. He stressed that the Board is only advisory.

Councilmember Thompson stated that the Airport Board has done much with the airport and not only the city residents were involved.

Councilmember Green was disturbed that there could be a quorum consisting of three nonresidents and one resident. City Manager Pasquale stated that the Board works mainly on a consensus basis. He noted that a Councilmember Shores asked if the Michigan Wire perdivided vote is very rare.

Councilmember Thompson questioned if the vote of the Board could be depicted showing the votes of the city residents as well as the non city residents.

It was the consensus of the Council to have the Airport Board composed of seven regular members, three of whom may be city residents. An ordinance amendment was directed to be drawn.

Item #7. KING AND HIGH STREETS WATER MAIN IMPROVEMENT PROJECT - CHANGE ORDER NO. 2 AND FINAL PAYMENT. City Manager Pasquale stated that King and High Streets water main project has been completed and a second change order needed consider-

ation. The change order involved differences in quantities for curb and gutter placed (+ \$475), removed (+ \$125), drive and sidewalks placed (+\$4,612), and removed (+ \$771) and asphalt placed (+\$451) totalling

The total contract cost has increased to \$69,138 (original

Councilmember Thompson questioned if the City will be reimbursed from the homeowners for private work that was completed. It was noted that the contractor was paid directly from the property owners for private work done.

Item #9. CITIZEN COMMENTS. Anna Jankowski, 315 Alden Nash, requested an update on Michigan Wire. City Manager Pasquale stated that the Planning Commission did an on-site visit and reviewed the entire site on Saturday, May 6 as part of a plan review. He noted that the Commission desired to have a berm completed in the rear and trees planted 8 - 10' tall with rye grass planted Additionally, Don Fizer, owner of Michigan Wire, stated he would be willing to plant trees on Sharon Potter's (320 Alden Nash) property to accommodate screening. Mrs. Jankowski stressed that the Planning Commission should have visited her site to view Michigan Wire from her home.

Item #10. COUNCIL COMMENTS. Councilmember Thompson stated that he has received numerous complaints concerning junk in yards. Chief Valentine responded that he has taken the initiative and assigned an officer to certain sections of the City to address these problems. He is willing to work with the residents if they are willing to rectify the situation. Valentine stressed that the department will not allow the complaints to continue for six or eight months. He said this problem comes at the same time period each year and the department will address these complaints as they are received.

Mayor Maatman questioned if the restrooms had been opened at Creekside Park. Streets and Parks Supervisor Dan DesJarden stated that the plumbing is a gravity feed draining system. Water has been attempted to be blown out of the pipes for the winter. However, DesJarden explained they have low spots in the water lines that allow the pipes to freeze and crack. When the water is turned on for the spring, leaks are discovered. Councilmember Thompson inquired if the City could work to open the bathrooms earlier next year and mentioned the possibility of using temporary heat on the pipes. DesJarden stated that the plumbing is all in the attic and is difficult to install heat into that location.

Item #11. CITY MANAGER'S REPORT. City Manager Pasquale reported on the following:

A. A joint session of the City Council and the Planning Commission was held on May 8 and the Action Plan was approved by the Commission. The Action Plan provides an implementation strategy for the Master Plan.

B. The Small Business Administration tree planting grant application was submitted to the Michigan Depart ment of Natural Resources. The application provided a \$30,000 grant request for trees to be planted in the downtown. However, the program has been rescinded by the Congress and the President.

C. Mayor's Exchange Day is scheduled with a visit to the City of Fremont on Thursday, May 18. A return visit from the Fremont officials is planned for Tuesday, May 23rd. D. The City has made the final payment on the 1965 Wastewater Treatment Plant bond.

E. Three City Council positions will be open for reelection including Mayor Maatman, Councilmember Thompson and Councilmember Green. Petitions will be available in the Clerk's office for filing by June 20.

F. City Manager Pasquale read aloud a request for a street closing on Spring St. between N. Hudson and Lincoln Lake on Sunday, June 4, 1995 between 9:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. for the Congregational Church's Pentecost Sunday Worship and celebration.

By consensus, the Council saw no problem with the request.

When reviewing applicants, the board would consider the level of poverty and unemployment within the zone, the education test scores and private sector involvement in the zone's plan and design. It would also look at the municipality's commitment to providing service to the zone. Overall, a successful application would demonstrate a strong community commitment to the project, as well as outline the overall impact

of the zone on the surrounding area. I believe that, unlike other ideas, this proposal boasts vision and foresight. I've argued that what was important for urban renewal is not necessarily building casinos or stadiums, but lowering the cost of creating a job. We have an impressive tax cutting record and the tax-free zones are a bold step forward as we continue to look for ways to rejuvenate our distressed

Former Housing and Urban Development Secretary Jack Kemp, a great supporter of enterprise zones, once said: "When most people view the depressed areas of your cities, they see poverty and urban blight. But when I visit these neighborhoods, I see a vast supply of wealth and talent-but a drastic shortage of opportunities and incentives." I couldn't agree

As statewide leaders, we must recognize Michigan cannot fulfill its potential unless all portions of the state share in the renaissance. I am personally committed to guaranteeing the tax free zones gain legislative support.

School schedules a survey to gain public's views on a number of issues

The last time (March 1990) the Lowell School District conducted a community-wide survey, it was to ascertain the community's thoughts on building a new high school.

Another survey will be conducted on June 13th and 14th this time, though, it will be to measure the perceptions and attitudes of a multitude of issues.

"The school is looking to find the public's attitude and perception on where the district needs to focus," interim superintendent Dick Korb said.

Out of the 12,000 registered voters, 1,600 names will be drawn randomly. The names will be divided into four columns of 400 names each. The first person picked in column one will be called. If the person doesn't wish to participate in the survey or isn't home, then the first person in column two is called. For each of the 400 people, there are three backups.

The validity factor for the survey will be 95 percent (plus

or minus 5 percent).

The survey came as a result of a meeting of Vision 2000 chairmen. "They were asked if the school should go after enhancement mills. The chairmen said they did not recommned it. However, they thought the school should get a respone from others. From that the idea of a survey came about," Vision 2000's James Bosserd said.

It was also felt that a survey could give the school the community's perception on other issues.

The survey was put together with the help of the research and development department at the Keite Intermediate School District.

"Past documents were looked at and questions were drawn up from them," Korb said. "They address a variety of issues." They include:

How well informed the school keeps the public.

- · Where the public gets its information about the schools.
- · The level of trust in the board of education and administration.

The quality of instruction.

- · How well the school manages its money.
- The biggest problems facing the school.

A report card of Lowell Schools.

Feelings toward any potential enhancement millage.

"I think this survey can also serve as a tool for our new superintendent Bert Bleke to get a picture of community feelings," Korb said.

A combination of staff members and community volunteers (Volunteers In Action) will be conducting the phone survey. Korb said there would be 70 volunteer callers used over the two nights.
