Crystal Flash unveils plans for expansion

Pete Lazdins, architect for Design Plus, presented the site plan for Crystal Flash's proposed remodeling project.

The project will put in place a 15-door cooler on the east side of the Crystal Flash building; a storage room on the southeast side of the building; and changes to the glass store-

The two new additions which will be enclosed as part of the existing brick structure will total 477 square feet.

The convenience store will also replace the existing canopy

with a freestanding structure not connected to the building. It will also include corporate graphics on it.

The only area of concern noted by the planning commission in review of the proposed project was the off-street parking. According to the zoning ordinance the retail services store

would require 26 parking spaces. In reviewing the plan, city manager Dave Pasquale noted that 12 parking spaces were shown on the site plan, but parking can be extended along the rear lot line, and in front of the store.

Pasquale noted that the pump islands are also used as parking

spaces. In total this brings the number of parking spaces to 24. Crystal Flash, cont'd. pg. 8

First-year DDA projects to start Aug. 1

Engineers for the Broadway/Riverside city parking lot and Lafayette Street Plaza projects were given the okay to initiate construction bids.

They are part of the \$1.2 million Downtown Develop-

ment Authority (DDA) project. The entire DDA project is scheduled to begin this year with completion in

The drawings of the two projects, which are scheduled to begin Aug. 1, were provided by Design Plus.

The cost for reconstruc-


tion of the Broadway/Riverside parking lot is estimated at \$85,000. It will be paid for with DDA funds.

The cost for the Lafayette Street Plaza project is estimated at \$140,000. The Michigan Equity Grant will provide \$36,000 of the cost. The remaining \$104,000 will come

from the DDA fund.

Bids on the two projects will be presented to the DDA board for review and approval at the July 13 meeting (Thursday noon).

The downtown work (Main Street) is expected to begin in the spring of 1996.





On July 3, the Friends the Lowell Library is spon soring a used book sale at the main FMB building. There will be many wonderful books for sale. Don't be left out.


The Friends will also b sponsoring a delightful ic cream social on the lawn of the present library, on August 10, the same week as the Ken County Youth Fair.





During his State of the State address in January, Governor Engler borrowed a famous slogan and told lawmakers to "Just Do It." No, he wasn't talking about running marathons or dribbling a basketball. Rather, the governor was telling lawmakers to pass three specific tax cuts to "keep our economy strong and put money back in your pockets." Giving legislators 30 days to get the job done, he asked for an increase in the personal exemption under the state income tax, a reduction and eventual elimination of the state inheritance tax and a cut in the single business tax.

Well, it took a little longer than 30 days to finish the job, but we did pass those three tax cuts, and two others on top of those. In fact, the first six months of 1995 have been incredibly productive for the Michigan Senate. Overall, we've stuck to the goals set for Michigan at the start of this decade: To provide our children with a quality education; to make our state economically competitive and job-rich; and, to make our neighborhoods and streets safe.

As I already mentioned, we passed a total of five tax cuts this year. The additional two cuts include a reduction in the minimum unemployment insurance tax and an income tax deduction for students attending state colleges or universities that keep their tuition at or below inflation. Together, these cuts — which will save taxpayers more than \$1.6 billion over the next five years - will ensure job providers continue to invest in Michigan by creating new jobs and keep more money in your pockets for savings and investment.

Passing tax cuts wasn't all we did to ensure our state's economy remains healthy and strong in the coming years. We also passed and the governor signed a comprehensive unemployment insurance (UI) reform package. Although we've made vast improvements to our job climate by cutting taxes 16 times since 1990, our state's unemployment insurance costs are still among the highest in the nation. Currently, Michigan's UI tax rate ranks third among other U.S. states and our UI cost per employee ranks sixth highest nationally. By lowering those costs, we'll surely boost job creation and expansion.

In another effort to spur economic growth, we approved changes to the Polluters Pay law. Currently, a great deal of contaminated land is left abandoned because no one wants to take the responsibility of cleaning it up. As a result, hundreds

of acres of land in our urban areas are sitting unused, which have found out. For many victims, that is a thought too simply isn't good for our cities.

The changes we passed will make it easier to clean up this land and attract new jobs by establishing a priority system and promoting prompt clean ups. As a result, we'll see fewer boarded up buildings and more booming new businesses in our urban core cities like Grand Rapids.

Just as important to Michigan's prosperity is the safety of our neighborhoods and streets. Continuing our efforts to get dangerous felons off the streets and behind bars, the Senate bassed several tough anticrime measures.

"Good Faith Exclusionary Rule." Under it, evidence obtained through reasonable searches will be admissible in court. For too long, good and solid evidence has been kept out of the courtroom because of technicalities that really have nothing to do with the facts of the crime. Consider this example: An officer requests a search warrant to bust a suspected drug exchange in a certain house. On the warrant, he says the house is yellow. After seizing several kilograms of cocaine, the officers discover the house was in fact white. Well, just because the color of the building was listed wrong on the warrant, the evidence they obtained could be kept out of the courtroom. Our new legislation allows the judge to consider the evidence, as long as the activities and conduct of the officers were "objectively reasonable."





To the Editor.

I commend the Ledger for an attempt to present the drawbacks of the capital appreciation bonds used to pay for the new and remodeled school facilities. What you failed to explain is how this affects us as the taxpayers of this district a question of which the elected school board members at that time failed to do their homework. The basic assumption used to calculate the bond repayment was based on S.E.V. (State Equalized Value) growth of eight percent; the taxpayers later passed a law to limit the growth to inflation but not to exceed five percent. The total value of all property in the district right now is only \$585 million. Assuming a five percent growth (even this is optimistic), the district would have to have \$2.024 billion of new construction in the next 25 years to support this bond repayment. This means new growth must be 3 1/2 times



"If just officer safety was the reason for the proposed purchase I think that would be enough," Lowell city councilwoman Jeanne Shores said prior to making the motion okaying the purchase of four mobile data terminals (MDTs).

Lowell Police Chief Jim Valentine submitted a proposal to purchase four mobile data terminals to aid police officers in gathering information such as running warrants and status checks on persons vehicles and property from the cruiser bypassing the dis-

At Monday night's council meeting Sergeant Al Eckman cited three reasons for the purchase:

 It would greatly reduce radio traffic.

 Car to car and car to ofice information could be ransmitted without citizens picking up the information over their scanner.

 Officer safety - allowing officers to get information on person prior to pulling over heir vehicle.

"Currently if the Walker officer (Lowell's dispatcher) s tied up, information cannot e attained immediately. hrough the use of MDTs we would be able to go from the nain frame of the Kent County Sheriff's Department, hen over the radio to the secretary of state's office and attain this information within seconds," Eckman said.







Michigan employers control unemployment costs better than most

control over their unemployment tax costs.

"A newly released federal study of state unemployment insurance tax systems reports that Michigan's system is among the top five experience-rated programs in the country," F Robert Edwards, director of the Michigan Employment Security Commission (MESC), said.

"This is good news for employers because it means they can directly control their unemployment costs by controlling their layoffs," he explained. "If an employer has a history of few layoffs, then that firm is likely to have a low unemployment tax rate, conversely, more layoffs mean a higher tax rate."

The study showed that Michigan's Experience Rating Index (ERI) for rate year 1994 improved by nine percentage points, climbing to 77 percent from 68 percent in 1993. The improvement moved Michigan into fourth place, tying the state with New Hampshire and Virginia. New York had the highest rating at 84 percent followed by Delaware (83 percent) and Arizona (81 percent). North Carolina had the most socialized cost system at 31 percent.

The index is based on a one-year record. Consequently, it can fluctuate from year-to-year because of law changes and economic shifts.

Edwards said that Michigan's 1994 rating shows that 77 percent of all jobless benefits were charged directly to employers who had lavoffs.

"Our high index rating means that stable employers - those with few layoffs - are more likely to have a lower unemployment tax rate in Michigan than in most other states," Edwards



Thom Ellis shares new sound and material with Lowell Showboat crowd

Thom Ellis returned home Saturday night to perform in front of 450 of his most intimate fans at the Lowell Showboat.

For most, it was the first time they have heard Ellis in person since his new beginning - one which has brought him together with his emotions, his love for writing and with music that says something from the heart.

"It is exciting for me to see Thom enjoying his music again," Ellis club president Diane Bennett said. "He's singing with emotion. He's expressing himself from the heart." Ellis opened the show with a couple of trademark ballads that have become staples of his shows. His wide vocal range served as an endearing quality and captured the ears of those who were seated along the banks of the Flat River.

Walking out with acoustic guitar in hand, Ellis started a five-song set with "Leav'n Eyes" and wrapped it up with an emotionally charged and shortened "Sweet Music Man."

The Lowell native performed the ballads by himself before members of the Alavez band joined him. Alavez is Spanish for "beginning together."

Together they treated the

audience to original material written by Ellis and Keith Bowen, including "Border" and "Trails of Tears."

While the material maintains some country roots, it crosses over to more of a southwestern sound along the lines of Santanna and Marshall Tucker.

Ellis spent a number of years trying to carve out his spot in country music. "As hard as I've tried I just haven't been able to get the Nashville sound down," Ellis told the audience.

Judging from the emotion in his voice, Ellis may have found music that fits his style rather than adjusting his voice to a style.

Ellis ended the 18-song


performance with an encore made up of fan favorites "Prove Me Wrong" and "Old Denim Shirt."


