## ABC Sports labels MSU marching band "note-worthy" enough to perform theme song

Michigan State has long been noted for its outstanding sports bands.

It seems that ABC Sports has recognized that high level of achievement with its decision to use Michigan State's band in its college football promotions this fall.

Eighty of the 220 members of Michigan State's marching band recorded, revamped and re-recorded the ABC college football theme music. Some were in segments as brief as a few seconds for shorter promos while others included the entire piece for longer spots.

Also 15 members of the band were selected to perform in uniform for the ABC video which will be used for promotion of the Nebraska/Michigan State game on Sept. 9.

The band's squad and section leaders were chosen to be in the video. Lowell's Clay Pelon, the leader of the baritone section, was one of the 15 chosen for the video.

Both Pelon and his sister Heather were part of 85 members who played in the recording of the ABC college football theme song.

Clay Pelon, who will be a senior next year, plays the baritone and Heather plays the trumpet.

"It was great. We spent about four hours recording," Clay Pelon said. "The video was filmed around the statue of Spartan mascot 'Sparty.'"

Jim Ressler, ABC Sports producer, sent the college football theme music to some 50 university bands across the country.

After receiving the music from Ressler, MSU band leader John Madden went through a sight-reading session with the band. Madden discovered at that time that music for the mellophone was written in the wrong key.

"The music was transposed incorrectly," Madden said. "It was written as if it was to be played in E-flat as opposed to F-flat."

Madden phoned Ressler back, expressing appreciation for thinking of Michigan State and for using an idea that would promote college marching bands. He then added that one of the instruments was written in the wrong key.

A month later, Ressler responded with a letter stating that Michigan State had been selected to record the theme song music.

"I think Ressler was appreciative of our cooperation and of the time we took to communicate with him," Madden said. "I applaud ABC's effort to make a difference in its presentation of college football. It's the only network that is making an effort to incorporate more of the sport's pageantry."

This is the first year that ABC has approached college bands to record its college football theme song.

While Michigan State was the only band of the 50 asked to record the theme song, Nebraska, Florida State, and USC were also asked to film a video for promo use.

"It's nice recognition," Madden said. "It will really highlight the green and white marching band flair. Our band is world class."

## Mike Matlosz leaves Lowell for high school principalship at Godwin Heights

His interim role as Lowell's director of personnel and community services left Mike Matlosz without the day-to-day contact with students.

"I still want that day-to-day contact. That has been missing for me with my central office position," Matlosz said.

That was at the forefront of Matlosz's decision to accept the high school principalship at Godwin Heights High School.

"I didn't pursue the position. The school called me," Matlosz said. "The job also has a lot to offer me. It has a good staff, good community support and the school is in good financial shape."

He said a culturally diverse population will present him with a unique challenge. The school is also currently completing a bond issue to improve its technology.

Matlosz was asked if he was interested in the Lowell High School principal job vacated by Jim DeWeerd.

"The offer Godwin made to me was hard to turn down - it couldn't have been offered here at Lowell," Matlosz said. "I did not apply for the principal position at Lowell."

Ironically, Matlosz came to Lowell six years ago to fill the Lowell Middle School principal position. To do that, he had to leave his role as assistant high school principal at Godwin Heights (1985-89).

"In reading my resignation letter from six years ago, I stated in it that I hoped our paths would cross again," Matlosz said.

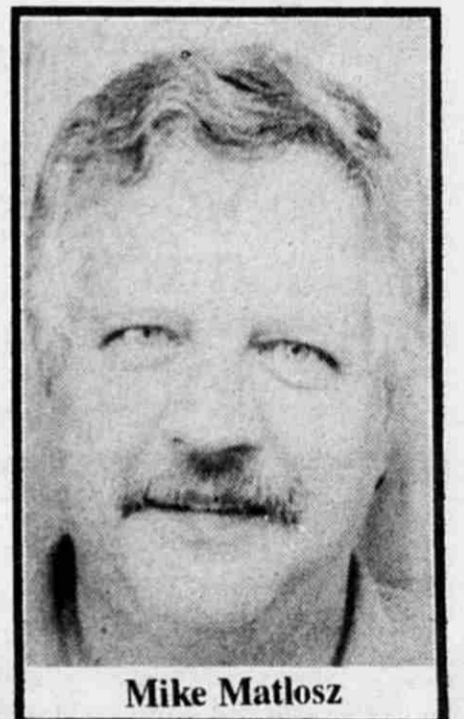
Godwin Heights' school board brought that thought full circle.

"We are extremely fortunate to have Mike Matlosz return to Godwin," said board president Dan Bowen. "With his extensive experience, he is the instructional leader we need at our high school."

Godwin Heights superintendent Pat Murphy added, "When we learned we would have an opening at the high school, the person everyone wanted was Mike Matlosz."

Matlosz said he will miss Lowell. "I believe it is an excellent school system and is doing some real quality work with kids."

Lowell's director of personnel and community services (former interim superintendent) Dick Korb said Matlosz has an innate sense for problem-solving critical issues. "He is a consummate professional and is probably the most forthright and honest person I've ever worked with."

Also surviving are daughters, Sharon Davids, Lea Ann Beacham and Jeannie Gonzales of Battle Creek; six grandchildren; and a sister Vivian Collins of Lowell. ## IN THE SERVICE

Navy Petty Officer 3rd Class Jack D. Ryan, of Saranac, recently returned to Norfolk, VA from a six-month overseas deployment to the Mediterranean Sea with the destroyer tender USS Shenandoah.

Ryan was one of 1,528 sailors aboard the ship who completed the 11,000-mile voyage which began in late November.

Ryan's ship served as a floating repair facility for forward deployed U.S. Navy surface ships. During the deployment, Ryan and fellow shipmates used a wide assortment of high-tech skills to repair electronic equipment, rewind electric motors, and weld exotic metals. Ryan's ship also is equipped with machine shops and even has a foundry for making parts.

Ryan's ship repaired 17 ships that were berthed along side or at anchor during the trip. Fly-away teams from USS Shenandoah also repaired several ships moored in other countries as well. During the employment, crew members also participated in a mock civilian evacuation exercise, in which Shenandoah sailors volunteered to be rescued.

While spending 48 days at sea, Ryan also visited Crete, Cyprus, Israel, Italy, Sardinia, Sicily and Spain. During tour to Rome, Shenandoah crew members attended a Papal Audience at St. Peter's Basilica. Another highlight occurred when about a dozen crew members were baptized in the Jordan River during a port visit to Haifa, Israel.

Ryan's involvement in the deployment reflects the Navy-Marine Corps team's unique capability of being able to conduct air, ground and logistics operations supported entirely by ships at sea — a critical option in regions where access to land bases is limited or does not exist.

The 1977 graduate of Lowell High School joined the Navy in September 1977.

Marine 1st Lt. Benjamin P. Richmond, son of Jerold R. and Diane M. Richmond of Lowell, recently was promoted to his present rank while serving with 2nd Tank Battalion, 2nd Marine Division, Camp Lejeune, N.C. The 1989 graduate of Lowell Senior High School joined the Marine Corps in May 1993. Richmond is a 1993 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, Annapolis, MD, with a BS degree.

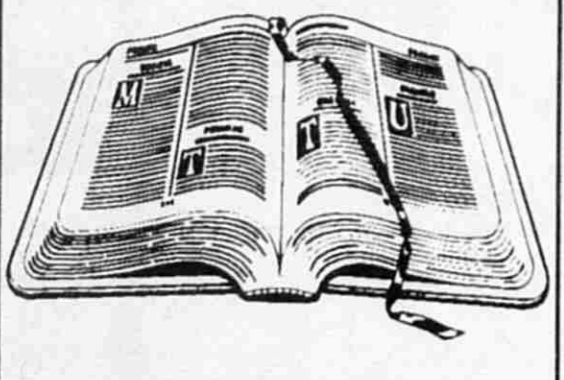

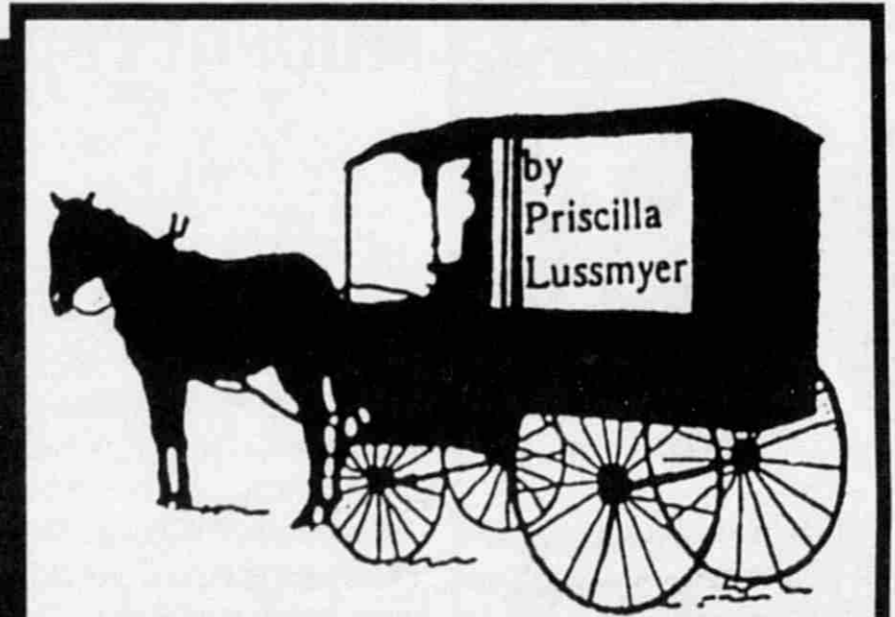

American Indians have treaties with the U.S. Government, their reservations are not subject to state law. As a result, the state can't control Indian reservations. However, the governor has to give his approval for the off-reservation development of casinos.

Governor Engler is personally opposed to casino gaming. But as our state's top official, he had to weigh evidence and opinion from all sides before making a decision on whether to allow the expansion of off-reservation gaming. After careful consideration, Governor Engler announced last week that he will not support expansion.

As a longtime opponent of casino expansion, I couldn't be

more pleased with the governor's decision. The way I see it, casinos are like fool's gold — they promise much but deliver little.

While supporters claim gaming boosts the economy, countless studies have shown it creates a limited number of jobs—many of which are minimum-wage—and, in fact, hurts the local economy because many independent local merchants can't compete with the casinos. A truly strong and vital economy isn't rooted in the gaming industry. Rather, it's rooted in manufacturers, agriculture, the service industry,

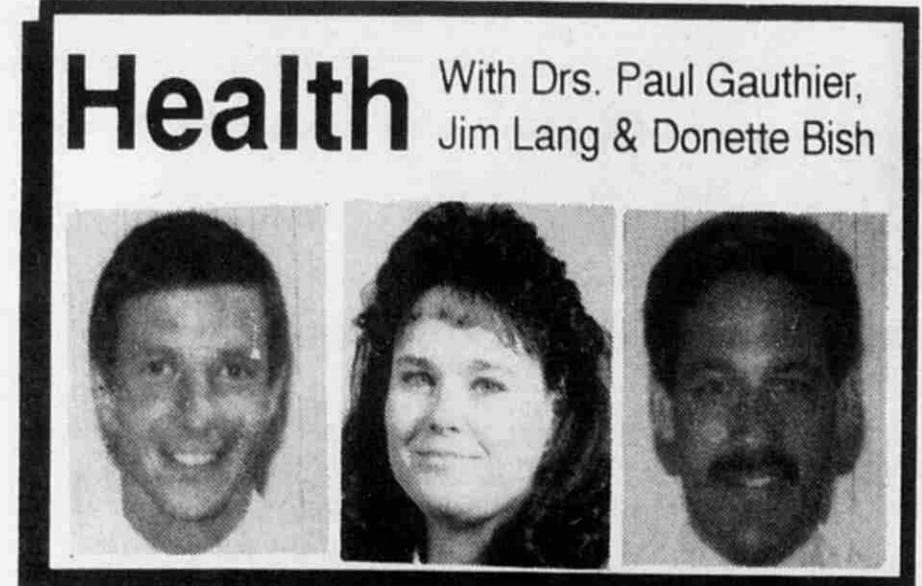




**EARLY SYMPTOMS OF HEART ATTACK**  
Early treatment of a heart attack is critical to long term survival. A patient who receives treatment within the first hour after symptoms occur will have the best chance for a complete recovery.  
A heart attack is caused by a blockage of one of the small coronary arteries supplying the heart muscle. Without an adequate blood supply the affected part of the heart muscle is injured, inhibiting proper cardiac function.

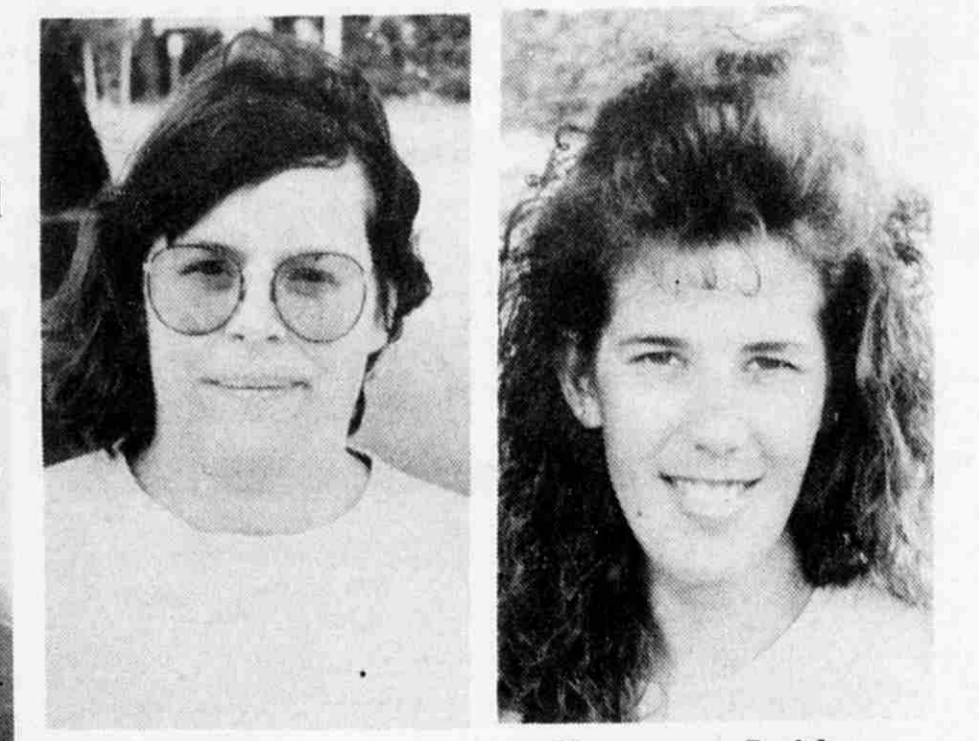
Unfortunately, persons experiencing symptoms of heart attack wait an average of two hours prior to seeking medical intervention. Patients often deny their symptoms or think that the symptoms are due to indigestion. Patients may delay early treatment because they don't want to be embarrassed if their condition turns out to be a false alarm.  
Heart attack symptoms vary and may include one or more of the following:  
• an uncomfortable pressure or tightness in the chest lasting longer than a couple of minutes.  
• a pain or heaviness radiating to the jaw, arms or shoulder.  
• any chest discomfort with sweating, shortness of breath and dizziness.  
If you think you may be experiencing a heart attack, call 911 if the symptoms persist for longer than a minute or two. An ambulance should be dispatched immediately to transport you to the hospital. While waiting for an ambulance chew one adult aspirin, loosen any restrictive clothing and lie down. Once the ambulance crew arrives they will be in contact with the emergency room for further treatment as needed.

tourism—industries which encourage consistent, positive growth.  
Gaming also increases costs to local government, such as additional public safety, health inspection, emergency medical services, social welfare programs and infrastructure. But putting economics aside, what about the social costs? There's no doubt that gambling creates more victims than it does winners.  
I have taken a lot of heat from many southeastern Michigan legislators who believe my position is anti-Detroit. But being against the expansion of casino gaming is not anti-Detroit. Rather, I would argue my position is pro-family, pro-economic growth, pro-Michigan.  
To really help Detroit and the rest of the state, we need to put forth further proposals to cut taxes, improve our schools, reduce crime and encourage job growth. We must take a more positive approach with ideas such as the governor's Tax-Free Renaissance Zones. In doing so, we'll see greater opportunities for real growth and economic stability.  
Michigan was made great not by the glamour of Hollywood approaches to growth or by the promises of Las Vegas-style riches, but by the honest, hard work of its men and women. This basic approach is what will continue to bring Michigan back again.

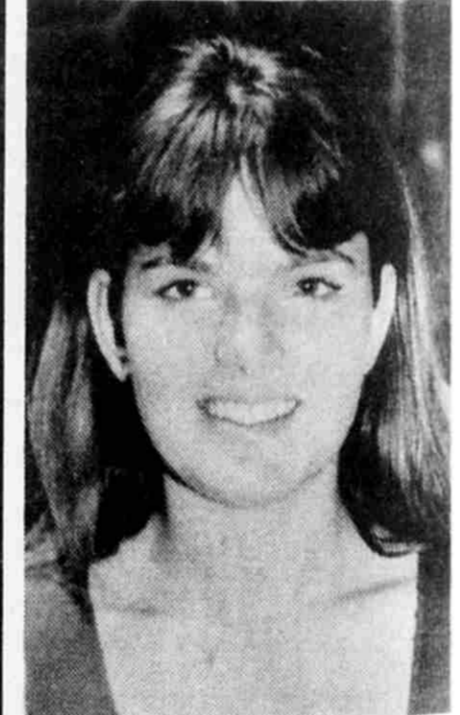

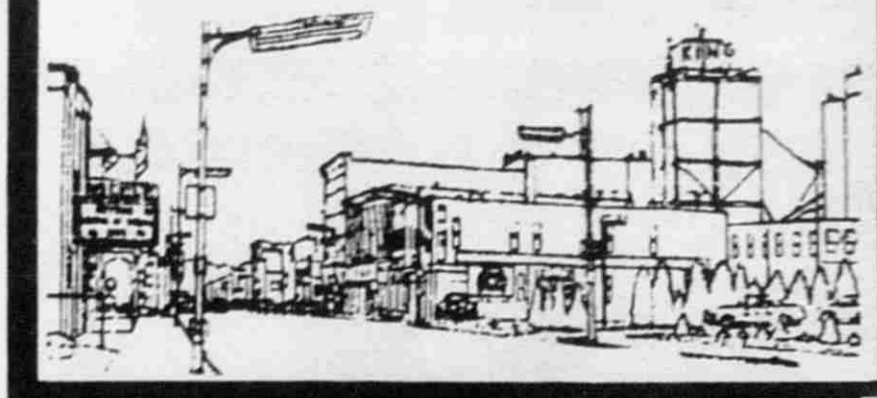

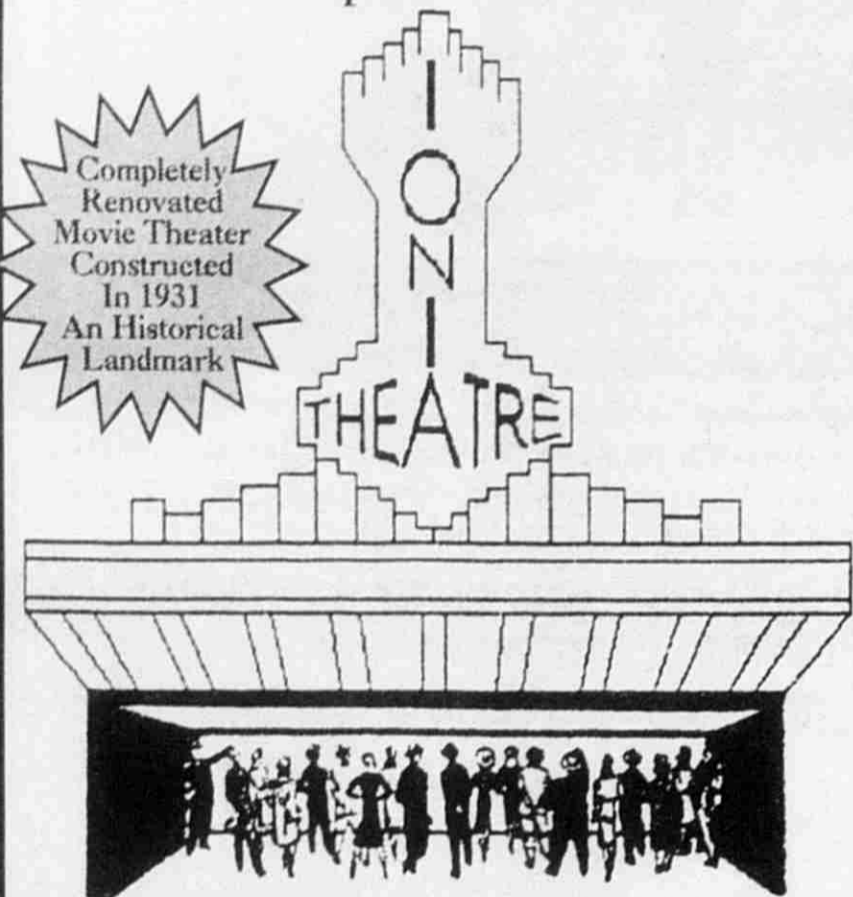

## Township planning commission's findings at Ike's Towing are spotty

The time has come for Terry Eickhoff and Ike's Towing to prove its worth in the eyes of the Lowell Charter Township Board.

In October Terry Eickhoff, whose family has operated a wrecking business at his current site since 1964, was given six months to "clean up" his property by the township board in order to receive proper zoning and permits or face a cease and desist order.

The commission gave Eickhoff until June 11 to fulfill his requirements if he wants to be licensed properly.

Eickhoff needs a license following last year's decision by the state to put stricter restrictions on wrecking services.

The requirements needed to be addressed by Eickhoff include a total clean-up of the yard and a site plan showing his current buildings, as well as current and future uses of the property, drainage issues and commercial driveway access.

Eickhoff must also establish and maintain proper business hours and have a plan which guarantees proper fluid, waste and pollutant management. He must also provide soil boring of his property.

Recently the members of the township's planning commission toured Eickhoff's site and have drafted a letter to the board regarding their findings.

According to the draft, there was a "general" clean up of the property and there appeared to be some order to the arrangement of the stored vehicles. The site still has approximately 11,000 tires stored on the site, but Eickhoff has informed the commission that he plans on having them removed.

However, trustee Richard Bryan said there still is some indication of oil, anti-freeze, and gasoline in different areas in

"I saw gas dripping from the back of a car into the soil and there was a discoloration in the soil," said Bryan.

Eickhoff has provided a site plan, which includes the location of current buildings, future plans for the property, plans for a gas/oil removal building, and commercial driveway access.

The commission didn't comment on the future uses of the site, but did say it needed to be rezoned before any new buildings could be built.

The commission was also not satisfied with the soil boring provided by Eickhoff.

According to the commission, additional soil borings which include a subsurface investigation must be completed.

Eickhoff's soil boring assessment states that there is no evidence of potential "recognized environmental conditions" in connection with the property, but did state there is potential for problems.

The assessment said the potential for adverse environmental impact to the local aquifer exists from waste water runoff from a nearby apple processor, "Timpson Farms." However, the only way to ascertain results of the water is to conduct a hydrogeological study.

The report also said spots of stained soil should be removed and disposed of properly, a permit should be obtained for a large tile pile at the site, and a subsurface investigation is the only way to determine the effects of operation on the soil since the business began to operate.

Eickhoff could not be reached for comments regarding the findings and no time table has been set, at this time, by the planning commission or township board regarding the recommendations.

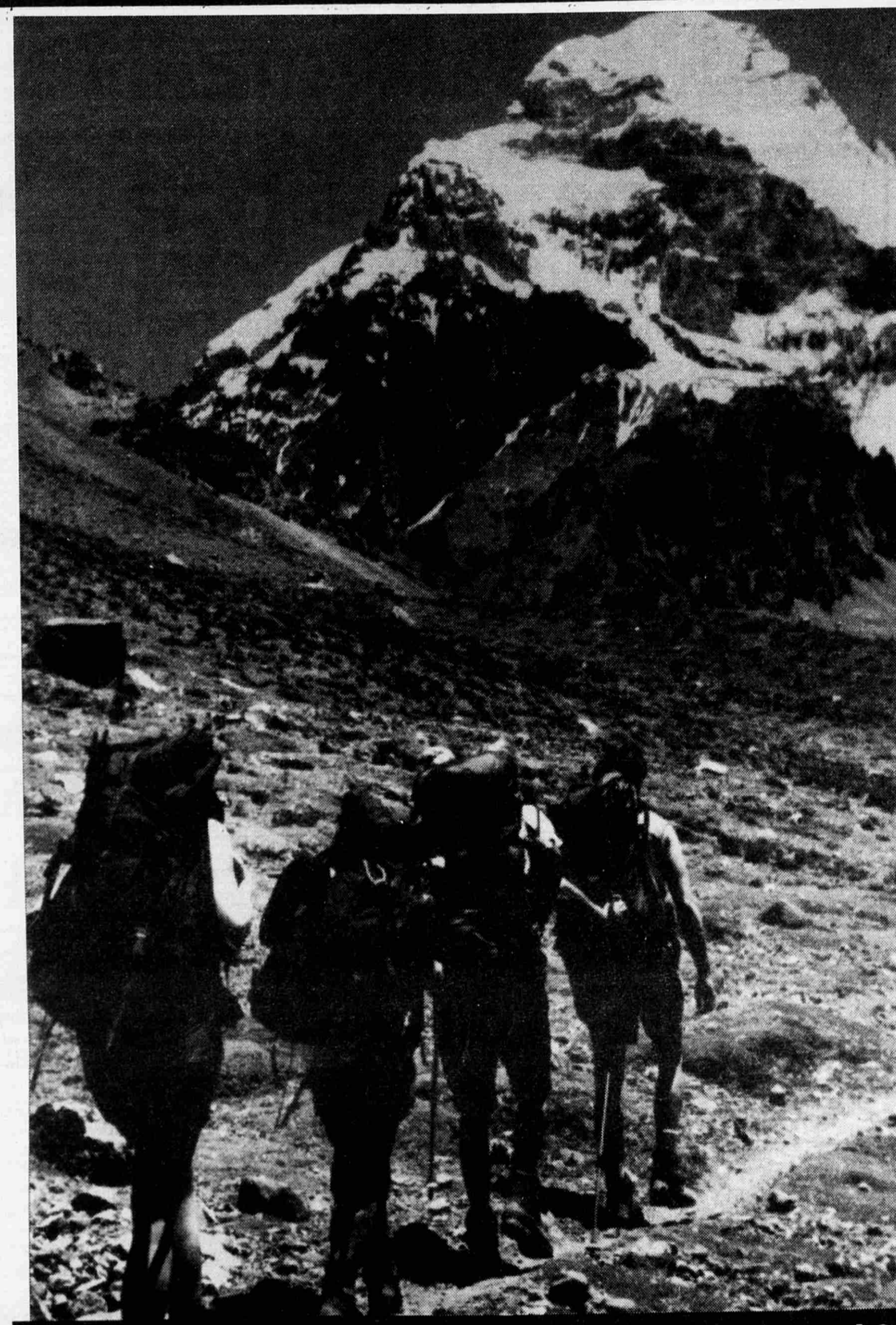

In the early 70's, street right of ways on Lafayette Street were turned back over to the property owners.

There were two exceptions - the residences at 423 and 506 Lafayette.

Tom Alexander, the current resident at 423, explains that his father did not want to take on additional taxes so the right of way remained with the city.

The resident at 506 Lafayette was deemed mentally unstable and thus the right of way was kept by the city.

Today, Paul Christman lives at the 506 address.

Both Christman and Alexander have approached the city about vacating North Street from Lafayette Street to the river.

The owners would then split the 49' 5" right of way.

Christman and Alexander said they didn't intend to change the usage. "We're still going to use it to park vehicles in the driveways," Christman said.

What they do want to prevent is people using the right of way as a public access to the river.

The vacation was granted to the residents subject to Christman and Alexander retaining the easement for utilities (water and storm drain) prohibiting any permanent improvements.

# Local bikers help MS-150 raise \$167,000

It wasn't the Extreme Games, but it did take an extreme amount of pride and determination to complete West Michigan's MS 150-Mile Bike Tour.

"Yes, sir, it did feel like 150 miles," smiled Tina Phillips. "It was a tough ride especially in the extreme heat on Saturday."

Phillips, along with her husband Dan, raised roughly \$350 for MS by completing the two-day trip.

The bike tour raised approximately \$167,000 to help fund research for the cure, treatment and prevention of Multiple Sclerosis.

The cost to the 544 riders included hours of preparation for the ride. Once the 16-20 hour ride on Michigan roads began, riders experienced leg cramps, muscle soreness, dehydration from the heat and a great deal of satisfaction and pride when they completed their ride late Sunday afternoon.

The 150 miles were divided over two days. The bike venture began Saturday morning from Kentwood High School and ended 75 miles later with an overnight at Hope College.

Although they did not necessarily ride together in groups, Lowell's Jon Getz, Diane Stockreef, Brad Brigstock, Phil Brooks and Matt Smith also participated

in the tour.

"It's the first year I've participated in the event. It was long, grueling and very hot, but it was fun and I met a lot of people," Getz said. "I'd do it again, just not today, and I'd get in better shape the next time." The Lowell bicyclists raised \$205.

Getz's wife, Robin, served as a support staff worker for MS-150 event.

There were rest stops located every 8-12 miles along the route for the bicyclists.

"We had an overwhelming response from people to volunteer and to help sponsor the event," West Michigan MS fund-raising manager Kathy O'Brien said. "They are the ones who make this event possible. This ride could not happen without them."

Employees from seven West Michigan bike shops provided necessary bike maintenance along the route for bicyclists.

"I've never had any bike problems. However, I wasn't two miles into the race when I got a flat tire," Dan Phillips said, shaking his head.

This is the seventh year the National Multiple Sclerosis Society has held the event.

O'Brien said 60 percent of the funds will remain with the local chapter and 40 percent will be sent to the national office to be used for research.

"The tour went great and the participants had a lot of fun," O'Brien said. "The only

downside was the heat on Saturday."

Lowell's Stockreef agreed. "The heat Saturday afternoon was disheartening," she said. "I would do it again. I felt as if I was well prepared and it was fun."

Stockreef said she suffered from very little soreness. "After finishing the first 75 miles on Saturday, I got a massage and I put some aspercreme on my knees; other than that I was fine."

The Lowell resident said through pledges she raised \$280.

The Phillips said they started preparing for the race two months prior to the event. "We started out riding three miles and by the end of the two months we were biking 32 miles (to Belding and back). Tina and I were prepared, but the heat took its toll on everybody," Dan Phillips said.

Phillips were part of an eight-man team that biked together. "We called ourselves the 'Roadrunners,'" Tina Phillips said. "With the heat and all, I'm not sure I'd want to do it again - maybe."

Dan Phillips said he wanted to make the ride again. "It was fun and you got to meet a lot of people," he said. "The thing I liked about this and the Creekside Kingdom project is that there were young and old riding side-by-side."

Upon arrival at Hope College on Saturday, many of the

bicyclists limped around, had dinner and then relaxed and watched a movie before retiring. Some even found time for a massage.

Saturday's 75-mile course was tougher than Sunday's, according to most of the bicyclists' accounts.

"Saturday we didn't complete our 75 miles until after five," Dan Phillips said.

Tina added, "Sunday we beat the people bringing the welcome sign to the finish line."

The couple agreed they were tired, more than sore, after the race was over. "The heat bothered me and my stomach was upset for a few days," Tina Phillips said.

Getz said his knees swelled so badly he could barely walk and his neck ached from looking up while riding. "My buttocks was also sore, but by

## Repeating classes a concept being studied at LHS

The concept of reteaching is a basic premise of good teaching.

The concept of allowing high school students to repeat classes if they so desire is one being discussed and looked into at Lowell.

"If it improves learning then I'm for it," says curriculum director Jim White. "Students deserve a second chance if they have met up with failure. If a person makes a mistake on the job, he/she redoes it."

White added that if a student works hard and does not do well but has the motivation to try again, he believes the school is obligated to allow the student the opportunity.

While Lowell's curriculum director favors the concept, he notes there are some drawbacks that would need to be discussed.

1. If there are three openings in a class, and four students want to retake the course, how do you choose which three students get into the class? "Guidelines would have to be written," White said.

2. If a student is doing poorly in a class, what is the motivation for the student to keep trying if he/she knows they can retake the course?

"While I think these are board issues, I think they should remain school policies," White said.

3. Should the two grades the student earned be averaged together or should the highest one be used? Should

the student's transcript reflect both grades earned by the student? White believes the better grade should be used. "Students can take the ACT test as many times as they want and only the best score is used," he said.

Retaking courses can also have its drawbacks for students. If a freshman decides it's necessary to retake three classes, it could affect his/her ability to attain graduation requirements.

A student who chooses to retake a course in an effort to improve his/her GPA may have to choose between retaking a course and enrolling in a college prep class.

Such a policy could also cost the district more money, depending on how many students retake a class. Some

classes call for consumable materials - products to be purchased.

East Grand Rapids' repeat class policy does not grant credit for repeated classes.

When a student decides to repeat a class, a parent/student/counselor session is held to discuss the pros and cons of repeating a specific class. A "permission to repeat a class" form is filled out and upon completion of the repeated class, the registrar recomputes the student's cumulative GPA using the higher of the two grades.

EGR's policy does not apply to a multilevel class designed to be taken more than one time, such as symphony band, orchestra, debate and forensics.

## Slicers Beware:

### Commission reviews need for fencing at proposed golf course

Residents worried about flying golf balls and stampeding golfers trampling through their property near Cascade and Hilton Roads may find relief from the Lowell Charter Township Planning Commission.

The commission recently discussed having Woodruff Palmer install fencing around his proposed 180 acre Becchtree Golf Course, located at the corner of Cascade and Hilton Roads.

"I've been on golf courses and have seen the damage golfers can do to property while looking for their stray balls," said trustee Richard Bryan.

At the township's initial public hearing regarding the golf course, the idea of fencing was echoed by many of the area residents.

Trustee Carol Wieland said fencing is important not only for people whose backyards face the course, but also for those whose fields butt up against it borders.

"I don't think property owners want golfers and golf carts running through their land, even if it's only a field," said Wieland.

However, trustee Bob Hendricks warns that fencing may not completely solve the problem, if it occurs.

"I've called the sheriff's department regarding tres-

passers on my property and they wouldn't do anything," said Hendricks. "If the sheriff's department won't arrest or cite the trespassers, then there isn't much a property owner can do."

The discussion of fencing and other issues was prompted because the commission reviewed a preliminary site plan for the course.

Other concerns addressed was the serving of non-alcoholic beer, a deceleration lane off Cascade Road, the width of the opening into the course, and drainage.

The idea of serving non-alcoholic beer shocked the commission, but they felt there wasn't much they could do about it.

"There is a small amount of alcohol in the non-alcoholic beer, but you don't need a license to sell it," said Hendricks.

The commission said it would discuss the deceleration lane and drainage issues with county agencies and review its private road ordinance with Palmer so a proper road can be constructed.

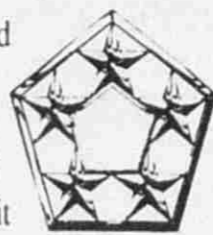

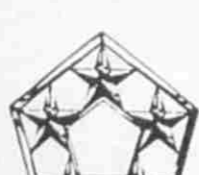

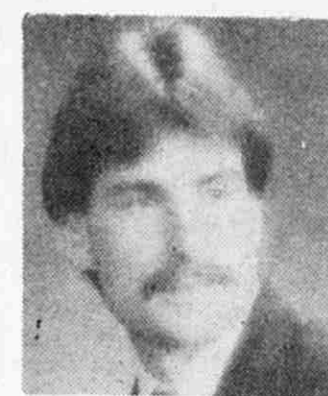
