City Council adopts sidewalk resolution

How to deal with sidewalks in commercial and residential areas has long been a point of discussion for city boards and officials.

A work session produced a resolution that should put it to rest.

The resolution calls for sidewalks in commercial areas to be installed on West Main Street from the downtown to the west city limits over a two-year period, paid for with available Downtown Development Authority funds.

During 1997, construction of the sidewalks will occur at the north side of West Main Street from West Street to Alden Nash and the south side from West Street to Valley Vista Village Drive (Allisandra).

Leveling Lee's Landing

Stating it can no longer risk the liability, the city of Lowell agreed to move expeditiously in acquiring and demolishing

the Lee's Landing structure. "We've spent a lot of time on this," Lowell city manager Dave Pasquale said. "It has been a frustrating process."

The city manager was referring to attaining the deed from Equivest Financial which acquired the property from Hugh Lilley approximately five years ago.

During this time, the building has been allowed to deteriorate to the point that it would be cost prohibitive to save.


Jim Reagan, chairman of the Downtown Development Authority and a member of the Lowell Historic Committee, said he doesn't like the idea that a financial firm can purchase a deed to the building, and then neglect it.

"The resolution to establish a historic district ordinance can prevent this sort of thing from happening in the future," Reagan said. "We'll be able to force the deed holder to fix it

Equivest Financial (First National) of East Lansing told the city of Lowell that the firm would deed the property to the city for \$1 and write off the back taxes previously paid by the

That would leave approximately \$7,000 in back taxes. The DDA said it would pay the remaining back taxes. The city, in turn, will take care of the cost to demolish the structure. couldn't have fixed

ing to take the building completely down.

The state Department of Environmental Quality said it would allow a deck with peers to be installed at the site.

"I have a hard time accepting the fact that a financial firm can buy a structure, hoping for a financial gain, and then when that does not happen, stick the taxpayers with the burden," Lowell mayor Bill Thompson said.

Reagan said he never saw the building for rent or for sale. "The financial firm never tried to do anything with the structure. If an effort to fix up the front would have been made, maybe someone would have shown some interest," he said.

Speaking of what it has done to the center of town, Reagan said it has created a "festering boil" in the middle of it.

Pasquale said the city will look to have the demolitioncompleted as soon as possible. "We would pursue putting in a deck with peers next year. Funding would be sought through grant applications," he said.

Currently, the sidewalk in front of the building is roped off. Thompson said that creates a pedestrian hazard in that it forces them to have to walk onto the street.

Pasquale said the roof is nearly gone, causing rain, snow and ice to come in, and the outside walls of the structure are bowing.

Reagan concluded by saying that the building was in bad condition before the financial firm took possession of the deed. "But it wasn't anything that some routine maintenance

Review of private ordinance brings jeers from Township Board

After reviewing the planning commission's revised ordinance on private road construction, members of the Lowell Charter Township Board figured "why fix something that is

At its workshop meeting, the board did not vote on the commission's recommendation, but voiced disapproval of its

The commission revised the ordinance in an attempt to protect the township from possible lawsuits, but board mem-



bers feel that protection is already in place and the new ordinance isn't flexible enough for the township to enforce.

Township clerk Carol Wells said the revision will open up necessary. new parcels of land for development, which could cause future

"We have to be careful how many pieces we open up, township "teeth" in case disputes were taken to court. because we could end up with a lot more density than we have now," said Wells. "We don't have sewer available or other utilities to cope with increased density and until we have them, current language of the existing ordinance. we have to be careful."

Trustee Alyn Fletcher proposed making amendments to the existing ordinance which would address the commission's concerns while keeping the existing document flexible.

"Instead of us trying to reinvent the wheel, you should go ahead and draw up amendments to the areas in the ordinance which need improving," said Fletcher. "Most items (in the commission's attempt to lower the minimum number of lots revised ordinance) are spelled out in the ordinance and can be enforced by the planning commission whenever they deem it

Trustee and planning commission member Carol Wieland informed the board that the revised ordinance would give the

Wells said any potential problems with disputes can be addressed at the time a building permit is issued and in the

"This can cause us a lot more problems than save us any," said Wells. "Outlines can be drawn up to let people know what has to be included instead of spelling out every situation. I think we have to keep it as flexible as possible."

North Central impressed with LHS staff's willingness to sacrifice to achieve outcomes

North Central Association assists and facilitates schools in achieving their highest level.

"We do not present an agenda. It is important that a school staff creates its own agenda," said Charles Blackman, a member of the North Central Association's visiting team. "We just share our perceptions."

Blackman says now it identifies outcomes in five areas. "Before, it was looking at every classroom and validating what was taking place," he explains.

Lowell is completing its first five-year cycle. The plan consisted of outcomes adopted by the LHS staff and improve-

The plan attempted to address each outcome, one at a ime, at a rate that would allow the school to successfully implement the outcome across the curriculum.

The outcomes outlined in the five-year plan consist of higher order thinking skills/problem solving; reading across the curriculum; playing a responsible role in society; writing across the curriculum; and the physical and emotional well being of the student.

"It would be presumptuous of us to think we could come

into a school and tell it what is best for its students," said Sally Jessup, a member of the North Central Association team.

Blackman adds that the team is there to aid and abet the process rather than judge.

North Central's visits which started five years ago take on more meaningful intensive form these days, according to LHS principal Scott Vashaw

"NCA verifies what schools say they are doing," Lowell High School counselor Barb Pierce says. "It assists schools in attaining goals in achieving the highest possible state accredi-

There are three levels of state accreditation - summary. interim and uncredited. Lowell is rated at the interim level.

As Lowell begins a new cycle, Vashaw said it will look at targeting new goals. "It's a process for improvement as well as maintaining what is currently being done," he said.

Lowell art teacher Robin White explained the improvement process started with standards and practices as well as school improvement before the new NCA outcomes' accreditation was adopted.

SENATE REPUBLICANS PROTECT TAXPAYERS' POCKETBOOKS



This package addresses three main areas: establishing limits on questionable lawsuits that exhaust your tax dollars by spending millions of dollars paying for lawyers and settlements; making the Michigan Department of Transportation more fiscally accountable through periodic performance audits and increased oversight and giving more control to counties and townships; and, containing the cost of purchasing property for new roads. With this new system in place, Michigan will be spending its transportation dollars on blackfop and bridges, not lawyers and litigation.

There have been a number of individuals who demonstrated that they believe the easy answer to this complicated problem is an instant increase in the state gasoline tax. We estimate that Michigan will save hundreds of millions of dollars with this package. That is money we will dedicate to our roads. This transportation reform package isn't a miracle cure for what ails Michigan's infrastructure, but it gives us a fiscally sound foundation for future reform so taxpayer money is spent more wisely and more equitably across the board. Every dollar this package puts back into building roads is one less dollar you will be asked to pay in taxes.

ANOREXIA NERVOSA

Anorexia nervosa (A.N.) is a true psychological illness brought on by an intense fear of gaining weight. In its true form it is accompanied by exaggerated dieting and weight loss and a characteristically distorted body image. It typically affects adolescent females and occurs in up to 1.3 percent of the general population.

The typical A.N. patient is an adolescent female who is a high achiever. She is academically competitive, goal oriented, and a perfectionist. She rarely becomes involved in typical adolescent activities such as attending parties and dating.

People with A.N. have a disturbed perception of their body shape and image. They may perceive themselves to be overweight even though they are emaciated. They have an irrational fear of gaining weight. This fear of gaining weight tends to be greater than the fear of dying from self-induced starvation. Many A.N. persons suffer from associated bulimia - binge eating and purging by self-induced vomiting.

One of the most exasperating features of A.N. involves the patient's denial of the severity of their illness. They have virtually no insight regarding the fact that they are systematically starving themselves.

Treatment of A.N. is manifold and involves psychotherapy. reversal of weight loss, correction of any blood abnormalities, and, in many cases, medication. Hospitalization is necessary in some cases to avoid actual starvation. A.N. is a chronic illness; we need to be mindful of its possibility in any family member or friend who exhibits its characteristics.



Dear Jonathan: What is involved in starting a non-profit organization? Do I need to have a lawyer, or is this something I can do myself?

Jonathan says: You do not indicate in your question as to what type of non-profit organization you are interested in starting. A non-profit organization or enterprise can be defined as an organization wherein no part of the income is distributable to the members, directors, or officers of that organization. This doesn't mean that non-profit organizations are prohibited from making a profit; they simply cannot distribute any of the profits to its members, officers, or directors.

A non-profit organization can take one of three forms: a trust, an association or a corporation. For purposes of my answer, I will restrict my comments to non-profit corporations.

Under Michigan Law, a non-profit corporation is defined as a corporation incorporated to carry out any lawful purpose not involving pecuniary profit or gain for its directors, officers, shareholders, or its members.

A non-profit corporation may be organized for any lawful purpose not involving pecuniary gain or profit of its officers, directors, shareholders or members.

A non-profit corporation can be organized and operated as a stock corporation, a membership corporation, or a directorship corporation. The membership and directorship type of non-profit corporations are both non-stock corporations.

To form a non-profit corporation, you must first draft and file with the Michigan Department of Commerce, articles of incorporation. In addition, you must do other things, such as hold organizational meetings to elect officers and adopt by-

I assume that your intention is to achieve tax exempt status that properly forming your organization as a non-profit corporation under Michigan law will not automatically grant you tax exempt status under either federal or state law. In order to be a tax exempt entity, you must comply with the provisions of Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c) which is too technical for me to explain in the scope of this answer.

However, please be aware beneficiary upon your death (this category would include life insurance policies and IRA's), then those assets avoid probate and would be distributed to:

> 1. In the case of jointly titled property, your wife, so long as she survives you.

2. The beneficiaries named in the trust, if any.

3. The beneficiaries named on the life insurance policy, Although you do not need an attorney to help you start a IRA, or any other contract wherein a beneficiary has been



...and baby makes six!

Parents reading this can perhaps understand what lies in front of Chris and Mike Posthuma of Ada. Those who've never had a baby in their care cannot begin to comprehend. Chris gave birth to quads on Wednesday, October 2!

Sporadic contractions began about two days prior. By 3:06 Wednesday afternoon, the four babies had been delivered by Cesarean section at Butterworth Hospital. The delivery came about 30 weeks into the pregnancy, fairly typical for quad births. Though premature, the two boys and two girls are all doing well in Butterworth's neonatal intensive care unit.

Lucas arrived first and was the largest at 4 pounds, I ounce. The rest followed at about one minute intervals. Jannelle weighed in at 3 pounds, 1 ounce; Morgan at 2 pounds 13 1/2

the smallest and the last one out. "I think they had a little trouble finding him in there," joked Mike.


Three of the babies required supplemental oxygen for a period following their birth. Two were medicated after tests turned up irregular heartbeats. None required respirators and no serious problems have arisen in the days following. Mike says, "The doctors are very optimistic about their (the babies) health and progress. The problems we have seen have been very typical in babies born at 30 weeks."

Chris went home Saturday. These are the first children for the Posthumas, and this pregnancy has been a long ordeal for the new mom. Many Lowell residents will remember Chris as an employee at Pfaller's Clothing. When the store closed last May, Chris was about three months into the pregnancy. Her doctor told her to go home and basically stay in bed or the LazyBoy. Nearly two months ago, following a couple of mild

Except for an occasional pass to go out to dinner or attend a special event, she had been there since. Her last outing was a brief wheelchair visit to the Fallasburg Fall Festival the Saturday prior to the birth.

The Posthumas were married two years ago and decided they wanted a family. Time marches on for everyone, and their biological clocks were ticking. Chris is now 34 and Mike is 40. When a pregnancy didn't happen, the couple consulted with Dr. Douglas Daly, a fertility specialist at Blodgett Memorial Medical Center. Daly eventually prescribed the use of a mild fertility drug to help them conceive. The drug works by stimulating the production of six to seven eggs. Though this increases the chances for multiple fertilizations, single births are the norm. So much for the norm.






"Big Luke" - Lucas was the first baby to arrive and was the team heavyweight.

Though not exactly commonplace, the birth of quads is happening more frequently than in the past.

Mike is employed by Amway Corporation and works in the personnel department. He knew of another Amway emplovee. Lee Esterley, whose wife Shelley gave birth to quads about three years ago. The Esterly quads were the first quads born in Grand Rapids in about five years. The Posthuma quads are the fifth set born in Grand Rapids this year, with another four sets due in the next few months.

The Posthumas were fortunate to know early in the pregnancy that they were dealing with quads. They contacted the Esterleys and other parents of multiples. They consulted physicians, counselors, etc. They read lots of books on multiple births and explored their options. Mike said, "When it came down to it, we realized we were blessed and proceeded with optimism and faith." With their second wedding anniver-

sary coming up, Chris said, "If anyone had told me two years ago I'd have four children now I wouldn't have believed them."

The babies will likely stay at Butterworth for six to nine weeks. In the meantime, the couple visits them regularly while Chris works at getting her strength back and Mike continues to prepare the home for the onslaught. A bedroom has been converted to a nursery equipped with a doubledecker crib loaned by the Esterleys. Two of Mike's pals have been helping to remodel the basement to serve as an eventual playroom. "For now, it may just be a quiet place for us to escape to from time to time," quipped Mike.

The Posthumas can expect to change upwards of 300 diapers per week, prepare nearly that many bottles and keep a round-the-clock vigil over their new family. "We'll need help"

admits Mike. "We've been in contact with friends, family, church groups, support groups, etc., but we just don't know how it's going to work out until the babies are home and we actually get into it."

Looking on the bright side, Mike and Chris theorize that having four all the same age may be easier than having the same number at various ages. "For one thing, there won't be big ones picking on the little ones," says Chris, the youngest of four children.

On the other hand, all the hurdles will come at once. The "Terrible-Twos, times four" is a good example. There is also teething times four, potty-training times four, etc.

Right now, none of that seems to bother the Posthumas; they're too busy beaming and counting their blessings...one...two...three...four.
