ITM adds warehouse to Vergennes site with headquarter plans in the making

With the hopes of someday calling Vergennes Township its corporate headquarters, ITM Corporation has received the go-ahead from the planning commission to build a 100,000 square foot warehouse in the Lincoln Lake Industrial District.

The commission approved the company's plans, after representative Brian Winkelman presented detailed plans about the project that included a glimpse of the company's corporate headquarters.

According to Winkelman, the new building will be used mainly as storage, but will allow them to "finish" parts that are not complete.

In conjunction with the building construction, the company will add 39 new parking spaces to accommodate added employees.

ITM is limited to 30 employees working at the site within a 24-hour period, but initially it expects to have many less.

Winkelman said only two employees will man the first shift and just one on the second and third shifts.

Winkelman and township officials expect those numbers to jump once the company builds new offices at the site. However, at this time, no discussion has taken place on when those offices will be built.

"From my understanding, it is the desire of ITM to move most of its manufacturing here and have its corporate headquarters here as well," said Winkelman.

Winkelman said ITM was forced to build a new warehouse because it currently stores parts at warehouses throughout Grand Rapids and many of those agreements will cease this year.

As ITM begins the shift to Vergennes, it must also look at constructing a private access road to offset traffic concerns on Lincoln Lake Avenue.

Currently, there have been no complaints about

Snowmobilers provided a limited corridor so they can gas up for trip home

Lowell has rapidly become known to snowmobilers traveling on the state Department of Natural Resource (DNR) trail passes as the "dry city."

Many snowmobilers travel south into Lowell from Greenville, Belding and Rockford and north from Wayland and Allegan on the state DNR trail.

They enter the city thru the southeast part of Lowell. They also enter with little gas left in their tanks.

Fuel is then needed for their return trip.

Wherein lies the problem. The city ordinance prohibits snowmobilers from

traveling on city streets... therefore denying them access to any gas stations.

Out of desperation snowmobilers have to violate a city ordinance and the Lowell Police Department has to spend time going to the gas station to enforce the law.

"Trail users used to be able to purchase gas in Grattan, north of the city and on 84th St. south of the city," said Flat River Snowmobile Club member Bradley Potter. "However, these stations have now closed."

Potter asked that the city provide a limited trail corridor from the parking lot on South Jackson to Jefferson Street and then two blocks

VALUES TO LIVE BY

***Lowell community identified five character traits that can be integrated throughout curriculums, organizations and businesses.

Lowell community members including teachers, clergy, civic organizers, local business representatives and parents identified character traits for children and adults to uphold and practice at a character development meeting Thursday night.

"Talk to local business representatives about what they are looking for in an employee and they start out with human character traits (responsible, honest, commitment) they want in a human being. They don't start with math skills," Lowell superintendent Bert Bleke said.

After nearly 2 1/2 hours, approximately 160 community members identified responsibility, respect, integrity, compassion and honesty as five character traits for district children and adults to follow in their daily lives.

First United Methodist Church of Lowell pastor Gordon Barry identified R-I-C-H-R as an acronym derived from the five traits.

"I believe churches, businesses and government working together promoting, reinforcing and teaching these values enrich the community," Barry said. "It does take a village to raise kids. It requires being consistent throughout the community and not just in one area."

The process began with 25 tables (made up of 5-8

people at each table) listing redeeming values and/or traits they would like to see in an individual.

Then each person had to put a check by the seven character traits they valued most.

Following this, the groups were asked to write on a large sheet of white paper the traits that had three or more checks by them. They ranked them according to the number of checks received. Each table then hung its page of values on the middle school cafeteria walls.

After everybody had a chance to review the values other tables came up with, each table was given an opportunity to add values or character traits from other lists to their own.

Next, each table was asked to identify the top four character traits from their list, record them on a large white sheet of paper and tape them on the wall.

The last step had each person take a strip of seven dots and apply them next to the seven traits they valued most. They could only vote for a character trait once.

The final tally read like this: Responsibility 124; Respect 119; Integrity 110; Compassion 84; Honesty 76; Self-Discipline 34; Caring 34; and Commitment 29.

Because there was a clear break between honest and self-discipline, the top five were selected.

"I think 4-5 is the limit and still have it mean something," Bleke said. "I believe values exist in all communities. This is a process by which they can be identified."

The Lowell superintendent explained that professionals can determine the knowledge and skills a student should have when they leave school. "However, the community should identify what a kid's character should

Commission gives endorsement on adult-oriented business proposed zoning ordinance

Gaining the city council's acceptance on any proposed adult-oriented business zoning amendments is at least a couple of months away.

What is clear, however, within those proposed amendments will be a restriction on the business location.

It will recommend that adult-oriented businesses be allowed on two parcels of property at the city's west end - the Lowell Motor Inn lot and the lot just east of it.

Councilman Don Green, who is chairing an ad hoc committee to review the impact and how to effectively regulate adult-oriented businesses, said such establishments cannot be completely zoned out of a city.

"However, a city doesn't have to provide a lot that is vacant or that has a building on it," Green said.

Lowell Planning Commission chairman Mike Blough raised a concern that the lots, where the businesses would be allowed, are located near the west entrance into the city.

"The committee looked sideways at it too," Green said. Other than banning them completely, which the city

cannot do, the proposed zoning regulation would require a minimum of 500 feet from a residential or public facility (residences, schools and churches).

"If the minimum required feet limit was lowered, there would be the possibility of many more of these sites in town."

Briggs celebrate golden wedding anniversary

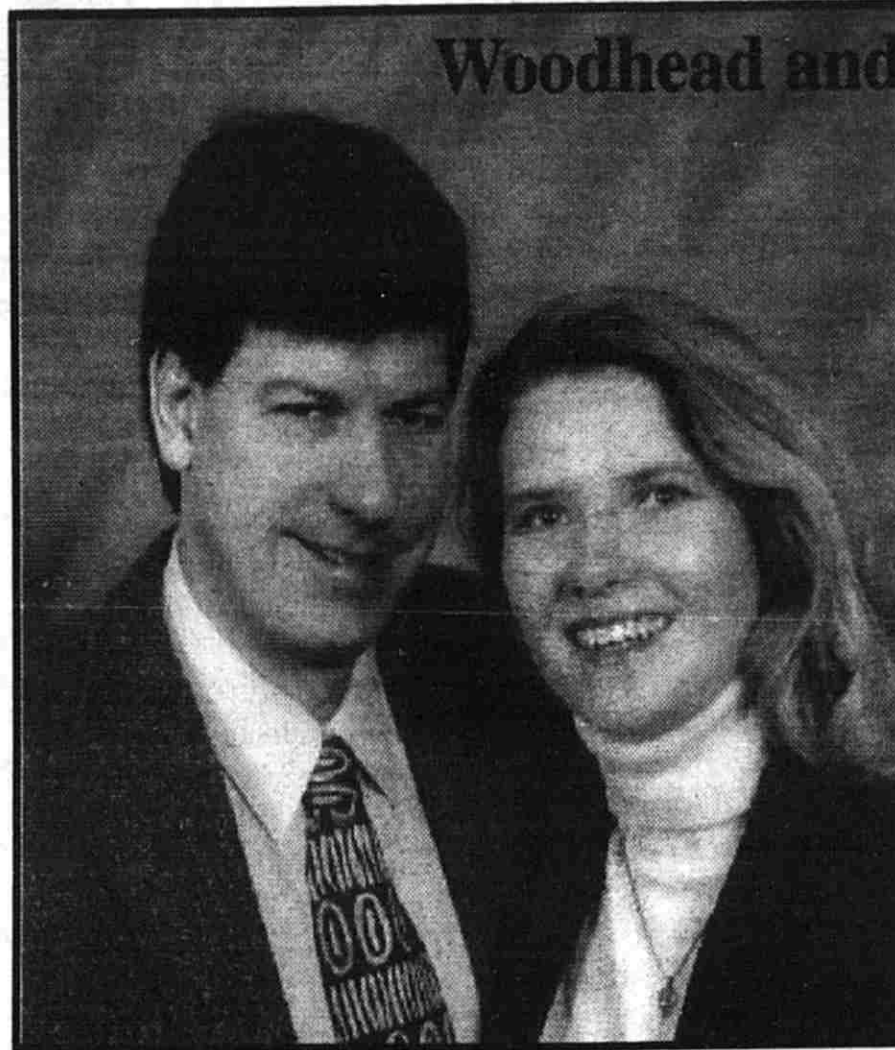
